Free Tutoring from Seton Hall University Students

For the rest of the month, Mondays kick off with a virtual Knitting/Crocheting at 5 p.m. and then an ESL program at 7 p.m. Tuesdays feature outdoor S.T.E.A.M activities at 3:30 p.m., while Wednesday, October 20 will feature virtual ESL programs at 7 p.m. and Wednesday, October 27 will be a special virtual Pajama Storytime at 7 p.m.

Thursdays will include two outdoor programs: Toddler Time at noon, and Art Journaling at 3:30 p.m. Fridays end the week with Lego play outdoors at 3:30 p.m.

"This month offers a great lineup of free programs and we encourage residents to participate and take advantage of these valuable resources," said Mayor Donald Shaw. "We especially welcome and encourage Roselle students to take advantage of this additional tutoring and support. To everyone: the library is for you.
