Tentative Agenda Items for June 7th Town Meeting

❑ Ordinance 2011–01; Operating Budget for Fiscal Year 2012

No changes are anticipated in the \$854,866 FY2012 budget that was introduced at the May Town Meeting. Total operational expenses are \$765,286, while operational revenue is estimated to be \$765,211. Capital improvements and repairs are budgeted for \$89,600 funded from designated funds and a \$74,475 transfer from unrestricted reserve funds.

❑ Resolution 2011–04; Approving and Accepting Amendment to Local Government Insurance Trust

The Local Government Insurance Trust (LGIT) was set up in 1987 to provide liability insurance for local governments and the Town has been a

member since 2004. The LGIT Board of Trustees is seeking approval to reduce the number of trustee's from 13 to 12. This Resolution sets out the Town's approval of the change.

❑ National Register of Historic Places

The Town has posted on its website the final draft of the National Park Service registration form with supporting documentation. Letters have been sent to property owners within the proposed 83.5 acre registration area located in the western residential area of the Town. The Board is planning to vote on whether to support this area for registration on the National Register of Historic Places.

❑ Discussion of Future Town Legislation

2011 Memorial Day Service

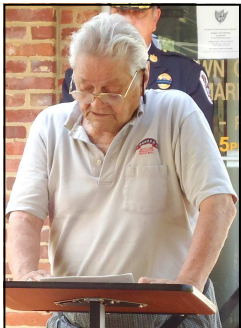
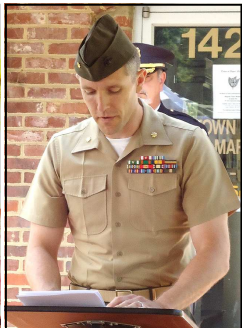

New Public Safety Non-emergency Number

With the move of the County's emergency dispatch facility to Bowie, the County has changed the non-emergency public safety number to **301-352-1200**. Use this number to report non-urgent matters that require the dispatch of police, fire, EMS, or sheriff personnel. In case of an emergency, please call 911. The old non-emergency number will be maintained for an unspecified period of time. The Town police are dispatched through the County dispatch system.

The police need the eyes and ears of citizens. If you see or hear something that is suspicious, please give the non-emergency number a call so that our officers can check it out. Public safety is a community responsibility.

Town's 2010 Census of Population and Housing Available

The US Census Bureau is starting to make available data from the 2010 census. "The Profile of General Population and Housing Characteristics: 2010" for the Town is available online at: <http://factfinder2.census.gov/>.

We will be posting on the Town's website instructions on how to access the Town's data since it is somewhat complicated. The Town's population is listed at 631 with 299 males and 332 females. Total housing units are 310 with 290 occupied. Owner occupied housing units is 231 with 59 rental housing units occupied. The Census Bureau will releasing additional data in stages through 2013.
