**NOTICE OF A PROPOSED
REAL PROPERTY TAX INCREASE**

The Mayor and Council of the Town of Riverdale Park proposes to increase real property taxes.

1. For the tax year beginning July 1, 2018, the estimated real property assessable base will increase by 7.370%, from \$620,170,753 to \$665,879,748.
2. If the Town of Riverdale Park maintains the current tax rate of .6540 per \$100 of assessment, real property tax revenues will increase by 7.370% resulting in \$298,936.82 of new real property tax revenues.
3. In order to fully offset the effect of increasing assessments, the real property tax rate should be reduced to \$0.6091, the constant yield tax rate.
4. The Town is considering not reducing its real property tax rate enough to fully offset increasing assessments. The Town proposes to adopt a real property tax rate of \$.6540 per \$100 of assessment. This tax rate is 7.371% higher than the constant yield tax rate and will generate \$298,936.82 in additional property tax revenues.

A public hearing on the proposed real property tax rate increase will be held at 7:30 p.m. on Monday, May 7, 2018 at Riverdale Park Town Hall (5008 Queensbury Road).

significant interior and exterior renovation projects to enhance operations and promote economic activity in the Town of Riverdale Park; providing for the waiver of certain Town building permit and business license fees in connection with the program; and generally related to a program to incentivize renovations to business properties in the Town of Riverdale Park.

Charter Amendment Resolution
2018-CR-01**

This is to give notice the Riverdale Park Town Council has introduced and intends to take action on Charter Amendment Resolution No. 2018-CR-01.

Charter Amendment Resolution No. 2018-CR-01 would amend Sections 501(a), 503 and 511 of the Charter of the Town of Riverdale Park (January 2008 Revision), to alter certain eligibility qualifications for an individual to vote in Town elections; allow non-citizens of the United States and individuals who are least 16 years of age to register and vote in Town elections; provide for a supplemental voter registry for Town elections; provide for same day voter registration for Town elections; alter the time for determining and presenting the results of Town elections; and generally relate to voter registration and election protocols for Town of Riverdale Park elections.

Mayor's Report

Mayor Alan K. Thompson

May is the month of spring and, usually, budget hearings. Oh, and mosquitos.

Purple Line Construction

I don't have any updates on the Purple Line from last month. The main impacts this month (and in the next several months) will be continued tree/brush removal along River Road and utility relocation all along the pathway, with occasional lane closings. Utility relocations are for everything – electric, water, gas, telephone... CSX Bridge Construction

Based on recent reports, I am *cautiously* optimistic that the CSX Bridge will be open by the end of May. I have heard that CSX has agreed to a price for the transfer of the "air easement" above the bridge, and the legal documents are being drawn up as I write this report. I have also heard that the transfer process (inspections, documentation, etc.) is coming to a close. If nothing comes up in either the air easement transfer or the roadway/bridge acceptance, we could be driving from the northern end of Lafayette to River Road and to Riverdale Park Station very soon. Town Charter Amendment

The Town Council has heard comments from residents on the proposal to amend the Town Charter to alter the requirements for registering to vote in Town elections at both the work session on March 16 and the legislative meeting on April 2. While there is strong emotion on both sides of this issue, those commenting at both meetings were respectful and polite, and limited their comments to the content of the proposed amendments. I want to sincerely thank all those who came to the meetings for being respectful and polite, and I am hopeful that this will continue through the rest of the amendment process. We have another work session on April 30th and the council will almost certainly vote on the legislation at the legislative session on May 7th. We welcome public comments at both these meetings. If you cannot attend either meeting, and have an opinion, please don't hesitate to contact your Town Councilperson.

Mosquitos

You thought you were going to escape it, but I have to talk about this every year!

It used to be that mosquitos were just annoying (extremely annoying, but just annoying). It's much more serious now, with mosquito-borne diseases like West Nile virus, Dengue fever, and Zika virus having been seen in the United States (and, in the case of West Nile, in our area). The Town works with the Maryland Department of Agriculture to spray the town to limit the mosquito population. I don't like that we have to do this myself, but the public health issues associated with too many mosquitos

are more important to me than the spraying.

With this as the background, it is possible to significantly limit the number of sprayings needed if we can control mosquitos ourselves (many of the sprayings are triggered by the population of mosquitos getting too high). What I've said in years past is still true – eliminate standing water (buckets, trays, tires, gutters on the edge of your roof, ponds without fish), and use mosquito control “dunks” in standing water that you cannot eliminate (these pucks contain naturally-occurring bacteria that attack the mosquitos – I kind of like the idea of spreading disease through their population the same way they do among ours). Please do this yourself, and encourage your neighbors to do the same. Mosquito season is just starting, let's keep the population down all summer.

The Maryland Department of Agriculture's Mosquito Control Program pretreatment has begun. Spraying will begin on approximately June 4th and take place on Tuesday evenings (weather permitting). Residents are reminded to keep their property free of mosquito breeding containers such as stagnant water in bird baths, wading pools, pet watering dishes, tin cans, clogged gutters or flower pots. Other water holding containers should be stored upside down.
