General personnel policy issues may not be considered in a closed session. A public body may not consider the qualifications, competence, performance, character, fitness, appointment, or removal of a member of the public body or another body and may not consider or fill a vacancy among its own membership except in an open meeting. Final action making an appointment or discharge or removal by a public body having final authority for the appointment or discharge, or removal shall be taken in an open meeting.

Mr. Robbie Wagoner presented the following summary of two health insurance plan proposals.

- Monthly Costs Associated With Health Insurance Premium
 - o Priscilla & Robbie (Employees): \$229.48 (≈ 14%)
 - Priscilla: \$114.74 (≈ 7%)
 - Robbie: \$114.74 ($\approx 7\%$)
 - Town of Stokesdale (Employer): $\$1,400.00 \approx 86\%$
 - Town (Priscilla): \$700.00 ($\approx 43\%$)
 - Town (Robbie): \$700.00 ($\approx 43\%$)

Mrs. Kim Thacker, Finance Officer explained that Council previously voted to reimburse the employees for their coverage but after more research, determined that the employees may not qualify for reimbursement based on their salary. She noted further that both Mr. Wagoner and Mrs. Hunsucker did pay their January premiums at total of \$558.53. She then requested that Council consider reimbursing each for their premiums and add it to their gross wages.

Mayor Pro Tem Foy made a <u>Motion</u> that Mrs. Thacker receive a receipt from both Mr. Wagoner and Mrs. Hunsucker for the insurance premiums paid in January to Friday Health Care and to gross their wages up by that amount on their next paycheck. Councilman Landreth seconded the motion.

1. Call To Order and Invocation.

3. Septic System Repair

This agenda item was removed from the meeting agenda.

4. Water System Capital Improvements and Engineering Firm Selection.

Water System Capital Improvements:

Councilman Jones introduced Michael Hodges from A & D Enterprises, to speak on blow off valves for the Town's water system.

Mr. Michael Hodges, A&D Enterprises, 2975 Motsinger Road; Winston Salem, NC 27107, explained the process in which the 50-60 blow-off valves will be located and serviced.

Councilman Jones noted that Yates Construction will be available to help A&D locate the 50-60 blow off valves if A&D is unable to locate them, however, Yates does not have the time to take on this project at this time.

Council discussed the process should any valves need to be repaired and the time frame for conducting these blow-offs. Mr. Hodges stated that he could have a crew ready to start the project next week.

Councilman Jones made a <u>Motion</u> that the Town Of Stokesdale approve the contract with A&D enterprises pending Michael Hodge's signature.

Town Attorney Chuck Winfree stated that Council can not consider this contract since no agenda item was presented to allow them to consider a contract. He stated that Council would be required to hold another meeting and have this as an agenda item.

By consensus of Council, a meeting was scheduled for Friday, March 31, 2023.

Engineering Firm Selection (for Water Line Extension to Add Water System Redundancy)

Mayor Pro Tem Foy spoke on the Request For Qualifications (RFQ) provided by Hazen & Sawyer, Inc. and then the proposal submitted by Thomas & Hutton, Inc.

Councilman Jones made a <u>Motion</u> to rank Thomas & Hutton as #1 and rank Hazen as #2 then have the Mayor negotiate with each vendor. Councilman Landreth seconded the motion.

Engineering Selection (for Water Line Extension along Ellisboro Road)

Proposal submitted by Kennerly Engineering for a water line extension project along Ellisboro Road.

Mayor Pro Tem Foy made a <u>Motion</u> for town staff to complete applications for NC DEQ for encroachment submittals to be approved by NC DEQ and NC DOT, then have Mayor sign and return to Kennerly Engineering, have Kennerly start a Request For Qualification process for the construction of this project. Councilman Rigsbee seconded the motion.

Mayor Pro Tem Foy noted that if the bids received are below \$500,000 the process can be informal if more than \$500,000 a formal bid process would be required.

Councilman Jones voiced his objections that the Town should not have to pay for this project. He noted that NCRWA has confirmed that the water flow is fine for fire flow in this area and was properly constructed. The developer promised to pay for this extension. However, this extension does tie up some loose ends and will improve our water quality.

Mayor Pro Tem Foy noted the money already spent on this project and the need to finish what was started to improve our water system. He stated that his intent is to find out how much this may cost and then bring it back to Council. Council discussed what has already been paid to Kennerly and what may be owed to continue this project.

Mayor Pro Tem Foy <u>withdrew his Motion</u>. By consensus, this item will be continued to the special called meeting March 31, 2023.

Mayor Pro Tem Foy then made a <u>Motion</u> to submit a RFQ to cover general engineering services for the agitator for the water tank. Councilman Landreth seconded the motion.

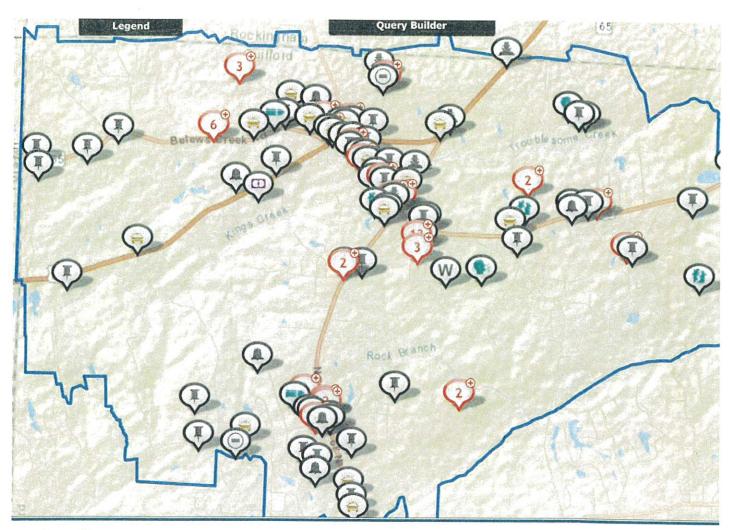
For the month of September, the sheriff's office responded to a total of 192 calls for service in Stokesdale town limits, resulting in 15 formal case reports.

GRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN STOKESDALE PARKS & RECREATION and THE TOWN OF STOKESDALE

This Sponsorship Agreement is hereby made and entered into by and between the TOWN OF STOKESDALE, a North Carolina Municipal Corporation (hereinafter referred to as ""The Town" or the "Grantor") and STOKESDALE PARKS & RECREATION (hereinafter "Grantee") as follows:

- WHEREAS the Town is a municipal corporation existing under the laws of the State of North Carolina and is duly authorized to provide recreational facilities for the benefit of the public; and
- WHEREAS Grantee is a Non-Profit Corporation existing under the laws of the State of North Carolina, and has been such since the filing its Articles with the North Carolina Secretary of State on February 10, 2003; and
- 3. WHEREAS Grantee is the owner of a parcel of land of approximately 21.5 acres located at 8401 Capri Drive in Town of Stokesdale (hereinafter the "Property"), upon which are situated athletic fields, primarily used for baseball, and associated structures, facilities, and lighting (hereinafter the "Baseball Fields").
- 4. WHEREAS Grantee has recently amended its bylaws to dedicate its assets solely to non-profit purposes, to prohibit any compensation to its Board of Directors, to prohibit self-dealing, to provide for accurate and complete records of the Grantee's funds and other assets, and provide for proper governance of the Grantee; and
- 5. WHEREAS the lighting at the Baseball Fields is old and inefficient, and the poles used in for the lighting are old and becoming increasingly dangerous to those using the Baseball Fields; and
- 6. WHEREAS Grantee and the Town have determined that the lighting and associated electrical wiring, switching, poles, and associated infrastructure should be replaced, all of which work is herein called the "Project".

- 3. Upon Grantee's certification to the Town that it has raised \$25,000 toward the cost of the Project, the Town will pay to Grantee \$50,000, as follows:
 - a. Grantee will present to Town invoices that it receives from Grantee's contractors or subcontractors for the Project.
 - b. Within 30 days of the Town's receiving the invoices described above, it will pay the amount of said invoices to Grantee, up to \$50,000.
- 4. Grantee, for a period of 10 years from the date of this Agreement, will, upon request of the Town, provide to the Town documentation of the Grantee's use of the funds from the Town provided under this Agreement.
- 5. Grantee, for a period of 10 years from the date of this Agreement, will notify the Town of any interest Grantee may have in selling, conveying, or encumbering the Property, or any portion thereof at least 90 days before any contemplated sale, conveyance, or encumbrance.
- 6. Grantee will cause the Project to be performed and completed in a workmanlike manner and in compliance with all applicable construction regulations and standards within one year of this Agreement.
- 7. If Grantee fails to comply with any of the terms of paragraphs 1, 2, 4, or 5, above, and said failure is not cured after a 60 day notice and opportunity to cure, then Grantee will refund to The Town a prorated portion of the funds paid by the Town, based upon the number of full years that Grantee complied with the Agreement as compared to 10 years. For example, if the Grantee complies with the requirements of this agreement for 3 years only, then Grantee would refund to The Town 70% of the amount that The Town paid under this Agreement.
- 8. If Grantee fails to comply with paragraph 6, above, and said failure is not cured after a 60 day notice and opportunity to cure, or, if the failure is not one that can reasonably be cured within 60 days, Grantee does not initiate a cure within 60 days and diligently pursue the cure thereafter, then all funds will be refunded to the Town.
