It will be paid from fund balance appropriation. To my knowledge there has not been any additional complaints or interaction with Mr. Hodges since the court closing.
- C. On 1/7/2022 all pumps experienced a power failure at our Wastewater Influent Pump Station. OIC Drake Robart immediately responded after hours and worked through the night to establish a back up pumping alternative. This was the appropriate action necessary to prevent a sewer spill. Pumps have been repaired. The total cost for the bypass pumping was \$6,472.23.

Background:

Currently our Town elections are held on odd number years (ex. 2021, 2023). The option has presented itself to hold our elections in conjunction with the county and other elections. This is an opportunity for the Town to reduce the cost of an independent election while still allowing the same voter options. There will still be early voting, absentee voting, and election day voting. The only change would include: - current elected officials will not run until 2024; & the cost savings would be \$3,715.17. Attached in your packet is a document showing the cost and voter turn-out of previous elections. From a financial perspective, it would be recommended to lower the cost of elections by moving them to even years. From an elected official's perspective, each member would be encouraged to vote according to their opinion.

Background:

Attached in your packet is an information guide to an Extreme Vac Street Vacuum. After a year of disposing of our older street sweeper due to significant mechanical issues, it is time to revisit the continual need for a street vacuum. This unit is a pull behind unit that can be utilized for street curb/gutter and downtown sidewalks. This unit is powered by a small Kawasaki independent engine and dumb body which eliminates the larger potential for mechanical and mobility expense. This unit is located in Charlotte NC and sold by Carolina Industrial Equipment. The perks of the unit is its small and versatile, it has less moving parts to reduce the chance of high maintenance cost, and it fits our need. The company is based from Charlotte with numerous service technicians if the need for assistance arises in the future. The cost of the vacuum is \$45,845.00. If not purchased the delivery date for an ordered unit is 8-12 months.

The funding for this machine can be appropriated through our federal ARP funds. The best option for our town is to use this purchase as a revenue replacement item and it will be funded 100% through ARP funds. There are still numerous policies that will need to be in place prior to payment; however, after an onsite review and demonstration a purchase order number would be sufficient to hold the machine.





HI Toddy - I'm sorry for my delayed response. Have you decided to take the standard allowance and spend all your ARP funds as revenue replacement? If that is the case, then to spend the monies on a street sweeper/vacuum, you'll need to adopt/implement the following Uniform Guidance policies/procedures.

- 1. Written process for making project eligibility decisions (This will be easy for standard allowance. You'll just need to document that every expenditure falls under "general government services" - see this blog post for more info on this.)
- 2. Allowable costs policy (Sample here)
- 3. Records retention policy (all ARP-related documentation must be retained for at least 5 years after termination of grant period)
- 4. Financial management / internal controls policy that complies with federal Green Book
- 5. Conflicts of interest policy
- 6. Federal procurement policy
- 7. Property management policy

We are working on samples for all of these categories. It is likely we will have samples for 3., 4., 5., & 7. Within the next month. Procurement will take longer b/c of our staffing shortages here at the SOG.

Note that you may want to consider supplanting to reduce this UG burden. You could use all of your allocation for salaries/benefits, freeing up general fund/enterprise fund monies to be spent on the street sweeper. If you do that, then you yould not need the federal procurement or property management policies. You would only need to follow state law for procurement, not federal law. You would still need the other policies, but they are not as onerous as the procurement and property management ones.

PROJECT INFORMATION UPDATES

1. Greene County Parcel No. 0805535

Waiting on NCDOT to move forward with this project before any further action needed.

2. LED Sign:

The LED sign for beautification circle in front of Bojangles has arrived. One issue I am currently facing is the NCDOT right-of-way. According to NCDOT the right of way extends almost to the new Walgreens building. Our existing sign is technically in their right of way. Engineers are working with me to make this sight work since we already have an existing sign on this property. We are looking at 75' set back from the front and 50' from Third Street. The new changes would reflect the current sign out of the state right-of-way. Current time frame before approval is March 2022

3. Water / Sewer - Rate Study

I met with UNC School of Government on 20 August regarding the rate study information. They have all our required documentation and have completed the process. I will be reviewing the results at our retreat meeting 14 March.

4. SCADA System Replacement

The SCADA equipment has arrived. Gopher Utilities are working with Nfinity Link on some IP issues. Once complete the remaining infrastructure will be installed. Again, this expenditure may be American Rescue Plan funding eligible. There is no set completion date at this time.

5. American Rescue Plan Funding (COVID Money)

The final rule for the American Rescue Plan Funding has been released. I am tentatively working on a retreat agenda to be presented in our 14 March Meeting. This will provide us further guidance on what we need as a town, what we are eligible for and lastly what we deem as high priority. Deadlines for spending have not changed with this announcement. ARP funds are still not required to be obligated until Dec. 31, 2024, and spent by Dec. 31, 2026.

6. Parks and Recreation Trust Fund Grant

I have spoken with Brittany Shipp with PARTF with regards to potentially applying for grant funds. There will be some significant pre-application checks and balances that will need to be reviewed on behalf of her staff prior to submittal. I have also reached out to

Green Engineering. They are assisting with a competitive and successful grant application. Once complete we can entertain their suggestions for the application so we can build on the possibility of a splashpad, playground, and walking trail.

7. Copy Pro

I have met with Copy Pro, who provide our printer services at the Town Offices. After review we are spending nearly \$800 monthly for a printer in each office, public works, and Police Department. In addition, we are billed quarterly for any overages that have occurred. With that in mind, I have concluded to reduce individual printers with one main printer at Town Hall that everyone can print/scan/fax from. The police department will still retain a copy pro printer for confidentiality and the service that may be needed for the 24/7 coverage. Public Works will also have only 1 printer for their water and sewer needs since their offices are at another location. In total we are reducing from 9 printers to 3. I will approve a small outsourced inexpensive printer to expedite customer service for the offices needed.

As of 30 January I am waiting for a revised contract to move forward with the new plan.

8. SCIF - State Capital Infrastructure Fund

I have completed all necessary pre-grant applications to successfully receive \$300,000 grant. This grant will be 100% infrastructure grant money. There is no loan portion. I have spoken with Kay Radford regarding expenditure eligibility. If the board so chooses; a splash pad up to \$300,000 is fund eligible. Once we receive the funds in hand, we will decide on the appropriate action to spend the funds.

9. Precision Graphics (old Smart Play)

As of 8 February 2022, the closing has taken place for Precision Graphics. Precision Graphics has signed the pay incentive and we have a copy on file at Town Hall.
