Upper Marlboro Memorial Day Wreath Laying



The Town of Upper Marlboro was honored to assist the Curtis family in placing

a wreath in memory of Private First-Class Bernard E. Curtis, an Upper Marlboro resident who lost his life fighting for his nation during the Vietnam War on July 2. 1966. The wreath was placed at the School House Pond where the family had a bench installed in Bernard's honor last year.

The Town also placed a wreath at the World War 2 memorial at Town Hall which honors the Town residents killed in WW2.

died in the performance of their military duties. The holiday is observed on the last Monday of

May. The holiday was observed on May 30 from 1868 through 1970.

Upper Marlboro Keeps Getting Greener!

The Board of Town Commissioners for the Town of Upper Marlboro has been committed to making Upper Marlboro a sustainable community by going green, saving taxpayer money, and responding to climate change by providing resources, partnerships, and a platform to take climate action. Over the past few months,



the Town has reached several of its milestones to becoming greener and sustainable. In March 2021, the Town was recognized by the Arbor Day Foundation as a "Tree City USA". Here are some other recent milestones the Town has achieved:

Electric Vehicle Purchase:

The Town of Upper Marlboro has purchased its first fully electric vehicle that will be assigned to the Town's code compliance officer who handles property standards issues and assists the Town police with parking enforcement. This newly purchased 2020 Chevy Bolt will replace a 2009 Chevy Impala that has reached the end of its lifespan.

The Town is also working with Pepco and the Maryland Energy Administration (MEA) to install charging stations around downtown Upper Marlboro for residents and visitors to use. There are currently four electric vehicle charging stations at the Show Place Arena; the Town is working to bring additional stations into the downtown area, as well as at the Town Hall.

"The purchase of this electric vehicle is another example of our commitment to protecting and preserving the environment," said Upper Marlboro Mayor Linda Pennoyer. "This will be the Town's first 'green' vehicle, and another great step for the Town's sustainability initiatives.

"Over the next few years, we plan to buy additional electric vehicles for our Police and Public Works departments and the Town Administration fleet," she added. "We will add those energy-efficient vehicles as soon as we are fiscally able to do so."

Mayor Pennoyer said the price tag of the new electric vehicle is being offset by grant from the MEA's Maryland Smart Energies Community Grant program.

Town Hall Solar Panels



In June 2021, the Town completed another green infrastructure project: the installation

of solar panels on the roof of the Town Hall on School Lane. These panels generate electricity to help offset the building's energy consumption. The panels were purchased through a grant partnership with the Maryland Energy Administration's Smart Energies Community Program.

Seeking Resident Input! Town Charter Amendment

The Board of Town Commissioners for the Town of Upper Marlboro have begun the process to amend the elections section of the Town Charter in order to optimize voter turnout & participation, and to expand the number of elected officials to better represent the Town.

Primary Proposed Changes Include:

- Increasing the number of elected officials from 3 to 5
- Moving the Town Election Date from January to November
- Increasing minimum required polling hours from 4hrs to 12hrs (planned)

NOTICE is hereby given by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Upper Marlboro, Maryland propose Charter Amendment Resolution 02-2021: Amending the Charter of the Town of Upper Marlboro by increasing the membership of the board of commissioners from three to five; by changing the general election from the first Monday in January in even numbered years to the first Tuesday in November in odd numbered years; by authorizing up to five supervisors of elections to be appointed in September prior to a general election; by removing language mandating the purging of voters who have failed to vote in three successive general elections from the list of qualified voters; by clarifying the requirement to file both a statement of candidacy and a nominating petition to run for municipal office; by striking as antiquated or surplusage a provision regarding women's suffrage; and making certain stylistic, grammatical and non-substantive changes thereto.

A Resolution of the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Upper Marlboro, Maryland adopted pursuant to the authority of Article XI-E, § 4 of the Constitution of the State of Maryland and Title 4, Subtitle 3 of the Local Government Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, to amend the Charter of the Town of Upper Marlboro, to amend Sections 82-3 (Number, Selection, Term), 82-6 (Meetings of the Board), 82-20 (Board of Supervisors of Elections), 82-24 (Registration), 82-26 (Candidates), 82-27 (Election of Board of Commissioners), 82-28 (Conduct of Elections), 82-30 (Vote Count), 82-33 (Women), and to make other stylistic, grammatical and non-substantive changes thereto.

Charter Amendment Resolution 02-2021 shall take effect and shall become and be considered the Charter of the Town of Upper Marlboro, upon the fiftieth day after being so ordained or passed unless on or before the fortieth day after being so adopted and passed a referendum petition meeting the requirements of State law shall be presented to the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Upper Marlboro, Maryland or mailed to it by certified mail, return receipt requested, bearing a postmark from the United States Postal Service.

MAKING A DIFFERENCE

Community service, public involvement and family have always been the main tenets of the Marlboro Boys and Girls Club (MBGC). Upper Marlboro Scoop the Poop Initiative

Dog waste is more than a nightmare for our shoes. Just like human sewage, untreated pet fecal matter is harmful to waterways. Rain washes dog waste and the associated disease-causing organisms -- such as giardia and salmonella -- into rivers, beaches, and bays via storm drains. Enough bacteria make water unsafe for drinking and swimming, and also contribute to shellfish bed closures. Pet waste left anywhere is a potential public health risk. Pet waste on playing fields, sidewalks, or parks can be unhealthy and messy. Even at home, responsible pet owners should throw pet waste in the trash or flush it down the toilet to prevent water pollution associated with bacteria-laden waste. Less dog waste in the watershed means a happier and healthier community for all.



The management of pet waste is an important issue for the people and environment

of Prince George's County and the Town of Upper Marlboro.

Human Health: Pet waste contains disease-causing organisms that can be transmitted to people, pets, and wildlife. Fecal coliform, bacteria, salmonella, roundworms, and giardia can remain in your yard for weeks and months if not cleaned up.

Quality of life and civic pride- Areas left messy with pet waste are unattractive and degrade the quality of life for residents. Pet waste discourages people from coming to local shopping districts and visitors from enjoying local parks and can contribute to lowering property values.

Water Quality: Pet waste left on the ground also mixes with stormwater runoff and the contaminants are carried to nearby waterways, like the Western Branch or Patuxent River, where we swim, fish, and play.

The Town of Upper Marlboro has 16 dog-waste stations strategically installed around Town, with five provided through a partnership with the Prince George's County. These stations have disposable pet waste bags and trash cans that are maintained by the Town's Public Works crews.



SUMMER SAFETY TIPS



Vehicle Safety

Car thieves often drive through parking lots and try door handles to see if the car is unlocked. Always lock your doors and roll up the windows when you leave your vehicle. Thieves are looking for easy access and to take items left inside. You should always store your belongings in the trunk and out of clear view to avoid tempting criminals.

Home Security

Do not forget to lock doors and windows. When outside doing yardwork, close the garage door to prevent thieves from stealing items. In general, the garage is regularly used by criminals to gain access to a home quickly and run off without ever being noticed.

Heat Warnings

Drink plenty of water and stay out of the heat during peak temperature hours. Elderly individuals are especially susceptible to high heat and humidity, make it a point to check on your neighbors during the summer months.

Hot Car Warnings

DO NOT leave children or pets inside of a vehicle alone. During the summer months, temperatures inside of a car can rise into the triple digits in just a matter of minutes.





Phone Scams



If you receive a call from a credit card company about potential fraud on your account, hang up and call the number printed on the back of your card. The Internal Revenue Service and Social Security Administration do not call and ask for personal information over the phone.

Car security: How to stop car break-ins before they happen

- 1. Keep your car doors locked and windows closed.
- 2. Secure your car keys.
- 3. Park your car in secure areas.
- 4. Remove valuables from the car.
- 5. Protect your car's wheels.
- 6. Activate your car alarm.
- 7. Install safety devices.
- 8. Properly insure your vehicle.
