ORDINANCE NUMBER 2703-23

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 523 OF THE BOROUGH CODE TO DESIGNATE A HANDICAP PARKING SPACE RESERVED FOR A SPECIFIC PERSON IN FRONT OF A CERTAIN RESIDENCE (327 DIETZ STREET)

WHEREAS, the Police Department has received an application for a personalized handicap parking space pursuant to N.J.S.A. 39:4-197.7 along with the requisite \$25.00 fee; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have approved said application and the Borough Clerk has collected the additional fee of \$150.00 for same prior to adoption of the ordinance.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Roselle as follows:

1. Article III of Chapter 523 of the "Code of the Borough of Roselle" is amended by adding the following to § 523-38 – Restricted Handicap Parking Spaces

Section 523-138, Schedule XXIX – Restricted handicap parking spaces reserved for a specific person in front of a certain residence:

- (1) If any person for whom a parking space has been designated pursuant to this section ceases to reside at the specified resident address, he or she (or other person authorized to act on their behalf) shall promptly notify the Borough Clerk in writing that the designated parking space is no longer required.
- (2) In the event that the person holding the designated handicapped parking permit no longer resides at the specified residence address, the designation may be terminated by resolution.

If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to this section, paragraph,

subdivision, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the Ordinance shall remain valid and effective.

This ordinance shall take effect after public hearing and final adoption and publication according to law.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 2704-23

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 511 "PARKING, RESIDENTIAL OVERNIGHT" TO REVISE ALISON ROAD AREA RESTRICTED HOURS

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Roselle previously adopted Ordinances 2454-13, 2621-20, and 2637-20 which created and modified residential overnight parking restrictions in the Alison Road area of the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Roselle has recognized the need to further limit parking and to establish new regulations and control parking in the Alison Road area between the hours of 3:00 pm and 6:00 am; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council finds and determines that for the good and welfare of its citizens, it is necessary and advisable to establish regulations and provide for the enforcement of parking regulations within the Borough that improve the quality of life for residents.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Roselle as follows:

SECTION I. The Code of the Borough of Roselle, Chapter 511 Parking, Residential Overnight, Article I Alison Road Area, Section 3 Parking restriction is hereby amended and supplemented by adding or deleting the following (additions in **bold**, deletions struck through):

Parking in the Alison Road Area, in nonmetered spaces, shall be restricted to those licensed, registered and insured vehicles displaying a valid parking permit between the hours of 8:003:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m., except for Grant Avenue which will be between the hours of 3:00 p.m. and 10:00 a.m.

SECTION II. The Code of the Borough of Roselle, Chapter 523 Vehicles and Traffic, Article III Parking, Standing and Stopping, Section 39 Alison Road Area resident parking permit is hereby deleted in its entirety as it is duplicative, redundant, and in conflict with similar provisions in Chapter 511.

SECTION III. If any section, subsection, provision, clause, or portion of this ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such adjudication shall not affect the remaining sections, subsections, provisions, clauses, or portions, which shall be deemed severable therefore.

SECTION IV. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby replaced and/or repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 2705-23

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS BUILDING IMPROVEMENTS AND APPROPRIATING \$278,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$264,100 BONDS OR NOTES TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF, AUTHORIZED IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF ROSELLE, IN THE COUNTY OF UNION, NEW JERSEY

BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF ROSELLE, IN THE COUNTY OF UNION, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1.

The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance (the "Improvements") are hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Borough of Roselle, New Jersey (the "Borough") as general improvements. For the said Improvements there is hereby appropriated the amount of \$278,000, such sum includes the sum of \$13,900 as the down payment (the "Down Payment") required by the Local Bond Law of the State of New Jersey, constituting Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes, as amended and supplemented (the "Local Bond Law"). The Down Payment is now available by virtue of provision in one or more previously adopted budgets for down payments or capital improvement purposes.

SECTION 2.

In order to finance the cost of the Improvements and grant not covered by application of the Down Payment, negotiable bonds of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$264,100 pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law (the "Bonds"). In anticipation of the issuance of the Bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable bond anticipation notes of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not exceeding \$264,100 pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law (the "Bond Anticipation Notes" or "Notes").

SECTION 3.

(a) The Improvements authorized and the purposes for which obligations are to be issued, the estimated cost of each Improvement and the appropriation therefor, the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for each Improvement and the period of usefulness of each Improvement are as follows:

Improvements to Building located at 220 Chestnut Street, including all structures and appurtenances, work or materials necessary therefor or incidental thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with the plans and specifications thereof on file in the office of the Clerk.	\$168,000	159,600	15 Years

Technology upgrades for various buildings throughout the Borough, including all structures and appurtenances, work or materials necessary therefor or incidental thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with the plans and specifications thereof on file in the office of the Clerk.	110,000	104,500	5 Years

- (b) The estimated maximum amount of Bonds or Notes to be issued for the purpose of financing a portion of the cost of the Improvements is \$264,100.
- (c) The estimated cost of the Improvement is \$278,000 which amount represents the initial appropriation made by the Borough.

SECTION 4.

All Bond Anticipation Notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer of the Borough (the "Chief Financial Officer"); provided that no Note shall mature later than one year from its date. The Notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such from as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with Notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the signature of the Chief Financial Officer upon the Notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All Notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of Section 8(a) of the Local Bond Law. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the Notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the Borough Council of the Borough at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the Notes pursuant to this ordinance is made. Such report

must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the Notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 5.

The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the from promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, Department of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey is on file with the Clerk and is available for public inspection.

SECTION 6.

The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The Improvement described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses, and are capital improvements or properties that the Borough may lawfully make or acquire as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The period of usefulness of the Improvement, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, and according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the Bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 11.04 years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director, Division of Local Government Services, Department of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough, as defined in the Local Bond Law, is increased by the authorization of the Bonds and Notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$264,100 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$30,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 20 of the Local Bond Law is included in the estimated cost of the Improvements, as indicated herein.

SECTION 7.

Any funds received from time to time by the Borough as contributions in aid of financing the purposes described in Section 3 of this Ordinance shall be used for financing said Improvements by application thereof either to direct payment of the cost of said Improvements or to the payment or reduction of the authorization of the obligations of the Borough authorized therefor by this Bond Ordinance. Any such funds received may, and all such funds so received which are not required for direct payment of the cost of said Improvements shall, be held and applied by the Borough as funds applicable only to the payment of obligations of the Borough authorized by this Bond Ordinance.

SECTION 8.

The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

SECTION 9:

The Chief Financial Officer of the Borough is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the Borough and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the Borough. The Chief Financial Officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Borough pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the Borough and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Borough fails to comply with its undertaking, the Borough shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking

SECTION 10.

This Section 10 constitutes a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2. The Borough reasonably expects to pay expenditures with respect to the Improvements prior to the date that the Borough incurs debt obligations under this Bond Ordinance. The Borough reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the Borough under this Bond Ordinance. The maximum principal amount of debt expected to be issued for payment of the costs of the Improvements is \$264,100.

SECTION 11.

This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 2706-23

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT THE LAND USE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ROSELLE, CHAPTER 650, ARTICLE XII, ZONING, SECTION 650-95, BUSINESS/COMMERICIAL ZONE AND SECTION 650-99, COMMERCIAL-INDUSTRIAL ZONE; TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT THE FIRST AVENUE REDEVELOPMENT PLAN; AND TO AMEND THE REDEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR BLOCK 3801 TO CLARIFY THE PERMITTED AND CONDITIONAL USES

WHEREAS, the Borough has received inquiries regarding the operation of two cannabis uses within the same building and/or on the same property;

WHEREAS, the Business/Commercial Zone and Commercial-Industrial Zone only allow certain permitted uses to be within the same building and/or property, which does not include cannabis-related uses; and

WHEREAS, the First Avenue Redevelopment Plan and Redevelopment Plan for Block 3801 do not reflect the latest conditions for cannabis retailers and/or allow cannabis retailers as of right, when they were envisioned to be conditionally permitted uses; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Borough Council have reviewed the Ordinance and wishes to amend the Business/Commercial Zone and Commercial-Industrial Zone to allow more than one permitted cannabis-related use to operate within the same building and/or on the same property; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Borough Council have reviewed the redevelopment plans and wish to clarify that cannabis retailers are permitted uses where allowed and properly refer to the correct conditions.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Roselle that the Code of the Borough of Roselle, Chapter 650 Zoning and the First Avenue Redevelopment Plan are hereby amended as follows (additions in <u>underline</u>; deletions in <u>strikeout</u>):

SECTION I. The Code of Borough of Roselle, Part VIII, Chapter 650 Zoning, Section 650-95 Business/Commercial Zone, is hereby amended and supplemented as follows:

- B. Use regulations. A building or premises shall be used only for the following purposes:
 - (1) Permitted principal uses.

- (i) Mixed use structures with a combination of two or more of the aforementioned permitted principal uses.
- (i) Cannabis delivery service.

SECTION II. The Code of Borough of Roselle, Part VIII, Chapter 650 Zoning, Section 650-99 Commercial-Industrial Zone, is hereby amended and supplemented as follows:

- C. Use regulation. A building or premises shall be used only for the following purposes:
 - (2) Permitted uses.
 - (k) Mixed-use structures with a combination of two or more of the aforementioned permitted principal uses.
 - (k) (1) Cannabis delivery service.
 - (1) (m) Cannabis manufacturer.
 - (m)(n) Cannabis wholesaler.
 - (n) (o) Cannabis distributer.

SECTION III. The First Avenue Redevelopment Plan, Amendment #3, is hereby amended to be Amendment #4 and Chapter VIII shall be amended and supplemented as follows:

- A. Commercial Redevelopment Zone. The purpose of this district is to establish a zone which will permit the construction of commercial uses, compatible with the trend in the surrounding area; and the conversion of formerly industrial lands to commercial uses in an orderly manner.
 - 3. Conditional Uses:
 - a. Cannabis retailer, which shall meet the following conditions: in Section 650-102B.(8).
 - i. Said establishment shall be licensed and shall be located more than 1,000 feet from the property lien of any elementary or secondary school property.
 - ii. No outdoor consumption areas are permitted.
- B. Commercial Residential Transition Zone: The purpose of this district is to establish a zone which will permit the orderly phased conversion of residential land uses to commercial land uses compatible with the development trend in the surrounding area of

First Avenue. It is anticipated that eertain of the existing residential structures may continue to be used for residential purposes while new commercial land uses are introduced into the Area. Therefore, this plan will provide the flexibility to allow the existing residential properties to continue or to be assembled for redevelopment for commercial purposes.

- 1. Permitted Principal Uses and Structures:
 - (g) Mixed-use structures with a combination of two or more of the uses in b. through f. above.
 - (h) Cannabis retailer.
 - g. (i) Cannabis delivery service.
- 3. Conditional Uses:
 - a. Cannabis retailer, which shall meet the conditions in Section 650-102B.(8).
- 4. 3. Bulk Standards:
- 5. 4. Buffers: Non-residential uses shall provide a buffer along any property line shared with a property containing a single- or two-family home. Said buffer shall be at least 6 feet wide; with a 6 foot high board on board fence, or approved equivalent fence, constructed along the property line. The buffer strip shall be planted with dense evergreen trees not less than 6 feet tall at the time of planting and spaced not more than 10 feet on center; along with flowering deciduous and board-leaf evergreen plant material in order to create a visual barrier and aesthetically appealing appearance.

SECTION IV. The Redevelopment Plan for Block 3801, Amendment #1, is hereby amended to be Amendment #2 and Section 6.2 shall be amended and supplemented as follows:

- A. Principal Permitted Uses
 - 1. The following uses are permitted on the ground or first floor:
 - (e) Cannabis retailer. However, no outdoor consumption areas are permitted.
- B. Permitted Accessory Uses
- C. Conditional Uses
 - 1. Cannabis retailer, which shall meet the conditions in Section 650-102B.(8).

- D. C. Prohibited Uses
- E. D. Area and Bulk Regulations
- F. E. Off-Street Parking
- G. F. Loading
- H. G. Pedestrian Accessibility
- I. H. Landscaping
- J. I. Trash
- K. J. Stormwater. All applications for development shall conform to the stormwater regulations contained in the Borough of Roselle's code.
- L. K. Signage. The following standards shall apply to all signs in the Redevelopment Area. Refer to Chapter 620 "Signs" Section 1 "Definitions" within the Borough Code for a description of the terms below. No sign type other than those identified below shall be permitted.
- M. L. Workforce Housing

SECTION V. If any section, subsection, provision, clause, or portion of this ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such adjudication shall not affect the remaining sections, subsections, provisions, clauses, or portions, which shall be deemed severable therefore.

SECTION VI. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby replaced and/or repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION VII. This Ordinance shall take effect at the time and in the manner provided by law.

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1, et seq. (the "Redevelopment Law"), provides a process for municipalities to participate in the redevelopment and improvement of areas designated as in need of redevelopment; and

The Revitalization Plan Area begins at the corner of Chestnut Street and St. Georges Avenue, north on Chestnut Street to Eighth Avenue, east on Eighth Avenue to Spruce Street, north on Spruce Street to Seventh Avenue, East on Seventh Avenue to Chandler Avenue, south on Chandler Avenue to Morris Place, east on Morris Place to Harrison Avenue, south on Harrison Avenue to Georges Place, east on Georges Place to the western border of Warinanco Park, south along the eastern border of Blocks 1402 and 1404 to St. Georges Avenue, and St. Georges Avenue west to Chestnut Street (the "Central Roselle Revitalization Area"); and
