#### **Survey Response Rate and Margin of Error**

Margin of error, also called confidence interval, tells us how "confident" we can be that the survey results (sample) reflect the views of the entire population. This is a good measure of how effective the survey results are. The smaller the margin of error, the more confidence we can have that the survey results are representative of the larger population.


This year 573 residents completed the survey (although some did not answer every question). With a population of 17,541 and a confidence interval of 95%, the margin of error for the survey results is 4%. This means that the City can be 95% certain (confident) that, if all residents were to take the Survey, the results would be within +/- 4 percentage points of the survey responses.


Margin of error



Click on the map region which contains the location of your home.










#### What is your household annual income?





Overall, would you say the City of South Ogden is headed in the right or wrong direction? (by age group)




Overall, would you say the City of South Ogden is headed in the right or wrong direction? (rating of City Parks)

Right vs Wrong Direction & Parks Ratings




Overall, would you say the City of South Ogden is headed in the right or wrong direction? (rating of City Streets)

Right vs Wrong Direction & Streets Ratings




Overall, would you say the City of South Ogden is headed in the right or wrong direction? (rating of City Recreation)

Right vs Wrong Direction & Recreation Rating




Overall, would you say the City of South Ogden is headed in the right or wrong direction? (rating of Garbage Services)

Right vs Wrong Direction & Trash Rating






Would you recommend our City to your friends and family as a place to work and live? (Direction of the City)

Cross-Tabbed with Direction of the City




Would you recommend our City to your friends and family as a place to work and live? (by age group)

Age and Recommend City to Friends





## Based on the frequency of similar sentiments in the survey responses, the general themes and their level of concern among respondents are as follows:

- **1. Housing**: There is a significant concern regarding affordable housing and the impact of high-density housing like apartments. This is the most frequently mentioned issue, with 56 mentions.
- **2. Traffic**: Concerns about traffic flow, traffic lights, speeding, and parking have been mentioned 51 times, making it the second most common theme.
- **3. Road Repair**: The need for road maintenance and infrastructure improvements, including pothole repairs, was mentioned 40 times.
- **4. Parks and Recreation**: There is a strong desire for the development and maintenance of parks, recreational areas, and public spaces, mentioned 38 times, tied with city cleanliness.
- **5. City Cleanliness**: Keeping the city clean, maintenance, and removing junk and litter are also prominent themes, with 38 mentions.
- **6. Budget**: Fiscal responsibility, tax concerns, and budget management were mentioned 34 times.
- **7. Safety**: There are 26 mentions of the need to enhance safety measures, including crime prevention and improved police and fire department services.
- **8. Utilities**: Issues related to water, sewer, electricity, and broadband services were brought up 22 times.
- **9. Business Growth**: There are 19 mentions of the need for economic development, supporting local businesses, and retail growth.
- **10. Development**: Respondents mentioned zoning, permits, construction, and growth management concerns 12 times.

These themes provide a snapshot of the areas where the South Ogden City Council could focus their efforts in the upcoming year, with housing and traffic being the top concerns.





Below is a summary of the open-ended responses when asked what influenced their rating of the Police Department.

The survey responses about the police department can be summarized in order of frequency of similar sentiments as follows:

- **1.Response Time**: The most frequent concern was about the response time of police services.
- **2.Community Engagement**: There was a significant number of comments about the need for increased community engagement and visibility of officers in neighborhoods.
- **3.Communication**: Feedback on the quality and effectiveness of communication from the police department was common.
- **4.Professionalism and Conduct**: Residents frequently commented on the professionalism and conduct of police officers.
- **5.Safety and Security**: Concerns and perceptions regarding overall safety and security in the community were also notable.

I had tried to contact Animal Control numerous times and left messages. No one ever called me back. I just wanted to donate a cat trap i didnt need any longer. Frustrating. I finally took it to the SO City building and donated it there.

I was involved in an accident and SOPD officers responded to take a report. They were fine. Not very chit chatty though.

Helpful, kind, knowledgeable, quick response

We were almost scammed out of thousands of dollars, reported it to South Ogden PD, and they were great!

Slow response

Quick action on my report of misuse on the nature park trail & somewhat regular surveillance

No real interest in ensuring basic traffic laws are being followed.

Luckily I don't need them often so I'm grateful I feel I live in a safe area.

Ease and quickness of my concern being addressed.

We requested a traffic reader on our street and instead of that they did a "study" but put the reader up for 24 hours on a Sunday. Doesn't represent traffic in our area. 2nd encounter was when kids stole comcast traffic cones and put them in our yard. We reported in the stolen property and the officer told us to put them in someone else's yard to let them deal with it. We didn't do that so we were stuck with them after he said we couldn't throw stolen property in the garbage. We called comcast to try and pick them up but could only make an appt for service with money down.

City Mayor & City Manger helped with a problem with our neighbors. The problem was solved quickly.

It was the dog license lady. She was a sweetheart!

They were timely and polite

Quick response to car break in

Friendly

Kind and very knowledgeable

Not a lot of interaction, but the little I had was fine.

Anytime we've had to call south Ogden police they've been quick to respond and have always been friendly with interacting with them

I got a speeding ticket, So it wasn't excellent. However, the officer was very professional.

Kindness professionalism they were very patient and happy to help me understand the process.

Nothing

Police investigated my accident. Nothing to brag about.

I received a call back regarding a 911 call.

They came to my home for a possible violation of the city code.

they were responsive to our concerns and acted on them..

Nice to work with even if I was the one getting the ticket

they were very polite and understanding

Immediate response both times. They do a great job.

Every SOPD officer I've ever dealt with is AMAZING and helpful.

Illegal fireworks all day every day certain parts of the year.

It might not have been the answer I was hoping for but it was the correct answer.

They were very kind a polite and nice to work with.

They were quick and responsive

Took time and I didn't feel rushed explaining the situation

We expressed concern about the speeding and red light abuse at the intersection of Washington and 1050 E., as well as at other points on Washington. The police responded immediately. NOTE: Many drivers in South Ogden and other surrounding communities, exhibit selfishness, and poor driving habits. Especially bad is the tendency to weave in and out of lanes, cutting in front of another driver, without signaling (frequently to make a right turn), and using the horn to abuse other drivers. I've seen these and other bad-driving occurrences regularly, and have experienced them too.

They took care of the problem right away.

The city's failure to enforce its own winter street parking ordinance.

Quick response time, professional, and helpful.

I called about a woman who left her 3 toddlers and a baby in her car while she was in Fresh Market shopping. It took forever for the officer to arrive and then he proceeded to tell me that since it wasn't as hot as it had been (it was 75 degrees outside) that the kids were probably fine. There were no windows cracked and the one child had gotten himself out of his car seat. He has to look up the rules for leaving children in the car because the woman said there was a rule in Utah that you could leave your kids for 15 minutes alone. She was gone way longer than 15 minutes and there was like 5 witnesses there so could attest to it. You can't leave children under 12 in a car alone and I wouldn't even leave my 12 year old alone. I ended up feeling like the bad guy and he basically just told her not to do it again and she just drove off in her car. He was very nonchalant about the whole thing and somewhat rude to me.

I got pulled over for expired car registration. Officer was kind, informative and I appreciated his explanation of ticket and future potential consequences without enforcing the maximum punishment option.

friendliness and clear communication

No visible police patrols in area.

Timing and etiquette

Police Department staff did not follow-thru on issue

Fast response, good information from officer when I was in an accident. Very friendly.

Unprofessional

Quick response, courteous officer, willingness to discuss options and how we can prevent similar exposure in future

They were polite and helpful.

An officer (sergeant actually) on route to the jail was stopped by a train at the furthest crossing from the Weber County Jail directly behind me on W 17th. As soon as he pulled behind us, he started to reverse as if he was going to turn around, but then put his patrol car into park. After about 15 minutes of waiting for the now stopped train to start moving again, we put our car into reverse and started to slowly back up. We did have barely enough room to back out, but I didn't want to risk it, so while the driver was in reverse, I politely walked up to the passenger side window of this sergeants patrol vehicle, and politely asked him if he could back up a couple of feet, so the driver could safely back out and turn around. (He also had a possible suspect in the front seat of his patrol car actively showering her his laptop. Against dept. Policy? I would hope so.) When I asked him if he could turn around, he replied "it's illegal to reverse in forward lanes." (Something I just SAW him do, prior to the train stopping. After this, I gave him the middle finger. He came out a short time later "agreeing to move" 20 minites later, so long as I never gave him the middle finger again. I refused and went off on this sergeant for using first amendment protected speech as a means to not move his car, simply out of spite and ego.

Professional and competent. Not threatening.

They responded quickly and followed up with us after the incident.

I had a good experience, but my neighbor did not.

Police determination of priorities of policeing.

The dispatcher's professional and friendly response; the officer who was dispatched arrived quickly, was responsive and patrolled the neighborhood looking for the kids who were causing problems.

Lack of interest in the problem

We reported an incident at a city park and a police officer was there within minutes.












# How would you rate your experience at South Ogden City Parks?



The survey responses about water in South Ogden can be summarized based on the frequency of similar sentiments:

- **1.Taste and Quality Concerns:** Many respondents commented on the taste of the water, with some finding it good and others not. Comments about the water being hard, having a chlorine taste, or being clean but having a funny taste were common.

The survey responses about street services can be summarized based on the frequency of similar sentiments:

- **1.Potholes Concerns** The most frequent complaint, with numerous mentions of potholes needing attention.
- **2.Need for Repaving** A significant number of responses highlighted the need for repaving various streets.
- **3.General Maintenance Issues** Concerns about the overall maintenance of streets, including uneven roads and areas in need of repair.
- **4.Specific Location Issues** Mention of specific neighborhoods or areas near construction sites needing more attention.
- **5.Positive Feedback on Improvements** Some responses acknowledged recent improvements and repaving efforts in certain areas.

Most roads are in good condition and visible markings

Residential areas need more work done.



How are you most likely to stay informed with what is happening in South Ogden City?


