PROPOSITION INFORMATION




City of Shawnee residents will have an opportunity to vote on four Propositions at the Special Election to be held June 26. A summary of Propositions #1-3 appear below. Proposition #4 is discussed on the reverse side of this flyer.

Proposition #1: This proposition clarifies when City Commissioners and the Mayor take office and provides that they take office on the first Monday in the month following their election (regular or runoff).

Proposition #2: This proposition concerns the appointment of the Vice-Mayor, which is done on an annual basis by the City Commission. It clarifies the timing of the appointment when there is a general election, runoff election, or in years with no election.

Proposition #3: If approved, this proposition would change the method of ordering the holding of elections by allowing the City to pass a resolution in accordance with State law. City Charter currently requires passage of an ordinance.



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Information Regarding Proposition #4


If approved, Proposition #4 would temporarily increase City sales tax by one-half of one percent for a period of 10 years. In accordance with the adopted City Ordinance and the Ballot Question, the revenue would be specifically allocated as follows:

Public Safety: 0.125%

Streets & Roads: 0.125%

Parks and Public Facilities: 0.25%

Approximately \$30 million would be generated over the 10-year period. The Shawnee City Commission adopted a list of anticipated projects that can be funded with the new revenue. These include major improvements to City parks, the remodel of two fire stations, establishment of a new Police Department headquarters building, major street improvements, EXPO enhancements, additional sidewalks and trails and renovations to the Senior Center, Public Library, Community Center and Santa Fe Depot.
