The Town's Historical Committee also presented a preview of this year's Marlborough Day Festival and the MD House & Garden Pilgrimage. Delegate Marvin E. Holmes, Jr. (pictured right) and County Executive Municipal Liaison, Dr. Beatrice Tignor were also present.





On the Agenda—Next Town Meeting

he following items are on the proposed agenda for the Board of Commissioner's monthly Town Meeting on Tuesday, May 13 at Town Hall, starting at 7:30 pm. Please note that June's Town Meeting will be held earlier than usual on June 3 due to schedule conflicts.

A proposed budget of \$977,457 for Fiscal Year 2015 (FY2015) will be introduced. This budget represents a 6.3% increase over the FY2014 budget. Operational revenues are estimated to raise 4% while operational expenses to raise 1.9%. Budgeted capital programs will increase 21.6% while the draw from the reserve fund will increase 16%. Major capital expenditures are the addition to Town Hall, new pickup truck and improvements to the Town's public works facility.

The Town received an unexpected \$2,800 grant from Anacostia Trails Heritage Area, Inc. (ATHA/Maryland Milestones) to help fund some of the Marlborough Day 1812-related activities. In order to properly account for this increase in funds, the Board, by Ordinance, will be amending the FY2014 budget.

The President will ask the Board to shift certain line item funds within the FY2014 Detailed Budget. There are two major shifts. The first will allow us to retire two computers running the Windows XP operating software that has now become a security risk. The second, is to update our website to increase security and add social media capability. We will also be adding the ability for readers to be e-mailed the monthly *Landings* newsletter to help save man-hours and resources for the Town.
