



ffective January 1, 2014 our Residential Curbside Yard Waste Collection will change. YARD WASTE WILL NO LONGER **BE ACCEPTED IN PLASTIC BAGS.** Residents will need to place loose yard waste in large bio-degradable **PAPER** yard waste bags. These bags are available at local home improvement stores, garden centers and grocery stores. Bags of grass and leaves should **not exceed 35 pounds**. Larger yard waste such as tree branches and sticks should be bundled & tied into 4 foot lengths and also should not exceed 35 lbs.

# The Scoop On Snow

The Town is asking for your cooperation by not parking on the street when it snows. If you don't have the room to park your vehicle off-street, please park it on the <u>even-numbered</u> side of the street. Once you've seen that we have cleared the odd-numbered side of the street, then try to re-park your vehicle across the street, this will help us clear both sides of the street as soon as possible.

When shoveling out your vehicle, driveway or side walk, it is important <u>not</u> to put snow into the street. Please keep it on your property, this will ensure proper snow removal, plus maximize street safety. If you or someone you know in Town has special circumstances, such as: senior care, medical or life support



equipment, please let us know so that we can be of better assistance in the event of bad weather.
