Public Works Corner Preparing Yard Waste for Pickup

It's that time of year again! The Town provides routine yard waste collection for removal of leaves, branches, and other yard waste that you are unable to compost. Residents must use a paper lawn bag or another type of reusable container to place yard waste out for collection, yard waste in



plastic bags will not be accepted. Below are some additional guidelines for disposing of yard waste:

- Do not mix yard debris with other bulk trash items
- Cut branches and twigs into lengths of 4' or less
- Branches and brush must be tied into bundles (tie with twine, or metal tie wires) or placed inside a container that can easily be emptied (containers must not weigh more than 80 pounds each). Bundles of branches cannot exceed 2' in diameter.
- Branches must be less than 3" in diameter (larger branches and tree trunks must be collected as bulky trash)

Yard Waste is collected on Mondays and Thursdays within the Town.



Reminder: Your Recycling will **NOT** be picked up if there are plastic bags in it. They jam the sorting machines at the County Facility. *Thank You!*

Slow Down, Move Over

As you may know, Maryland has a "Move Over" law. When an authorized emergency or maintenance vehicle is pulled over, all drivers must move to another lane and/or slow down as we carefully pass.



Unfortunately, the State is still experiencing deadly conditions on the side of the roads for those working to keep Marylanders moving safely and our roads clean. Crews are out there every day helping motorists, and they are getting hit.

When you see our Public Works crews parked along the side of the road for maitenace or litter pick-up, please reduce speed, stay alert, and pass safely.

Vultures



Vultures are used to living near people and eating any food that is left out. They also enjoy hanging out in large backyards. If you want these

uninvited guests to leave your area, make sure you are not leaving out food and that all trash containers have a lid. If there is a dead animal in the public road in Town call Town Hall at 301-627-6905. We will work with the appropriate agencies to have it removed. If our local flock is still hanging out in your backyard Maryland DNR suggests harassment and air horns, laser pointers, throwing tennis balls at them, and other disruptive and loud activities.

To address conflicts with black vultures, the Maryland Department of Natural Resources (DNR), the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and the U.S. Department of Agriculture Wildlife Services actively cooperate to identify and implement workable solutions for vulture predation on newborn and adult livestock. Non-lethal solutions do not require a permit, but lethal solutions require a federal Migratory Bird Depredation Permit. Maryland DNR continues to work with these federal agencies to learn about scientifically based solutions to resolve conflicts with black vultures, including pilot projects underway in the United States. For assistance in Maryland, call toll-free **1-877-463-6497.** U.S. Department Agriculture Wildlife Services operators are available from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, except state holidays.

Town of Upper Marlboro Reaps Fiscal Benefits from 2022 Maryland General Assembly Session

The Town of Upper Marlboro was among the top beneficiaries of the recently completed Maryland General Assembly session, Mayor Sarah Franklin said today. Thanks to the efforts of several members of the Prince George's County delegation, the Town was successful in securing \$275,000 in the capital budget, as well as another \$192,000 in the operating budget, for the Upper Marlboro Community Playground and Splash Pad project.

Franklin said the \$275,000 was included in the capital budget as a Legislative Bond Initiative that was sponsored by Senator Ronald L. Watson (District 23) and supported by Delegates Marvin E. Holmes, Jr. (District 23B) and Delegate Cheryl Summers Landis (also District 23B).

Additionally, the \$192,000 included in the operating budget was part of the \$5,000,000 Maryland Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Community Parks & Playgrounds Program. Upper Marlboro was one of only 39 projects statewide that received funding this year. "We are extremely grateful to Senator Watson for working so hard to secure this funding for the Town of Upper Marlboro," said Mayor Franklin, who met personally with Senator Watson in Annapolis during the legislative session to discuss the need for the additional resources. "The community playground and splash pad is an exciting project for Upper Marlboro. It will be a place that builds and benefits our community for decades to come."

Senator Watson was among the elected officials who attended a groundbreaking ceremony for the playground and splash pad project last October 30."I was proud to personally participate in the groundbreaking for this exciting project last October," Senator Watson said. "We worked hard during the 90-day legislative session to make sure the funding for this community playground stayed in the final Fiscal Year 2023 budget. I promised Mayor Franklin when I met with her during the session that I will come back for the ribbon-cutting ceremony when the project is complete and ready to open. That's going to be an exciting day for the town, and I'm definitely looking forward to cutting that ribbon!"

Phase one of the playground (for ages 5-12) has been completed, with plans for a "soft opening" later this spring. Construction on Phase two (for ages 2-5) and Phase three (splash pad) will be completed this summer. The train-themed playground is being built on a vacant lot adjacent to the Town Hall that was previously the site of the Marlboro station of the Chesapeake Beach Railroad, which ran from DC to the

Chesapeake Beach and resort in Calvert County. This new playground and splash pad will be accessible from the Marlboro Boys & Girls athletic fields off School Lane.

DNR's Community Parks & Playgrounds Program invests in the future of established communities by developing and revitalizing parks and playgrounds statewide. With the support of the governor and Maryland General Assembly, a total of \$79.9 million has been approved so far for 793 parks and playground projects for communities across Maryland since the program's inception.

The Town of Upper Marlboro Façade Improvement Program has a New Name!

The Town of Upper Marlboro is pleased to announce that the Façade Improvement Program (FIP) has expanded to become the Town of Upper Marlboro Building Improvement Program (BIP). This program assists businesses and property owners with improving their commercial buildings.

Since 2015 the Town has managed this grant program funded by the Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development for the Town to partially reimburse property owner and business owners who enhanced their properties. This year, the program has been expanded by increasing eligible improvements to their interior and exterior structure. Some eligible improvements are below:

Interior: Painting. HVAC System, Electrical and Plumbing, Bathroom Installation, Flooring, drywall installation, any permanent equipment.

Exterior: Painting, Awnings and signage, Lighting-exterior, Masonry repair, door and window restoration/replacement, removal of exterior finishes.

Funding Limits:

Property Owner:

Maximum project request: 50% up to \$30,000

Grant match: 50% up to \$30,000

Maximum Building Improvement amount: \$60,000

Business Owner:

Maximum project request: 70% up to \$3,500

Grant match: 30% up to \$1,5000

Maximum Building Improvement amount: \$5,000



A message from the Town of Upper Marlboro Police Department David Burse, Chief of Police



Speed Limit: The maximum speed limit is 25 mph within the Town limits. Please SLOW DOWN and obey speed limits!

Speed & Red-Light Cameras Coming to Upper Marlboro:

The Upper Marlboro Police Department is implementing a Speed & Red-Light camera program within the Town limits starting June 14, 2022. Initial cameras will be placed in the 5400-5600 Blk of Old Crain Highway and the 14100-14400 Blk of Old Marlboro Pike (MD 725), Southbound Largo Rd (MD 202) at Main St., Eastbound Main St. at Largo Rd (MD 202), Westbound Main St. at Largo Rd (MD 202), Northbound Rt. 301 at Marlboro Pike and Southbound Rt. 301 at Marlboro Pike. The 30-day warning period for the camera program starts on May 13, 2022, and ends on June 13, 2022. On June 14, 2022, violators will be issued citations.



Upper Marlboro Police Officers will also be conducting traffic safety enforcement on other roadways around Town.



Hot Car Warnings

DO NOT leave children or pets inside of a vehicle alone. During the summer months, temperatures inside of a car can rise into the triple digits in just a matter of minutes.

Vehicle Safety - Lock Your Vehicles at Night!

Car thieves often drive through parking lots and try door handles to see if the doors are unlocked. Always lock your doors and roll up the windows when you leave your car. Thieves are looking for an unlocked vehicle that they can get into quickly and take items that were left inside. You should always store items in the trunk, so that a criminal does not see them and attempt to break in.

On any day at any time, life threatening emergencies can occur quickly and emergency responders aren't always nearby. By taking prompt and simple actions, you may be able to save a life. You Are the Help Until Help Arrives!



"According to a recent National Academies of Science study, trauma is the leading cause of death for Americans under age 46. Life-threatening injuries require immediate action to prevent an injured person from dying. Those nearest to someone with life-threatening injuries are best positioned to provide first care" (Ready.gov, n.d.).

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security provides a free web-based training program that will teach you these five simple steps that may save a life:

- Call 9-1-1
- Stay Safe
- Stop the Bleeding
- Position the Injured
- Provide Comfort


