AVID Strategies and Goal Reflection: Provide a model of success for students through daily planners, weekly goal reflection, and engaging in higher-level thinking

Academic Focus: Incorporate specific math academic focus and practice for students to support classroom instruction, reteaching missing concepts, and math enrichment

Social Emotional Focus: Use peer groups to provide opportunities for social skill practice and teaching. Use Steve, our therapy dog, to assist with teaching empathy and kindness to others

Parent & Community Involvement: Utilize the community's resources to teach students real life skills. Continue to invite families to participate in scheduled events.


AVID STRATEGIES AND GOAL REFLECTION

AVID (Advancement via Individual Determination) planners and individual goals for the week are reviewed each session. Students reflect on their individualized goals and discuss ways to meet those goals with

teacher leaders.



ACADEMIC FOCUS: MATH



District NWEA Data was used to evaluate student growth.

47 Beyond the Bell students took NWEA in the Fall and

Spring. 51% of students showed high growth from the

Fall assessment to Spring. 17% of students showed

average growth and 32% of students showed low growth.

Social Emotional Focus:

Beyond the Bell also incorporated peers working together in group STEM activities and games throughout the year to practice social skills and understand the perspective of others. Our therapy dog, Steve, attended Beyond the Bell, too! Students learned about Steve and interacted with him throughout the year.






