Your Town government appreciates citizen input. So, in an effort to maximize effective resolutions on resident's issues, we encourage Town residents and businesses to contact us at Town Hall first, weekdays: 9 a.m.–5 p.m., or by written correspondence (or email to info@uppermarlboromd.gov). You are always welcome to schedule an appointment with the President or a Commissioner to discuss municipal problems and quality-of-life issues one-on-one, and work together towards a satisfactory solution.

Agendas for meetings are posted on our website and a synopsis of the monthly Town Meeting Agenda is also provided in the "On the Agenda" column of our monthly newsletter, the *Landings*. Outreach and notices of legislative items are also posted on the Town's social media accounts (Facebook & Twitter).

Our meetings are open to the public, and we ask that residents who want to comment to please follow the rules that have been established by "Resolution 2019-02: Commission Meeting Regulationsfor Public Meetings"...

III. Citizen Input

- A. At regular and special meetings, residents of the Town may have the opportunity to address the Board on any item on the agenda provided a resident is recognized and allowed to speak by the President. Recognized public comment and/or questions that are germane to the immediate agenda item shall be limited to (1) minute. Furthermore, each regular meeting shall also have an agenda item for citizen input regarding any municipal question, during which time any resident of the Town may address the Board for up to three (3) minutes on matters or items not necessarily placed on the agenda. Individuals not residing in the Town may speak at regular or special meetings under conditions specified by the Board. The President or the Board may uniformly change or adjust the time limitations for all speakers depending on the circumstances or provide additional time for experts or other officials.
- **B.** Except in instances where the presiding officer expressly invites or allocates time for public testimony, questions, comments, or other forms of participation, or when public participation is otherwise authorized by law, no member of the public attending an open meeting session may actively participate in the session. Public comment by members of the public is not typically designed or intended for interactive dialogue between the Commission and the public, unless the presiding officer specifically allows it or the Commission elects to suspend its rules to allow such colloquy.
- C. Speakers shall state their name for the record, and their address (street name only). Ordinarily, for each agenda item, including citizen input, speakers shall have one opportunity to speak and may not poll or ask questions of individual commissioners, staff or public officials. Otherwise, the Board shall determine the conduct of the public discussions on any issue and may set reasonable time limits for such.
- **D.** Ordinarily, work sessions are open to public observation only and public participation is at the discretion of the Board. At work sessions, residents and non-residents may be allowed to speak on any municipal issue, but only under conditions specified by the Board.

Each individual speaker must stand, state their name and home of record (street name only) and approach the Board to a designated position in order to be recognized by the Chair of the Board, and to be heard by the recording Clerk, as well as others in attendance.

Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 7:08 p.m.

Pledge of Allegiance

Approval of Meeting Minutes & Financial Reports

The Regular Town Meeting minutes from May 14, 2019, the Town Charter Public Forum minutes from May 23, 2019, and the Board Work Session minutes from May 28, 2019 were acknowledged by the Board as reviewed. Commissioner Leonard motioned to approve the three sets of minutes, Commissioner Pennoyer seconded. All minutes from May's Regular Town Meeting, Public Forum and Board Work Session were unanimously approved.

Commissioner Pennoyer motioned to approve the Treasurer's Report as of May 31, 2019, Commissioner Leonard seconded. The Treasurer's Report was unanimously approved.

President Turner then asked that Agenda line item #8 "Presentation from the PGC NAACP" be delivered at this time, and the Reports section of the Agenda be forgone for tonight's meeting Before the presentation, the President recounted the history of overt and covert racism, from in and outside of Town, and her personal experiences with it since running for office for the 2018-2020 term.

Presentation

<u>NAACP/Prince George's County Chapter</u>: NAACP Chapter Vice-President Jody Wildy delivered a thirteenminute presentation on the history of the NAACP, current race-relations issues, and the positive progress in diversity brought forth with the election of President Turner. The floor was then opened by President Turner for public comment.

Business

Ordinance 2019-04 Town Operating Budget for FY2020: Finance Director William Morgan delivered an overview of the proposed FY2020 Town Operating Budget via a PowerPoint presentation. Highlights included: 1.) Anticipated County and State grants; 2.) Business License Fee ordinance and schedule; 3.) Diversified portfolios; 4.) Raised meter rates; 4.) Increased Highway User Revenues (HUR), and State Aid for Police Protection (SAPP); 5.) Raised Public Utility and Commercial Real Property tax rates; 6.) Grant award letters; 7.) New employee salaries, positions and training; Restricted Funds spending priorities/ Town Playground, Visitor Welcome Center; and, 8.) Capital Improvements Projects/ IT infrastructure. During the presentation, Town Attorney Kevin Best noted that the County had just signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Town, enabling the ownership and operation of 100 additional parking meters on Governor Oden Bowie Drive.

President Turner then motioned to adopt Ordinance 2019-04: Town Operating Budget for FY2020. Commissioner Pennoyer seconded. With all in favor, the motion was unanimously approved.

<u>Emergency Ordinance 2019-05 Budget Amendments for FY19</u>: President Turner motioned to amend Ordinance 2019-05 as an emergency ordinance throughout the document, Commissioner Pennoyer seconded. With no one opposed, the motion was unanimously approved. The President then asked for a

motion to adopt Ordinance 2019-05 as amended, to which Commissioner Pennoyer motioned, and Commissioner Leonard seconded. With all in favor, the motion was unanimously approved.

Old Line Bank/account presentation: This item was tabled to an undetermined future date.

Annexation Resolution 01-2019 Annexation Phase I: President Turner explained how the Phase One area to be annexed did not include any residential properties, and how the current Annexation Plan benefits the best interests of the Town. Attorney Best elaborated on specific details. Clerk Williams then introduced the Annexation Resolution pending final legal review. President Turner then asked for a motion to adopt AR 01-2019 as introduced, to which Commissioner Pennoyer motioned, and Commissioner Leonard seconded. It was noted the Resolution was subject to final approval according to the AR schedule listed on page 11.

The Annexation Plan was then reviewed and introduced by President Turner. Commissioner Leonard motioned to approve the Plan as stated, and Commissioner Pennoyer seconded. With all in favor, the motion was unanimously approved.

Resolution 2019-02: Commission Meeting Regulations: After reviewing the Resolution's history of public comment and discussion, the President explained how this Resolution will assist with proper policy and procedure for Board Meetings. President Turner then re-introduced Resolution 2019-02, and, asked for a motion to approve. Commissioner Leonard motioned to approve the Resolution as presented. A vote of the full Board was then conducted with President Turner and Commissioner Leonard both voting "Yea", and Commissioner Pennoyer voting "Nay". The motion was passed by majority vote of the Board.

<u>Professional Services Contract(s)</u>: The President explained the value of the Greenwill Consulting Group who was hired to lobby on behalf of the Town for project funding at the County and State level. Stating their contract was up for renewal, she motioned to approve the renewal contract and Commissioner Leonard seconded the motion. With all in favor, the motion was unanimously approved.

A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Greentree, a service contractor previously utilized to remove a tree that fell across a Town road and was beyond the capabilities of the Town to properly remove in a timely manner, was presented for Board approval by President Turner. After explaining the benefits of having the MOU to ensure timely resolution with such matters, the President motioned to approve the MOU pending legal review by the Town Attorney. Commissioner Pennoyer seconded the motion. With no one opposed, the MOU was unanimously approved.

The President explained the need to change the auditing firm that conducts the Town's Annual Audit. Commissioner Pennoyer motioned to approve the 4-year contract with C. Brown & Associates from June 30, 2019 through November 30, 2023, pending legal review. The contract was approved with a full majority vote of the Board.

<u>Staff Contract</u>: A Board vote of approval for an employment contract for the Director of Finance & Human Resources had been overlooked, but, was put forth to the Board for approval, pending legal review. Commissioner Pennoyer requested the deletion of "or Treasurer" from the contract, and, motioned to approve the contract, as amended, and pending legal review. With all in favor, the motion was passed.

Special Message from the Mayor: The President thanked everyone for all the kind words of encouragement this evening, and then read aloud her letter of resignation from the Board of Commissioners for the Town of Upper Marlboro effective June 30, 2019. She added that, though the position has been the greatest experience of her career, she has a greater priority to see to her family duties and responsibilities at this time. She noted it has been a great honor to serve the Town, and then motioned for the Board to accept her letter of resignation. Commissioner Leonard seconded. With no one opposed, the motion was passed.

Adiournment

A RESOLUTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DESIGNATING THOSE PERSONS IN ADDITION TO THE TREASURER WHO SHALL BE AUTHORIZED TO SIGN CHECKS, CERTIFICATES OF DEPOSIT AND OTHER BANK INSTRUMENTS ISSUED ON BEHALF OF THE TOWN WHEN THE NEED ARISES AND THE TREASURER IS UNAVAILABLE, AND ESTABLISHING THE DOLLAR AMOUNT ABOVE WHICH ALL CHECKS MADE PAYABLE BY THE TOWN SHALL BE ISSUED AND SIGNED BY THE TREASURER AND PRESIDENT OR TWO (2) OTHER PERSONS DESIGNATED HEREIN OF WHICH AT LEAST ONE (1) IS TO BE A COMMISSIONER.

WHEREAS, Charter Section 82-46 of The Town of Upper Marlboro, as amended by Charter Amendment Resolution 01-2012 effective October 31, 2012, requires that all checks issued in payment of salaries or other municipal obligations shall be issued and signed by the Treasurer, and that the Board of Commissioners may further authorize persons other than the Treasurer when the need arises and the Treasurer is unavailable to sign checks issued by the Town, and furthermore, the Board shall establish a dollar amount above which all checks must be co-signed by the Treasurer and President, or in their absence, two (2) other designated persons of which at least one (1) shall be a commissioner; and

WHEREAS, the Town Commissioners wish to carry out the intent of said Charter Section 82-46 by naming the designated persons to sign checks when the need arises, and the Treasurer is unavailable and establish the dollar amount above which checks require two authorized signatures.

WHEREAS, the resignation of President Tonga Y. Turner effective as of June 30th, 2019, and the selection by the Board of Commissioners of Commissioner Wanda M. Leonard to replace her as President has resulted in a change in the membership and officers of the Board of Town Commissioners, specifically in the Office of the President as previously designated and named in Resolution 2018-01 as an authorized alternate signer of checks in the absence of the Treasurer along with the remaining alternate signers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners for The Town of Upper Marlboro, sitting in regular session this ______ day of ______, 2019, that Commissioner Linda Pennoyer, who is the duly appointed Treasurer, is authorized to sign any forms, contracts, or agreement on behalf of the Town for the establishment of safety deposit boxes and general banking and financial services for the Town, to include checking and savings

accounts, CDs, money market accounts and other similar financial and investment instruments, and to perform all general activities associated therewith to, including serving as the required signatory or authorized individual on all checks, deposits, withdrawals and fund transfers as needed and in accordance with the Town's Charter and fiscal policies, and be it,

FURTHER RESOLVED, that Commissioner Wanda M. Leonard shall serve as substitute or additional signatory on all checks, deposits, withdrawals and fund transfers in the event there is a need and the Treasurer is unavailable, provided that all checks above \$5,000.00 made payable by the Town shall be issued and co-signed by the Treasurer and President, and if either or both or due to their unavailability or incapacities, the following two (2) other designated persons shall so serve of which at least one (1) is a commissioner: 1.) the Commissioner to be elected at the August 5th Special Election as evidenced by the approved minutes from the meeting at which the new commissioner is qualified and sworn into office, and 2.) Town Clerk, M. David Williams, and be it,

FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution will supersede Resolution 2018-01 immediately upon the date of its passage, and be it,

FURTHER RESOLVED, that any financial institution doing business with the Town is hereby authorized to honor, receive, certify, or pay all checks, CDs or other instruments signed by persons as authorized by the Town Charter and this Resolution, and be it,

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the foregoing Resolution and designation of persons authorized to sign checks or other instruments pursuant hereto, shall remain in full force and effect until written notice of its amendment, modification or repeal, shall have been received by the Town's banks or financial institutions and that receipt of such notice shall not affect any action taken by a financial institution prior thereto, and be it,

FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage.

A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE ANNEXATION OF TWO (2) SEGMENTS OF STATE HIGHWAYS (RIGHTS-OF-WAY OF MD 4 & MD 717) AND APPROXIMATELY FIVE (5) PARCELS (INCLUDING PORTIONS OF PARCELS ALREADY LOCATED WITHIN THE TOWN'S CORPORATE LIMITS) OF LAND CONSISTING OF AN ANNEXATION AREA OF 189.08 ACRES OF LAND, MORE OR LESS, LOCATED IN THE 3RD ASSESSMENT DISTRICT OF PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY, AND LOCATED GENERALLY SOUTH AND EAST OF THE PRESENT CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF UPPER MARLBORO, INCLUDING LANDS SITUATED SOUTH OF MARLBORO PIKE (MD 725) BOUNDED BY OR STRADDLING MARLBORO RACE TRACK ROAD (PRIVATE ROAD), THE WESTERN BASIN OF DEPOT POND LOCATED WITHIN PARCEL 32 AND WEST OF THE CSX TRANSPORTATION RAILROAD RIGHT-OF-WAY, PARCEL 115, A PORTION OF PARCEL 60, A PORTION OF PARCEL 245, A SEGMENT OF PENNSYLVANIA AVENUE/STEPHANIE ROPER HIGHWAY (MD 4) BISECTING PARCEL 32, AND A SEGMENT OF WATER STREET (MD 717) INTO THE CORPORATE TERRITORY OF THE TOWN OF UPPER MARLBORO AS MORE FULLY DESCRIBED IN THIS RESOLUTION; PROVIDING FOR THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE ANNEXATION TO THE TOWN OF UPPER MARLBORO; AMENDING THE CHARTER OF THE TOWN OF UPPER MARLBORO FOR THE PURPOSES OF INCLUDING THE ANNEXED PROPERTY WITHIN THE LEGAL DESCRIPTIONS AND PLATS DEPICTING THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN; AND GENERALLY ALL MATTERS RELATED TO SAID ANNEXATION.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners finds it to be in the best interest of the Town of Upper Marlboro (the "Town") to initiate this Resolution proposing the annexation of certain public lands (Tax Map 102, Parcel 32, [North and South of Pennsylvania Avenue/Stephanie Roper highway (MD 4)] & Tax Map 102, Parcel 115; & Tax Map 101, Parcel 245; & Tax Map 101, Parcel 60 into the Town (the "First Annexation") including the lands commonly known as the Show Place Arena and Prince George's Equestrian Center Properties, a portion of the Pennsylvania Avenue (MD 4) public right-of-way, a portion of the Water Street (MD 717) public right-of-way, the Upper Marlboro Community Center property at 5400 Marlboro Race Track Road, the Prince George's Soil Conservation District property at 5301 Marlboro Race Track Road, Depot Pond west of the CSX Transportation Railroad right-of-way, the fast and submerged land on either side of Marlboro Race Track Road within or bounding Parcel 32 to said private road's intersection with Marlboro Pike (MD 725) as more fully described herein below and particularly as described in the metes and bounds description of Section 2 provided

below and the map of the first annexation of the Town of Upper Marlboro, prepared by Charles P. Johnson and Associates, Inc. (June 2019) attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, The Town is authorized by the Town Charter and provisions of Title 4, Subtitle 4 of the Local Government Article, of the Annotated Code of Maryland (the "Maryland Code") to expand its municipal boundaries by annexing lands which are adjoining and contiguous; and

WHEREAS, this Resolution is initiated by the Town Board of Commissioners pursuant to §4-403 of the LG Art., of Maryland Code; and

WHEREAS, the property to be annexed will consist of adjoining public ways and five (5) parcels of land (Tax Map 102, Parcel 32, [North and South of Pennsylvania Avenue/Stephanie Roper Highway (Md 4)] & Tax Map 102, Parcel 115; & Tax Map 101, Parcel 245; & Tax Map 101, Parcel 60) totaling 189.08 acres of land, more or less, contiguous and adjoining to the existing southern and eastern corporate boundaries of the Town, and more particularly described herein below (the "Annexation Property") owned by Prince George's County, Maryland, the Prince George's County Soil Conservation District, and the State of Maryland; and

WHEREAS, parts of the Annexation Property are currently zoned according to the following categories or classifications: R-O-S or Reserved Open Space, RA or Residential-Agricultural, RR or Rural Residential and C-S-C or Commercial Shopping Center pursuant to the County Zoning Ordinance as depicted on the County Zoning Map; and

WHEREAS, the Local Government Article ("LG"), §4-403 of the Maryland Code states that "[b]efore an annexation resolution is introduced, the legislative body shall obtain consent from: (1) at least 25% of the registered voters who are residents in the area to be annexed; and (2) the owners of at least of 25% of the assessed valuation of real property in the area to be annexed..."; and

WHEREAS, the Annexation Property currently has no residential dwellings, and no residential occupants residing upon the premises or parcels owned and maintained by governmental owners named herein; therefore, the Board of Commissioners finds that there are no qualified voters residing in the Annexation Property; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners further finds that all of the parcels, ways or lands of the Annexation Property are owned by tax exempt entities including the State of Maryland, Prince George County, and the Prince George's Soil Conservation District; and

WHEREAS, on April 4, 2019, the Court of Appeals of Maryland held in *Town of Forest Heights v. Md.-Nat'l Capital Park & Planning Comm'n* (No. 21, Sept. Term 2018) that the 25% consent requirement of LG § 4-403(b)(2) is not applicable to the owners of tax-exempt properties, and the Attorney General of Maryland has opined in 66 Op. Att'y Gen. Md. 267 (1981) that regarding land owned by a county government within a proposed municipal annexation area, a county government may not veto or withhold consent to a municipal annexation of its real property as follows from the *City of Salisbury v. Banker's Life*, 21 Md. App. 396, 404 (1974) case, which stood for the proposition that the consent of tax-exempt

property owners within a proposed annexation area is not required to effectuate a municipal annexation; and

WHEREAS, the Annexation Property is described in the metes and bounds legal description of a parcel or parcels of land referenced herein below as the First Annexation, and the Annexation Property is more further described or depicted on a map exhibit entitled "Map of the First Annexation of the Town of Upper Marlboro, Prince George's County, Maryland, 1" = 300', June 2019" prepared by Charles P. Johnson and Associates, Inc., which is attached hereto as Exhibit A, and the Annexation Property is further shown on the Prince George's County TAX MAP (Tax Map 102, Parcel 32 (Account No. 0238873), & Tax Map 102, Parcel 115 (Account No. 3733714); & Tax Map 101, Parcel 245 (Account No. 0229864); & Tax Map 101, Parcel 60 (Account No. 0192286); and

WHEREAS, a proposed Annexation Plan consistent with the requirements of Section 4-415 of the Local Government Article, of the Annotated Code of Maryland has been prepared and submitted to the Town and made available for public review and discussion; a copy of the Annexation Plan has been provided to the Prince George's County Council and the County Executive, the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission, and the Maryland Department of State Planning at least thirty (30) days prior to the date of the public hearing to be conducted on this Resolution by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Upper Marlboro; and

WHEREAS, all requirements of the Laws of the State of Maryland, Prince George's County and the Charter and laws of The Town of Upper Marlboro regarding initiation of this annexation by the Town's legislative body have been satisfied, and the Town Board of Commissioners has determined that it is desirable to initiate by resolution the annexation process for the benefit of the Town.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWN OF UPPER MARLBORO the following:

Section 1. Modification of Town Boundaries. The municipal boundaries of The Town of Upper Marlboro, Maryland shall be and are hereby amended to incorporate into The Town of Upper Marlboro the Annexation Property, as described in the metes and bounds legal description of parcels of land referenced herein below as the First Annexation, and the Annexation Property is more further described or depicted on a map exhibit entitled "Map of the First Annexation of the Town of Upper Marlboro, Prince George's County, Maryland, 1" = 300', June 2019" prepared by Charles P. Johnson and Associates, Inc., and certified by Steven William Jones, Professional Land Surveyor, which is attached hereto as Exhibit A, and the Annexation Property is further shown on Prince George's County Tax Map 102, Parcel 32 (Account No. 0238873), & Tax Map 102, Parcel 115 (Account No. 3733714); & Tax Map 101, Parcel 245 (Account No. 0229864); & Tax Map 101, Parcel 60 (Account No. 0192286). The annexation plat or map shall be subject to technical review and correction by the Town, or its designee, prior to the public hearing to be held on this Resolution.

Section 2. Amendment of Town Charter. Pursuant to the authority of Article XI-E of the Constitution of Maryland and the Local Government Article (Division II) of the Maryland Code, the Charter of the Town of Upper Marlboro (as published in the *Public Local Laws of Maryland – Compilation of Municipal Charters*) be and the same is hereby amended in Section 82-2 of said Charter by amending said Section to read as follows (changes underlined and/or in italics but not bold font) by adding the following subsection containing the metes and bounds description of the Annexation Property:

Corporate Limits

Section 82-2. The corporate limits of the Town shall be as follows:

- (a) <u>Original Boundaries</u>. Commencing at the mouth of the Federal Spring Branch at its confluence with the Western Branch and running down with the meanders of the Western Branch on the south side thereof, and exclusive of said branch, to the stream beyond James B. Belt's meadow; then up and with said stream to the small bridge culvert on the road from Upper Marlboro to Rosaryville, back of the former residence of A. S. Brooke; then in an air or direct line across the land of Frederick Sasscer to the Federal Spring Branch at a point which will throw into the corporation all the land formerly purchased by Thomas E. Williams and C. C. Magruder, Jr., of the trustees of D. Benedict J. Gardiner; then down and with the meanders of said Federal Spring Branch on the south side thereof, and exclusive of said branch to its mouth, the beginning point aforesaid.
- (b) <u>First Annexation</u>. The boundaries of Upper Marlboro are hereby extended to include the following parcel or area of land:
- (1) Beginning for the same at a point on the Northerly side of the Western Branch of the Patuxent River, said point also being on the Westerly Right-of-Way line of Water Street (30' wide), thence leaving the aforesaid Westerly Right-of-Way line of Water Street, and running with and binding on the aforesaid Northerly side of the Western Branch of the Patuxent River, which line is also the present southern boundary line of the Town of Upper Marlboro, the following course and distance

Section 3. Application of Town Charter and Ordinances. Upon the effective date of this Resolution, the provisions of the Charter, and ordinances of The Town of Upper Marlboro, and any local public laws enacted or to be enacted affecting The Town of Upper Marlboro, shall be effective within the Annexation Property except to the extent that federal or state law, this Resolution, an Annexation Agreement or the Annexation Plan provides otherwise.

- Section 4. Zoning Classification. The Annexation Property is governed under the land use jurisdiction of the District Council of Prince George's County and the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission ("M-NCPPC"). The Annexation Property is currently zoned R-O-S or Reserved Open Space, RA or Residential-Agricultural, RR or Rural Residential and C-S-C or Commercial Shopping Center on certain portions of the subject parcels pursuant to the County Zoning Ordinance.
- Section 5. Annexation Plan. The Town has prepared an Annexation Plan with regard to the Annexation Property. The Annexation Plan is attached hereto as Exhibit B, but is not part hereof and the Town reserves the right to amend the Annexation Plan prior to final adoption of this Resolution in a manner consistent with Local Government ("LG") Article, Section 4-415 of the Maryland Code. The Annexation Plan may not be construed in any way as an amendment to this Resolution. A copy of the Annexation Plan has been provided to the Prince George's County Council and the County Executive, M-NCPPC, and also to the Maryland Department of

State Planning ("MDP") at least thirty (30) days prior to the date of the public hearing conducted by the Board of Commissioners on this Resolution.

Section 6. Public Hearing and Public Notice. A public hearing, as required by the provisions of LG Article, Section 4-406 of the Maryland Code, shall be held by the Town at a time to be determined by the Board of Commissioners, and duly advertised according to the provisions of that statute. Public notice of the proposed public hearing shall be given at least four (4) times, at no less than weekly intervals, in a newspaper of general circulation in Upper Marlboro, Maryland, the last day of which public notice shall precede the public hearing by at least fifteen (15) days, all in accordance with the provisions of Section 4-406, LG Article of the Maryland Code. Upon the first publication of the public notice a copy thereof, including exhibits, shall be provided to:

- (a) the Prince George's County Council, and the County Executive,
- (b) the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission (c/o the Prince George's County Planning Department), and
- (c) The Prince George's County Planning Board

Section 7. Registration of Boundaries. Within ten (10) days of the effective date of this Resolution, in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Article, Sections 4-414 and 4-308 of the Maryland Code, the President/Mayor, or her designee, shall promptly forward a copy of this Resolution with the new municipal boundaries to the Town Clerk, the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Prince George's County, Maryland, the M-NCPPC, and to the Maryland Department of Legislative Services. Each such official or agency shall hold this Resolution with the new municipal boundaries on record and available for public inspection.

Section 8. Effective Date. This Resolution shall be deemed "finally enacted" on the date on which the Commissioners indicate their approval of the Resolution by affixing their signatures hereto. This Resolution shall become effective forty-five (45) days after final enactment, unless it is subject to a petition for referendum by at least 20% of the qualified voters of the municipality, whereas should said petition come to pass and be verified to be in compliance with law, the President/Mayor shall suspend this Resolution by proclamation pending the results of the referendum.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Upper Marlboro, that the corporate boundaries of the Town of Upper Marlboro be, and they hereby are, enlarged and extended by including therein the Annexation Area referred to and described in this Resolution and in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

FOR THE ANNEXATION OF CERTAIN TAX EXEMPT AND OTHER PUBLICALLY-OWNED PROPERTIES LOCATED EAST AND SOUTH OF THE PRESENT CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF UPPER MARLBORO (TAX MAP 102, PARCEL 32, [NORTH AND SOUTH OF PENNSYLVANIA AVENUE/STEPHANIE ROPER HIGHWAY (MD 4)] & TAX MAP 102, PARCEL 115; & TAX MAP 101, PARCEL 245; & TAX MAP 101, PARCEL 60 INTO THE TOWN OF UPPER MARLBORO (THE FIRST ANNEXATION))

June 10, 2019

WHEREAS, The Board of Commissioners of The Town of Upper Marlboro (The "Town") has initiated a Resolution (Annexation Resolution 01-2019) proposing to annex certain property contiguous and adjoining to the boundary of the Town, including the following: two (2) segments of State Highways (rights-of-way of MD 4 & MD 717) and approximately five (5) parcels (including portions of parcels already located within the Town's corporate limits) of land consisting of an annexation area of 189.08 acres of land, more or less, located in the 3rd Assessment District of Prince George's County, and located generally south and east of the present corporate limits of the Town of Upper Marlboro, including lands situated South of Marlboro Pike (MD 725) bounded by or straddling Marlboro Race Track Road (private road), the western basin of Depot Pond located within Parcel 32 and West of the CSX Transportation railroad right-of-way, Parcel 115, a portion of Parcel 60, a portion of Parcel 245, a segment of Pennsylvania Avenue/Stephanie Roper Highway (MD 4) bisecting Parcel 32, and a segment of Water Street (MD 717) into the corporate territory of the Town of Upper Marlboro as more fully described in Annexation Resolution 01-2019; and

WHEREAS, said Annexation Resolution was initiated by the Board of Commissioners pursuant to §4-403 of the LG Art., of Md. Ann. Code; and

WHEREAS, the Annexation Property currently has no residential dwellings, and no residential occupants residing upon the premises or parcels owned and maintained by governmental owners named herein; therefore, the Board of Commissioners finds that there are no qualified voters residing in the Annexation Property; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners further finds that all of the parcels, ways or lands of the Annexation Property are owned by tax exempt entities including the State of Maryland, Prince George County, and the Prince George's Soil Conservation District; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners further finds that this annexation plan is consistent with any applicable municipal growth element of any comprehensive or related plan of the municipality; and

WHEREAS, on the 10th day of June 2019, the Board of Commissioners of The Town of Upper Marlboro introduced a resolution proposing the aforementioned municipal annexation initiated by the Town.

A. Introduction

This Annexation Plan has been prepared by the Town pursuant to Section 4-415 of the Local Government Article, of the Annotated Code of Maryland.

B. Land Use and Zoning Pattern for the Annexation Property

- (1) The Annexation Property is located approximately along the Southern and Eastern boundaries of the Town's current corporate limits. The area to be annexed (the "Annexation Property") is described in the metes and bounds legal description of Annexation Resolution 01-2019, Section 2 as a parcel or parcels of land referenced therein as the First Annexation, and the Annexation Property is more further described or depicted on a map exhibit entitled "Map of the First Annexation of the Town of Upper Marlboro, Prince George's County, Maryland, 1" = 300', June 2019" prepared by Charles P. Johnson and Associates, Inc., which is attached hereto as Exhibit 1, and the Annexation Property is further shown on the Prince George's County TAX MAP (Tax Map 102, Parcel 32 (Account No. 0238873), & Tax Map 102, Parcel 115 (Account No. 3733714); & Tax Map 101, Parcel 60 (Account No. 0192286).
- (2) The Annexation Property is currently zoned R-O-S or Reserved Open Space, RA or Residential-Agricultural, RR or Rural Residential and C-S-C or Commercial Shopping Center on certain portions of the subject parcels pursuant to the County Zoning Ordinance. Upon annexation into the Town, the Annexation Property will likely remain as currently classified under the County Zoning Ordinance.

C. Availability of Land for Public Facilities

There are no existing or pending agreements between the Town and the land owners (i.e., the Prince George's County Government, the State of Maryland and the Prince George's Soil Conservation District) concerning dedication of portions of the Annexation Property for public facilities. Land use, zoning, subdivision, building construction and storm water regulations are generally administered by the County, the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission (the "WSSC"), or the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission unless preempted by federal law. All necessary infrastructure and improvements, including road access, sidewalks, storm water management systems, water and sewer systems and/or extensions and utility delivery systems, and all other facilities necessary to service the Annexation Property shall be installed in accordance with sound engineering principles, and shall be subject to location, design and construction approvals and/or Mandatory Referrals reviewed by Prince George's County, WSSC or the County Planning Board.

D. Public Water and Sewer

Public water and sewer service is or will be supplied by the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission for the Annexation Property. The sewer basin is basin ID: 14, basin name: Western Branch. The current water and sewer categories are as follows: sewer category, sewer code: S-3, sewer description code: Community System and the Sewer Envelope Availability: Planned or Existing Community System. The water category is water code: W-3, water description code: Community

System. According to the County's 2008 Water and Sewer Plan, Category 3 - Community System means the property is or will be served by public water and sewer.

E. Other Municipal or Related Services

- (1) <u>Police Service</u>. The Annexation Property is served by the Maryland-National Capital Park Police and the Prince George's County Police Department, and also, as permitted by law, may be further served by the Upper Marlboro Police Department on a limited basis for purposes of police protection. Certain services may also be provided by the Prince George's County Police Department pursuant to a Memorandum of Understanding or Mutual Aid Agreement regarding jurisdictional police services entered into between the Town and the County governments. Such services may commence after annexation, using existing personnel and equipment, at the same or similar level of service now being provided to the Town in areas where police protective services are provided on a concurrent basis with another police agency.
- (2) <u>Emergency Service</u>. The Marlboro Volunteer Fire Department, Station #1 presently provides fire protection and emergency medical services to the Annexation Property. Such services will continue after annexation, using existing personnel and equipment, at the same or similar level of service now being provided.
- (3) <u>Street Maintenance</u>. The Annexation Property contains no streets or highways under the jurisdiction of the Town of Upper Marlboro. Any existing public streets or roadways will continue to be maintained for public or private use by the County, the State of Maryland or other public entities into the foreseeable future.
- (4) <u>Refuse Collection</u>. The Town presently offers only residential trash collection. There is no residential development within the Annexation Area and presently there are no municipal trash collection services proposed for the Annexation Area.
- (5) <u>Code Enforcement.</u> Since the land to be annexed is owned and operated by governmental entities, such land is generally exempt from the enforcement of municipal building, livability and safety codes and ordinances.

F. Financing Services

Financing for any municipal services extended to the Annexation Property will be provided through the general fund as currently provided to the Town. The largest source of tax revenues collected by the Town is attributable to the municipal property tax which is levied only against taxable property of which no portion of the Annexation Property contains such taxable property; however, the Town may fund certain extended services by way of intergovernmental grants, fees, payments in lieu of taxes and/or pursuant to memoranda of understanding.

STANDARDS OF ISSUANCE

The Board of Town Commissioners shall issue a permit as provided for hereunder, when, from a consideration of the application and from such other information as may otherwise be obtained, it finds that:

- (1) The conduct of the parade or special event will not substantially interrupt the safe and orderly movement of other traffic contiguous to its route;
- (2) The conduct of the parade or special event will not require the diversion of so great a number of police officers of the Town to properly police the line of movement and the areas contiguous thereto as to prevent normal police protection to the Town;
- (3) The conduct of such parade or special event will not require the diversion of so great a number of ambulances as to prevent normal ambulance service to portions of the Town, other than that to be occupied by the proposed line of march and areas contiguous thereto;
- (4) The concentration of persons, animals and vehicles at assembly points of the parade or special event will not unduly interfere with proper fire and police protection of, or ambulance service to, areas contiguous to such assembly areas;
- (5) The conduct of the parade or special event will not interfere with the movement of firefighting equipment en route to a fire;
- (6) The conduct of the parade or special event is not reasonably likely to cause injury to persons or property, to provoke disorderly conduct or create a disturbance;
- (7) The parade or special event is scheduled to move from its point of origin to its point of termination expeditiously and without unreasonable delays en route;
- (8) The parade or special event is not to be held for the sole purpose of advertising any product, goods or event, and is not designed to be held purely for private profit.
- (9) It is the intent of the Board of Town Commissioners that generally one (1) lane of traffic on any street will be available for travel during the parade or special event and that these parades or special events do not constitute an emergency for purposes of closing the streets, sidewalks, footpaths, and thoroughfares to all pedestrian and vehicular traffic.

- (10) It is the intent of the Board of Town Commissioners not to authorize more than three (3) parades or special events, per month.
- (11) Organizations sponsoring any parade or special event shall agree to provide such traffic control and security as deemed necessary by the Board of Town Commissioners.
- (12) No event shall be held or arrangements made for a Special Event until a permit is received.
- (13) Applicants may need to apply with the Health Department for food vending and prepared meals onsite except for pre-packaged foods.
- (14) Serving of alcohol must be approved by the Board of Commissioners and applicant is required to obtain a permit in accordance to the Prince George's County Board of License Commissioners Liquor License.
- (15) Applicants granted a permit must coordinate all planning and logistics with the Director of Events and Recreation for the Town of Upper Marlboro.

Duties of Permittee:

Permittee hereunder shall comply with all permit directions and conditions and with all applicable laws and ordinances. The parade or special event chairman or other person heading or leading such activity shall carry the parade or special event permit upon his person during the conduct of the parade or special event.

Revocation of Permit.

The Board of Town Commissioners shall have the authority to revoke a permit issued hereunder upon violation of the standards for issuance.

Penalties:

Any person or organization who violates the Ordinance shall be subject to a fine up to \$1,000.00.




