Motion 151 00:26:32 152 153 Council Member Smyth moved to adopt Ordinance 21-01, with the following changes: fix 154 the typo number from 35,000 to 20,000; change the maximum width for townhomes from 155 180' to 130' in the Edge Subdistrict, and add the section on roof drainage that had 156 accidently been omitted. City Manager 157 Dixon pointed out that since the maximum width for each townhome unit in the Edge Subdistrict 158 was 22', it may be better to make the maximum building width 110' or 132'.
