### ORDINANCE ON SECOND READING/PUBLIC HEARING

### **ORDINANCE NUMBER 2699-22**

ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF ROSELLE, COUNTY OF UNION, NEW JERSEY APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF A SECOND AMENDMENT TO FINANCIAL AGREEMENT FOR PROPERTY COMMONLY KNOWN AS 643-645 EAST 1<sup>ST</sup> AVENUE AND IDENTIFIED AS BLOCK 201, LOTS 1 & 2 ON THE BOROUGH'S TAX MAP

**WHEREAS**, the Borough Council ("**Borough Council**") of the Borough of Roselle (the "**Borough**"), pursuant to the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-1, *et seq.*, designated the properties commonly known as 643-645 E. 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue and identified as Block 201, Lots 1 and 2 on the tax maps of the Borough (the "**Project Premises**") as an "area in need of redevelopment"; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council adopted an ordinance approving and adopting a redevelopment plan for the Project Premises; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Long Term Tax Exemption Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:20-1, et seq. (the "LTTE Law"), in March 2005, the Borough and ICCL Urban Renewal, LLC ("ICCL") entered into that Financial Agreement, as amended by the Amendment to Financial Agreement, dated December 12, 2006 (as amended, the "Financial Agreement"), in connection with the redevelopment, on the Project Premises, of approximately 51,610 square feet of retail/commercial space (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Financial Agreement required ICCL to make payment to the Borough of an Annual Service Charge (the "Annual Service Charge") in an amount equal to two percent (2%) of the Total Project Cost paid by ICCL for the construction of the Project; and

WHEREAS, in Ordinance 2216-04, adopted by the Borough Council on October 20, 2004, authorizing the long-term tax exemption, the Borough found and concluded that the benefits derived from providing for redevelopment of the Project per the Financial Agreement outweighed the costs associated with the granting of a tax exemption and that granting the tax exemption and

the payment of the annual service charge in lieu of taxes was necessary and appropriate for development of the Project, including that "[t]he relative stability and predictability of the Annual Service Charge will allow the Entity to stabilize its operating budget, allowing for a high level of maintenance to the land and the improvements over the life of the Project, which will attract Tenants to the Project and as will such insure the likelihood of the success of the Project", and

WHEREAS, as set forth in Ordinance 2147-01, adopted by the Borough Council on December 19, 2001, initially approving the tax exemption for the Project, the tax exemption was to be for a term of fifteen (15) years, although it also provided that ICCL could request an extension for an additional fifteen (15) year term; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council adopted Ordinance 2264-06 on December 13, 2006, which amended Ordinances 2147-01 and 2216-04 to (i) correctly identify the property subject to the tax exemption, (ii) more accurately identify the anticipated amount of the Annual Service Charge from the Project, (iii) provide that the tax exemption term would commence in 2007 and (iv) authorize the execution of an amendment to memorialize such terms; and

WHEREAS, ICCL has represented to the Borough that it intends to make upgrades to improve the Project's appearance and safety, including, enhanced exterior lighting, additional security cameras accessible by the local police department, security on-site to monitor cameras during business hours, a new fence in the rear of the Project Premises, repaved and restriped parking lot, new digital signage to assist visibility for the Project's tenants, and updated landscaping to include new shrubbery and annual flower plantings (collectively, the "Rehabilitation Project"); and

WHEREAS, ICCL represented to the Borough that the Financial Agreement and the resulting tax exemption for the Project has created a stable and predictable Annual Service Charge, which has enabled the necessary investment to be made to construct the Project and maintain same in a particularly challenging retail/commercial market; and

WHEREAS, ICCL further represented to the Borough that commencement of *ad valorem* taxation on the Project would lead to an increase in rents to the tenants that would not be sustainable, which would jeopardize the existing tenant base, as well as ICCL's plan to attract new tenants to the Project, including a cannabis-related tenant which, in turn, is expected to generate substantial revenues for the Borough; and

WHEREAS, ICCL has requested that the Borough extend the tax exemption term and proposes to pay an Annual Service Charge, for such extended term, in accordance with the terms set forth in a proposed second amendment to the Financial Agreement in substantially the same form as that attached hereto as Exhibit A (the "Second Amendment to Financial Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council now desires to approve the extension of the tax exemption term and authorize the execution of the Second Amendment to Financial Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF ROSELLE, COUNTY OF UNION, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. The aforementioned recitals are incorporated herein as though fully set forth at length.

<u>Section 2</u>. The tax exemption term is hereby extended for an additional term of ten (10) years, effective as of January 1, 2022.

<u>Section 3</u>. Second Amendment to Financial Agreement is hereby approved and the Mayor and Borough Clerk are hereby authorized to execute same in substantially the same form as that attached as <u>Exhibit A</u> hereto, subject to minor modification or revision, as deemed necessary and appropriate after consultation with counsel.

<u>Section 4</u>. The Borough Clerk is hereby authorized and directed, upon execution of the Second Amendment to Financial Agreement by the Mayor, to attest to the signature of the Mayor and to affix the corporate seal of the Borough upon such document.

<u>Section 5.</u> All ordinances and resolutions or parts thereof inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby rescinded.

#### RESOLUTION CANCELLING TAXES FOR EXEMPT PROPERTY

**WHEREAS**, the Borough Council ("Borough Council") of the Borough of Roselle (the "Borough"), pursuant to the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-1, *et seq.*, designated the properties commonly known as 643-645 E. 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue and identified as Block 201, Lots 1 and 2 on the tax maps of the Borough (the "Project Premises") as an "area in need of redevelopment"; and

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WHEREAS, the Borough Council adopted an ordinance approving and adopting a redevelopment plan for the Project Premises; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Long Term Tax Exemption Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:20-1, et seq. (the "LTTE Law"), in March 2005, the Borough and ICCL Urban Renewal, LLC ("ICCL") entered into that Financial Agreement, as amended by the Amendment to Financial Agreement, dated December 12, 2006 (as amended, the "Financial Agreement"), in connection with the redevelopment, on the Project Premises, of approximately 51,610 square feet of retail/commercial space (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Financial Agreement required ICCL to make payment to the Borough of an Annual Service Charge (the "Annual Service Charge") in an amount equal to two percent (2%) of the Total Project Cost paid by ICCL for the construction of the Project; and

WHEREAS, in Ordinance 2216-04, adopted by the Borough Council on October 20, 2004, authorizing the long-term tax exemption, the Borough found and concluded that the benefits derived from providing for redevelopment of the Project per the Financial Agreement outweighed the costs associated with the granting of a tax exemption and that granting the tax exemption and the payment of the annual service charge in lieu of taxes was necessary and appropriate for development of the Project, including that "[t]he relative stability and predictability of the Annual Service Charge will allow the Entity to stabilize its operating budget, allowing for a high level of maintenance to the land and the improvements over the life of the Project, which will attract Tenants to the Project and as such will insure the likelihood of the success of the Project", and

WHEREAS, as set forth in Ordinance 2147-01, adopted by the Borough Council on December 19, 2001, initially approving the tax exemption for the Project, the tax exemption was to be for a term of fifteen (15) years, although it also provided that ICCL could request an extension for an additional fifteen (15) year term; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council adopted Ordinance 2264-06 on December 13, 2006, which amended Ordinances 2147-01 and 2216-04 to (i) correctly identify the property subject to the tax exemption, (ii) more accurately identify the anticipated amount of the Annual Service Charge from the Project, (iii) provide that the tax exemption term would commence in 2007 and (iv) authorize the execution of an amendment to memorialize such terms; and

WHEREAS, ICCL has represented to the Borough that it intends to make upgrades to improve the Project's appearance and safety, including, enhanced exterior lighting, additional security cameras accessible by the local police department, security on-site to monitor cameras during business hours, a new fence in the rear of the Project Premises, repaved and restriped parking lot, new digital signage to assist visibility for the Project's tenants, and updated landscaping to include new shrubbery and annual flower plantings (collectively, the "Rehabilitation Project"); and

WHEREAS, ICCL represented to the Borough that the initial 15-year term of the Financial Agreement and the resulting tax exemption for the Project created a stable and predictable Annual Service Charge, which has enabled the necessary investment to be made to construct the Project and maintain same in a particularly challenging retail/commercial market; and

WHEREAS, ICCL further represented to the Borough that commencement of ad valorem taxation on the Project at this time would lead to an increase in rents to the tenants that would not be sustainable, which would jeopardize the existing tenant base, as well as ICCL's plan to attract new tenants to the Project, including a cannabis-related tenant which, in turn, is expected to generate substantial revenues for the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the exemption term under the Financial Agreement expired as of December 31, 2021; and

WHEREAS, ICCL has requested that the Borough extend the tax exemption term for an additional ten (10) years beyond December 31, 2021, and proposes to pay an Annual Service Charge, for such extended term, in accordance with the terms set forth in a proposed second amendment to the Financial Agreement (the "Second Amendment to Financial Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, by ordinance the Borough Council approved the extension of the tax exemption as of January 1, 2022, and authorized the execution of the Second Amendment to Financial Agreement, which requires ICCL to pay an Annual Service Charge, in lieu of taxes, for the year 2022 and beyond; and

**WHEREAS**, accordingly, the Borough desires to cancel property taxes due on the Project Premises for the year 2022.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED** by the Mayor and Council of Borough of Roselle, in the County of Union and the State of New Jersey, as follows:

- Section 1. The recitals hereof are incorporated herein as though set forth more fully herein.
- Section 2. Property taxes due, including interest thereon, in connection with the Project Premises for the year 2022 are hereby canceled.
- Section 3. The Mayor, tax assessor, tax collector, chief financial officer and all other Borough personnel are hereby authorized and directed to take any and all actions necessary to effectuate the purposes of this resolution.
- Section 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
