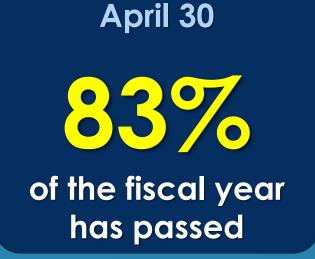

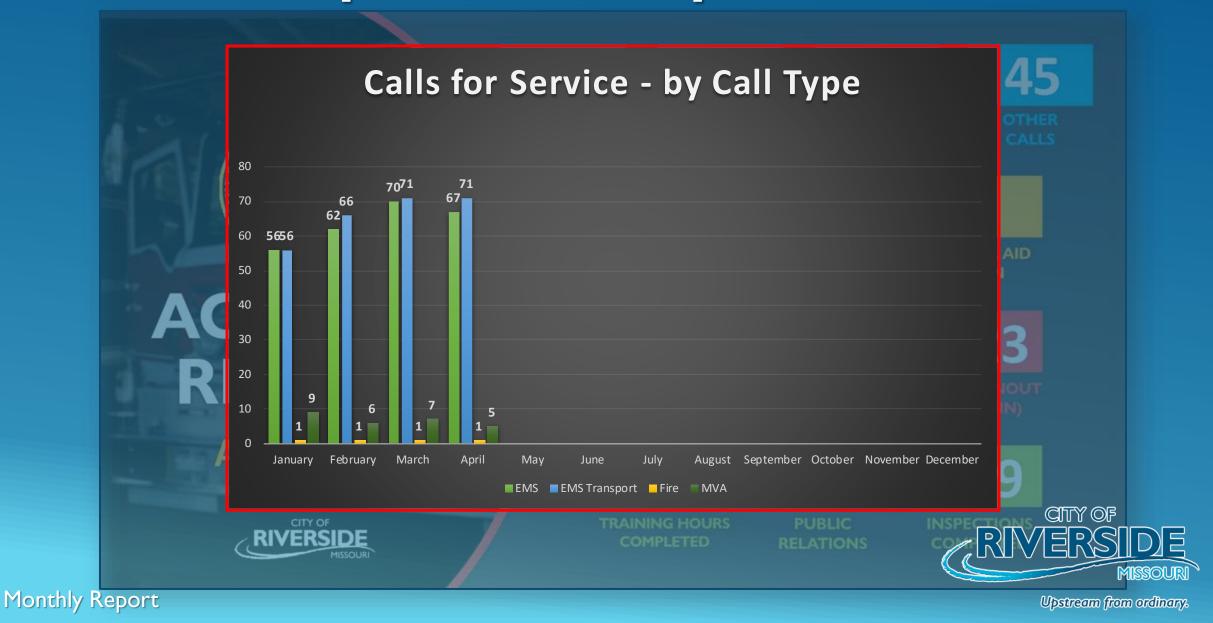

Response Time Data





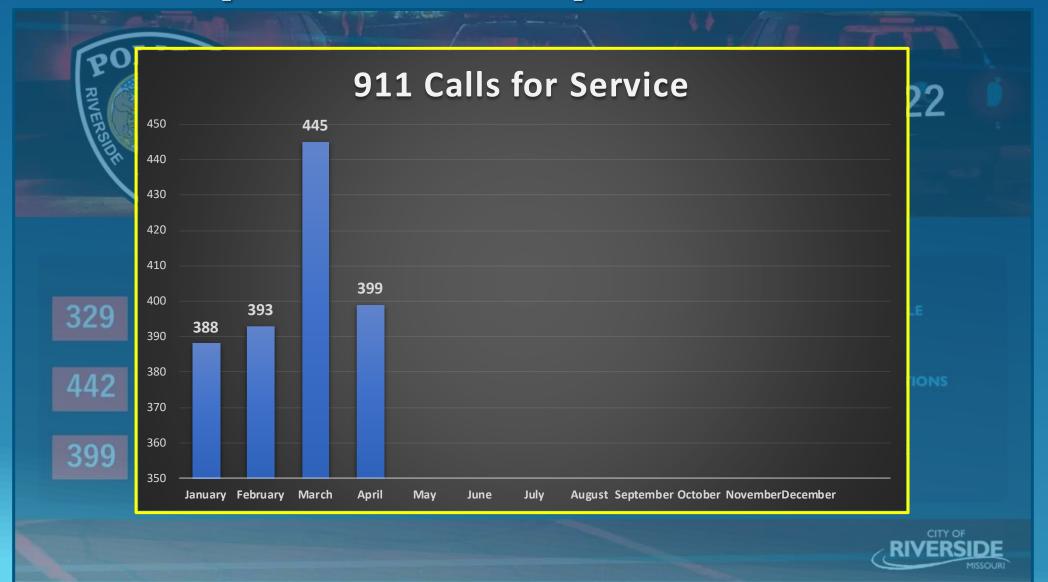
