#### President's Proposed Agenda for April 13 Town Hall Meeting

There are two main items on the agenda: First, we will have a presentation of conceptual drawings for the Town Hall Renovation and New Addition Project, followed by continued discussion of the Fiscal Year 2016 Budget that starts July 1.

We have had several meetings with the Abraham/Petro Design team to discuss the specifications for the Town Hall project. Cost compared to our current and estimated needs took the most time to balance. The Abraham/Petro design team has responded very well to the

unique needs of the Town and we are very pleased with the design. After the presentation, the floor will be open for public discussion.

Following the presentation, we will be discussing the FY16 Budget drafting progress. And, as usual, there will be reports and updates on various items of interest.

Regular monthly Town Meetings are typically on the second Tuesday of each month. This meeting had to be rescheduled for a Monday evening due to work schedule conflicts.


The TUMHC is always looking for new members and volunteers to help out with events, research and archiving our Town's rich history.
