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## Reportable Diseases - August 2019

**Mandated reporters, such as health care providers, hospitals, and laboratories, must report any suspected or confirmed case of these diseases to the local health authority within the number of days or hours indicated in parentheses. (\*HIV/AIDS is reportable directly to IDPH). Those marked Immediate must be reported within 3 hours.**
