South Winds Golf Course

Built in 1977, our Southgate golf course, known as South Winds, is often called the city's "Hidden Gem". It is located in the heart of the city of Southgate and is an 18-hole course featuring challenging par 3's, accented with well-groomed bunkers, three ponds and a meandering creek.

South Winds Golf Course offers adult leagues, a Junior Golf League, outings, restaurant/bar, pro shop and golf instruction.

Biggest draws

Our two biggest programs are the Junior Golf League and the Frostbit Open Golf Tournament. The Junior Golf League is for ages 8-16 and runs from the end of June through August. Our Frostbit Open Golf Tournament is held in early December, and this year will mark the outing's 41st anniversary. The event usually sells out several months in advance.

South Winds is also home to our foot golf course – "The Footie" – which features nine holes of foot golf for all ages. For those of you who are unfamiliar with foot golf, the sport is played with a soccer ball and kicked into a larger hole in the ground.

We also offer nine holes of disc golf throughout the season and host a disc golf outing once a year.

Hardcore Pawn

American Jewelry and Loan expands to Southgate

Les Gold isn't going to be defined by 15 minutes of fame. For one, his popular and groundbreaking television show, *Hardcore Pawn*, lasted nine seasons – a lot longer than 15 minutes. But even his celebrity status and famous family won't define what Les Gold is and has always been about.

"Dealing with the unexpected is one of the reasons I became a pawnbroker and learning to love the craziness is one of the reasons I'm damn good at it," said Gold, owner and founder of American Jewelry and Loan.

Success in the pawnbroker business requires an Excel file of characteristics and traits including high energy, passion, ingenuity, integrity. It's these traits, along with running a successful business for almost five decades, that define Les Gold and American Jewelry and Loan.

"I still love it," he said. "I enjoy getting up and going to work today as much as I did the day I started in this business."

That business has recently expanded to five stores, with two new locations Downriver, including the newest site at 14336 Eureka Road in Southgate.

that approximately 7.1 million households in the United States do not have a bank account or a relationship with a bank from which to borrow money. Seth Gold said he hopes American Jewelry and Loan can be a resource for those households.

"The process is pretty simple," Seth said. "Someone comes in with a piece of merchandise, we ask how much they need and we evaluate the item. Ultimately, we provide a short-term loan. It's a 90-day loan at 3 percent interest plus \$3 a month in storage."

Pawn shops are considered non-recourse lenders, which allows people to pawn items without hurting their credit scores.

As a third-generation pawnbroker, Les Gold is a self-proclaimed, street-level economist. His first experience as a salesman took place at his grandfather's pawnshop at the age of 7.

While Les honed his skills in negotiating, sales and customer service from his grandfather and growing up in the business on the streets of Detroit, Seth learned much of his business knowledge in Ann Arbor. A graduate of the University of Michigan, Seth also has designations in diamond grading and colored gemstones from the Gemological Institute of America.

"My dad is very street smart, and he has taught me everything I know about this business," Seth said. "I do have different ideas on things and he's usually open to them. The way we did business 20 years ago isn't how we do business today."

Les, who wrote a New York Times best-selling book, *For What It's Worth. Business Wisdom From a Pawnbroker*, said businesses always need to change and evolve.

"I'm very open to change," he says. "The world is always changing and we need to change with it. And Seth has come up with some great ideas that have made what we do better and more convenient for our customers."

"We have a lot of customers Downriver who travel to our stores in Oakland County and Detroit and we felt that it was more convenient for them if we came to them," Gold said. "We wanted to make their life a little easier."

Seth Gold, who helps run the business with his father, said finding the right location in Southgate was a challenge.

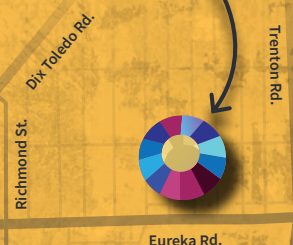

WORKING FOR YOU

City rolls out vaccine distribution, providing easy access to residents

Sometimes it takes a team effort to make a big project work efficiently and that's exactly what happened when the City of Southgate distributed COVID-19 vaccines provided by Wayne County.

One of the ways the city made it easier for seniors to get the shot was to provide a city SMART bus to pick-up and drop-off residents at Wayne County Community College, where the shots were administered by the National Guard March 11 and April 1.

Stepping up

Southgate resident Thurman Brewer, 82, said he appreciated the free service and from what he saw, everything at the distribution site ran smoothly, allowing him to be in and out in 30 minutes or so.

"There were people there to guide you on where to go and what to do," Brewer said.

He was among 46 seniors who were provided the shuttle service. More than 20 people volunteered to drive the buses, work at the distribution site and provide support wherever it was needed.

The city was given 1,500 Pfizer vaccines from Wayne County and the volunteers were a key component in making the distribution process run efficiently, explained Diane Grabowski, Southgate senior center director who organized the effort with Cassidy Tear, Southgate Downtown Development Authority

director. Their work was appreciated by "many Southgate residents" who called city hall to express their appreciation, Grabowski said.

Let us help

Fourteen people who were incapacitated and found it difficult to make it inside WCCC to get their shots received their vaccinations in their cars or in the parking lot. Wherever there was a hurdle, Grabowski and Tear found a way around it.

"We hope we can do it again," Tear said. "I don't know if Wayne County will be supplying it. We are waiting on word for that."

Southgate has about 6,000 residents who are 65 and older and about 12,000 who are 50 and older, according to registered voter lists.

Initially, the City sent out letters to all registered voters 65 and older to announce there

would be a March 11 vaccination distribution. Then it was opened to residents 60 and older, and finally it became available to people who were at least 50 (as of press time).

They were invited to return April 1 for their second shots. The City went a step further by pre-printing the recipients' medical questionnaire forms, which eliminated long waits, Grabowski said.

"People were so excited, and they sent the mayor emails," she

said. "The atmosphere at the community college was lovely. There was a huge amount of thank yous. People still call and say that was very nice."

Southgate Fire Chief Mark Hatfield and Firefighter Jeff Moore helped run the program from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. All the volunteers arrived at 7 a.m. and stayed until 3:30 p.m. City hall employees worked on the massive mailing effort, the recreation department printed the forms and the post office cooperated by making sure everything ran quickly to get the mailings out, Grabowski said.

Before the shots were available at Wayne County Community College, Grabowski helped seniors register for shots that were offered by Meijer.

"We've had many hundreds of seniors vaccinated through Meijer," she said, adding that she continues to help people get those appointments.

Long after the City's vaccination program was finished, Grabowski said, she encourages Southgate residents to call her office and she will help them get on a list to receive their vaccines. Many seniors, she said, aren't computer savvy and she's more than happy to help.

Coming together

Mayor Joseph G. Kuspa called the vaccination distribution a chance for the city to step up to the challenge and to "keep employees and residents safe."

He especially applauded Grabowski for working diligently to register residents for their vaccines.



"We wanted to make it effortless for them," he said. "It really made a difference to streamline the process."

Tear and Southgate Recreation Director Julie Goddard made sure the forms were filled out correctly and manned phones to help callers asking about the vaccination site, he added.

"It was a team effort to provide as many vaccinations as we could that day," Kuspa said. "We appreciate all the efforts, the seniors wanting to get the vaccination and the county being able to help us. This is county driven, and we were very pleased to coordinate this one. We would certainly be open to do it again."

Meanwhile, Brewer said he was happy the City provided the vaccines and even more pleased that he hasn't gotten COVID-19. The shots, he said, are "for prevention."

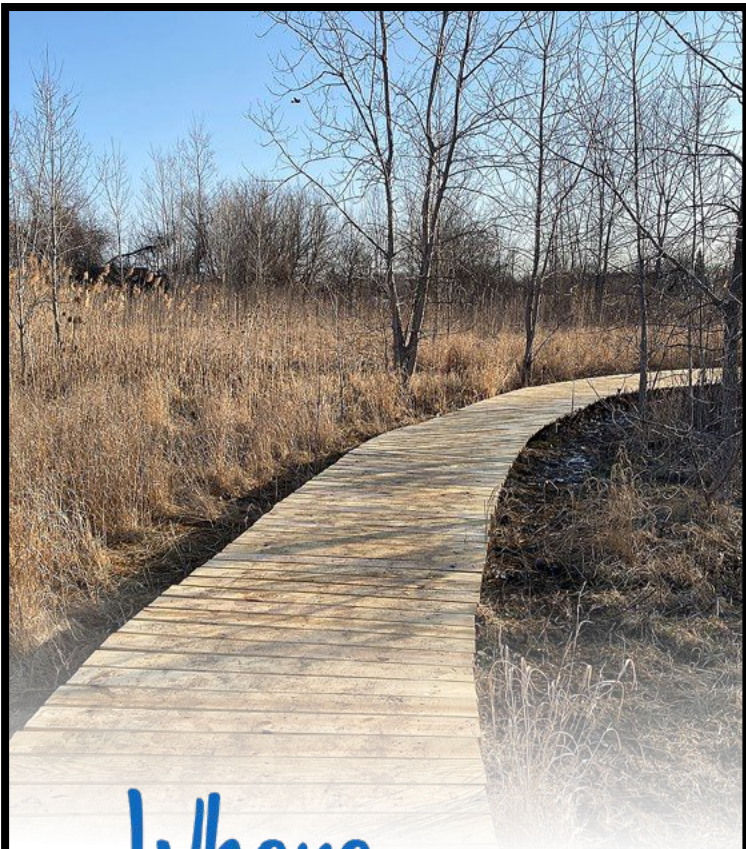

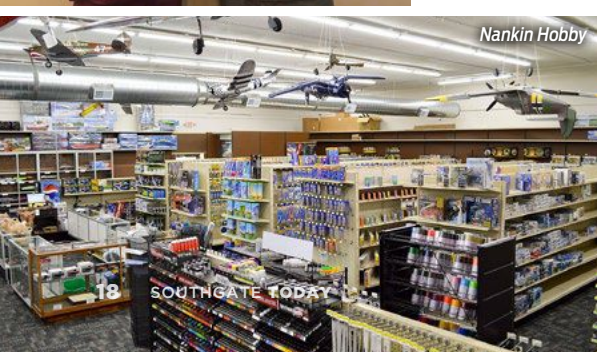

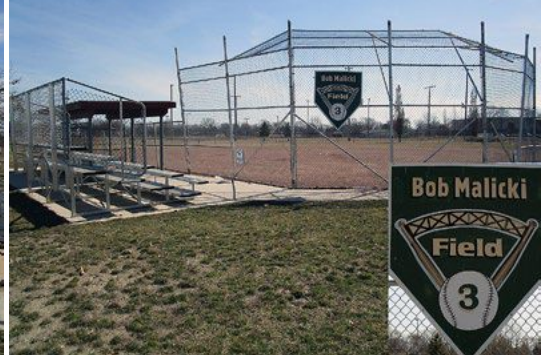

Summer Means Baseball

Our city boasts 10 ball diamonds. Each is named, and their names account for the history of Southgate's recreation program. All fields are located in Homer P. Howard Park. Mr. Howard was an Ecorse Township Justice of the Peace. He saw to it that a portion of all fines he levied we set aside to purchase this parkland.

- Diamond #1 is dedicated to James McDermott, a coach who continued to serve long after his children passed through the programs. He was instrumental in bringing national and world USSSA softball tournaments to Southgate.
- Diamond #2 is dedicated to Bob and Anna Renaud. They donated their time, talent and treasure to the recreation program and the city in general.
- Diamond #3 is dedicated to DPS employee Bob Malicki, a true renaissance man. He maintained, umpired, coached and played on those fields.
- Diamond #4 is dedicated to James "Jimmy" Boyle, a two-sports man active in both youth baseball and football.
- Diamond #5 is dedicated in honor of President John F. Kennedy.
- Diamond #6 is dedicated to Ken Forte, a baseball coach and early advocate of computers. He was responsible for placing the baseball association's records on computer in the early 1970s.
- Diamond #7 is dedicated to Sandra Hilliard, an honor student at both Anderson and Aquinas high schools. She died of bone cancer at the age of 17.
- Diamond #8 is dedicated to Mark Tylenda, an avid player. When he developed cancer

and could no longer play, he kept score. He is remembered as someone who loved the game.

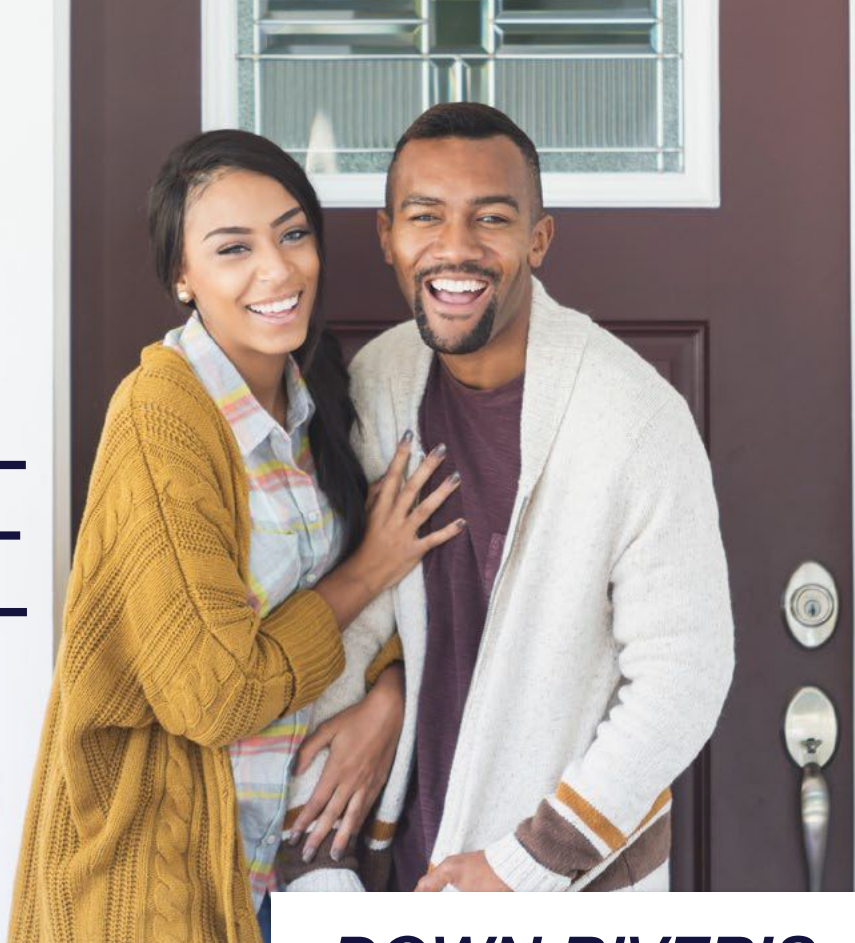

2020 WATER REPORT

ATTENTION: THIS IS AN IMPORTANT REPORT ON WATER QUALITY AND SAFETY

The Southgate Water Department is proud of our long history of providing quality drinking water to our customers and is honored to provide this report to you. The 2020 Consumers Annual Report on Water Quality shows the sources of our water, lists the results of our tests, and contains important information about water and health. The Southgate Water Department will notify you immediately if there is ever any reason for concern about our water. We are pleased to show you that the water we purchase from the Great Lakes Water Authority (GLWA) has surpassed water quality standards as mandated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the State of Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ). Drinking water quality is important to our community and the region. The Southgate Water Department and the GLWA are committed to meeting state and federal water quality standards, including the Lead and Copper Rule. With the Great Lakes as our water source and proven treatment technologies, the GLWA consistently delivers safe drinking water to our community. This year's Water Quality Report highlights the performance of GLWA and the Southgate Water Department professionals in delivering some of the nation's best drinking water. Together, we remain committed to protecting public health and maintaining open communication with the public about our drinking water.

ABOUT OUR SYSTEM

The Southgate Water Department provides water to approximately 30,000 residents, 10,000 homes, and over 2,000 businesses, schools, churches, apartment complexes and numerous guests and visitors. The Southgate Water Department also maintains over 100 miles of water main and approximately 1,300 fire hydrants. The Southwest Water Treatment Plant, owned and operated by the Great Lakes Water Authority (GLWA), is Southgate's major supplier of water. The Southwest Water Treatment Plant receives water from the Detroit River where underground pipes carry the water for treatment. The many miles of deep, raw water tunnels are periodically inspected – either by hard-hat divers or with cameras – for structural integrity and zebra mussel infestation. The City of Southgate and the Great Lakes Water Authority (GLWA) are committed to safeguarding our water supply and delivering the highest quality drinking water to protect public health. If you would like to know more about this report or have any questions or concerns about your water, please contact the Southgate Water Department at (734) 258-3074.

Safe drinking water is a shared responsibility. The water that Great Lakes Water Authority (GLWA) delivers to our community does not contain lead. Lead can leach into drinking water through home plumbing fixtures, and in some cases, customer service lines. Corrosion control reduces the risk of lead and copper from leaching into your water. Orthophosphates are added during the treatment process as a corrosion control method to create a protective coating in service pipes throughout the system, including in your home or business. The City of Southgate performs required lead and copper sampling and testing in our community. Water consumers also have

a responsibility to maintain the plumbing in their homes and businesses and can take steps to limit their exposure to lead.

NATIONAL PRIMARY DRINKING WATER REGULATIONS COMPLIANCE

In 2020, the Southgate Water Department had zero (0) monitoring and zero (0) maximum contaminant level violations and did not exceed any health standards.

In 2020, the Southgate Water Department had zero (0) monitoring violations of fecal coliform. The regulation requires confirmation of any positive result and that location and all points surrounding to be re-sampled within 24 hours of notification or the next business day.

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) required the City of Southgate to sample water for Unregulated Contaminant Monitoring Rule (UCMR) between the years of 2017-2020. The City of Southgate had no detectable contaminants during this period.

"Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. More information about contaminants and potential health effects can be obtained by calling the Environmental Protection Agency's Safe Drinking Water Hotline at (800-426-4791).

The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it can dissolve naturally occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity.

Contaminants that may be present in source water include:

- Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria, which may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations, and wildlife.
- Inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, which can be naturally occurring or result from urban storm water runoff, industrial or domestic wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining, or farming.
- Pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources such as agriculture, urban storm water runoff, and residential uses.
- Organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organic chemical, which are by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also come from gas stations, urban storm water runoff and septic systems.
- Radioactive contaminants, which can be naturally occurring or be the result of oil and gas production and mining activities.

In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, EPA prescribes regulations which limit the amount of certain contaminants in the water provided by public water systems. The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water, which must provide the same protection for public health."

"Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in

drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. EPA/CDC guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by Cryptosporidium and other microbial contaminants are available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791)."

Infants and children who drink water containing lead in excess of the AL could experience delays in their physical and mental development. Children could show slight deficits in attention span and learning abilities. Adults who drink this water over many years could develop kidney problems or high blood pressure. It is possible that lead levels at your home may be higher than at other homes in the community as a result of materials used in your home's plumbing. Additional information is available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. The City of Southgate is responsible for providing high quality drinking water but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you have a lead service line it is recommended that you run your water for 5 minutes to flush water from both your home plumbing and the lead service line. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. Information on lead in drinking water, testing methods, and steps you can take to minimize exposure is available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline or at <http://www.epa.gov/safewater/lead>.

The City of Southgate has a total of

10,876 water service lines. Of these water service lines, 39 are lead, 3,145 are other materials (copper, plastic, cast iron or galvanized) and 7,692 are of unknown material at this time. The City of Southgate is actively inspecting the water service lines of unknown material and will begin replacing known lead lines in the summer of 2021. This information was not included in the 2019 Consumer Confidence Report, as required by The Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE).

Your watersheds source water comes from the Detroit River, situated within the Lake St. Clair, Clinton River, Detroit River, Rouge River, Ecorse River, watersheds in the U.S. and parts of the Thames River, Little River, Turkey Creek and Sydenham watersheds in Canada. The Michigan Department of Environmental Quality in partnership with the U.S. Geological Survey, the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department and the Michigan Public Health Institute performed a source water assessment in 2004 to determine the susceptibility of the GLWA's Detroit River source water for potential contamination. The susceptibility rating is on a seven-tiered scale and ranges from very low to very high determined primarily using geologic sensitivity, water chemistry, and potential contaminant sources. The report described GLWA's Detroit River intakes as highly susceptible to potential contamination. However, all four GLWA water treatment plants that service the city of Detroit and draw water from Detroit River have historically provided satisfactory treatment and meet drinking water standards.

protection activities that include chemical containment, spill response, and a mercury reduction program. GLWA participates in a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit discharge program and has an emergency response management plan. In 2016, the Michigan Department of Environmental, Great Lakes and Energy approved GLWA's Fighting Island Surface Water Intake Protection plan. The plan has seven elements that include: roles and duties of government units and water supply agencies, delineation of a source water protection areas, identification of potential sources of contamination, management approaches for protection, contingency plans, siting of new sources, public participation and public education activities. GLWA is in the process of updating the plans which should be completed by September 2021. 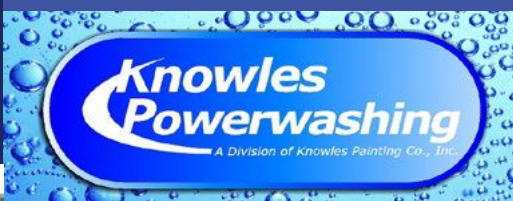

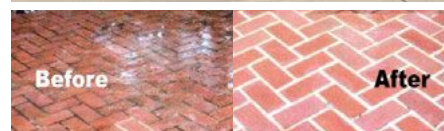

Southgate Police Department names school resource officer, increases transparency

Public safety is the foremost objective for the Southgate Police Department in 2021.

Director of Public Safety Joseph Marsh and the Southgate Police Department have implemented two community-based initiatives. The first is the creation of the school resource officer position, onboarding Officer Morgan Parrish into the position. The second is acquiring body cameras for officers to wear on duty.

Initiative #1: Connecting through education

The conversation to have a school resource officer started about a year and a half ago when Keith Garland, the security guard, informed the school he was looking into retirement.

“We saw this as a good opportunity to fill in the void of his departure,” said Police Chief Mark Mydlarz.

The police department implemented a selection process for the school resource officer position by posting the assignment for eligible officers to apply.

“Ironically, I was the only one to sign up for it,” Parrish said, laughing slightly.

Mydlarz said the police department encourages its officers to visit the schools. The goal is to familiarize themselves with the staff and students; visiting during morning drop-off, afternoon pick-up, and recess; or for the purpose of educating. Officer Parrish often visited the schools on patrol, having been with the police department since 2018.

Southgate Community Schools administrators thought highly of Officer Parrish, Mydlarz said, adding both the previous superintendent and members of the board asked for Parrish to be placed into the role.

Parrish’s desire to serve as a school resource officer originated in high school, when she lived in Warren. Before that, she wanted to be a teacher or a paramedic. Then Parrish took an

Introduction to Criminal Justice class during her senior year. She said that her school district had a resource officer, whom she described as “awesome”.

Parrish sees her role of the school resource officer as the “best of both worlds.” She enjoys children and her work for the police department. Parrish prepared for her new role in

February 2020 by traveling to Lansing to participate in a training session held at Michigan State Police headquarters. Her training session, the Teaching, Educating, and Mentoring (TEAM), familiarized her with aspects of community policing as well as juvenile law. The class helped school resource officers prepare for tasks they may receive in their role.

Mydlarz shared they intended to have Officer Parrish receive more training in June, but COVID-19 delayed those plans.

Nevertheless, Officer Parrish started her new role in January, when the school district resumed in-person learning.

Parrish shared her first day went very well.

“The kids were awesome,” she said.

When asked what her top priorities in the role are, she said:

“Safety and security of students and staff is number one. Building a better relationship between officers and children is next.”

Officer Parrish will primarily be based at Southgate Anderson High School and Davidson Middle School. However, her role would require visiting the other schools, depending on schedules.

Superintendent Sharon Irvine shared that, “We are thrilled to have Officer Parrish. We appreciate her focus on relationships and support. The partnership is an important one for both of us.”

Initiative #2: Connecting through transparency

In February, the police department received body cameras to incorporate into the police uniform.

Officers approached the police department’s administration about getting the body cameras. At the time, the department only possessed body microphones and in-car dash cameras. These devices came with limitations. Officers wanted to have the body cameras for themselves and the community.

According to Director Marsh and Chief Mydlarz’s joint email, “We felt that the acquisition of body cameras allowed for our department to have greater transparency in hopes of building even better community trust.”

The police department approached Mayor Kuspa with the idea and he was extremely supportive. From there, the administration presented the body camera program to city council. They approved the \$212,000 expenditure on a five-year plan. Some factors that worked in favor of the purchase were the service, support and upgrades that came with the plan.

Mydlarz shared the initial investment came from the forfeiture funds. Forfeiture funds for the police department



come from the seizure of money from a narcotics deal or vehicle seizure. If the funds were found to be part of the case, they were eligible to be used by police.

The remaining cost for the body cameras will primarily come from their general fund. However, the police department will look into grant funding to assist with the cost.

Both Mydlarz and Marsh felt the body cameras’ “...footage... [will]...not only help us with quality control of each incident but allows us to capture necessary evidence for any criminal cases as well.”

The footage, however, would only be accessible by a FOIA request or a judge’s request if the footage was necessary for court proceedings.

Each officer on duty will wear their body cameras during their shift on their chest to be visible to the public eye. They will activate it whenever they have contact with civilians.

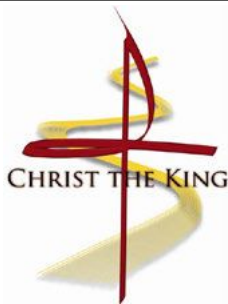

What the Bible Says About: *The Bible*



It may seem like an oddity, but the Bible actually has much to say about itself. Often we are asked about the Bible, its validity in a modern world, and how we can trust what it says since it was written so long ago. Practically, the Bible was written over a couple of different centuries and by more than 40 different authors, yet, amazingly, not one time does the Bible disagree internally with any doctrinal teachings, keeping the message of Christ and his cross at the forefront of all Scripture (1 Cor. 2:2). We believe that the Bible is "living and active" (Heb. 4:12) and is the direct revelation from God, through the Holy Spirit, to each of the biblical writers. Its message is simple: Jesus Christ lived, died, and rose from the grave in order to pay the penalty of sin on behalf of mankind so that we might be able to experience his grace.
