Sustainable Community Update

As most of you already know, the Town's application to become a Sustainable Community was accepted by the State several months ago. The application sets out a "Smart Growth" plan at the Town level. What can we do to reduce our impact on the environment, promote economic growth, and provide a better community?

The Sustainable Work Group has met five times to date. These meetings are announced on the Town's website, are open to the public, and we welcome input from you. So far, we have applied to the Washington Area Council of Governments for a study on the ways we can make the Town more walkable, bike friendly and increase our public transportation options. We are currently working on a grant to obtain cost sharing funds for the downtown businesses to improve their facades. We are also in discussions with the State Highway Administration (SHA) concerning upgrading the sidewalks along Main and Water Streets downtown to make them compliant with ADA requirements. The SHA is estimating that repairs, of the earthquake damage to the Crain Monument, will start within the next 18 months.

The requested study on the condition and potential adaptive reuse of the Old Marlboro High School on Elm Street is now under contract. The long delayed addition to Town Hall is beginning to see some light. We will be reviewing the Architectural firms qualification documents submitted in response to our request to select a qualified firm. We are also looking into reestablishing water and perhaps adding sewer service to the Public Works Facility.
