lection Day in the Town is **Monday**, **January 4**, **2016**. Voting takes place at Town Hall from 1:00–8:00 p.m., using hand-counted paper ballots. Three (3) resident candidates are elected as Commissioners for two-year terms. The newly elected Board selects one of the three to be the President of the

Board (who acts as "Mayor" and Chief Executive Officer), and a Treasurer is also sworn-in. There are some new names listed on the ballot this time, and there are also blank spaces provided for write-in votes. You may only vote for up to three (3) candidates in total. The deadline to register as a candidate is Monday, December 14, 2015 by C.O.B.

The Town is facing several issues that will require a good working relationship with other political entities. We have been working hard to have a "seat at the table" with various County and State agencies, and a strong showing of citizens from the Town at the polls will certainly make a difference!

Please set out all trash/recycling/bulk trash & yard waste by 7:00 a.m. to ensure pickup. Please clearly separate the Residential trash from the Yard Waste and Bulk items—if co-mingled the items will not be picked up!

Town Flat Bed Truck Usage:

The Public Works Department offers the use of the Flatbed Truck at no charge to residents with bulk items too numerous for regular yard waste or bulk trash pick-up. The truck is parked in the homeowners driveway on Friday afternoon and picked back up on Monday morning. Call the Town Office for additional information.

Debris created as a result of contracted work may not be disposed of using Town services.

How to Dispose of Plastic Bags:

While plastic bags are no longer accepted in household recycling, residents can bring their plastic bags to these locations:

Safeway (at Osborne Road): 7605 Crain Hwy Upper Marlboro, MD 20772

Food Lion (Marlboro Square): 9500 Se Crain Hwy
Upper Marlboro, MD 20772

Giant Food (Marlboro Crossroads): 5700 Crain Hwy
Upper Marlboro, MD 20772

Follow these guidelines

Please recycle only clean, dry plastic bags, and film. Also be sure to remove receipts or any other items from bags. Acceptable examples include:

- Retail, Newspaper, Dry Cleaning, Bread, Produce, and also other Plastic Bags labeled #2 and #4
- Zip Close Food Storage bags (clean and dry)
- Furniture and Electronic wrap
- Plastic cereal box liners (if it tears like paper do not include)
- Plastic shipping envelopes, including Tyvek ®, bubble wrap and air pillows (Remove labels and/or deflate)
- Product Wrap (used on paper towels, diapers, bathroom tissue, water bottles)
- Any film packaging or bag that has the How2Recycle Label

*Not all items are accepted at all drop-off locations. Check with your local drop-off to see what is accepted



NO Degradable/compostable film or bags, prewashed salad mix bags, or frozen food bags.





Plastic bags are recycled into many different products. Most plastic bags are recycled into composite lumber but can also be reprocessed into small pellets, or post consumer resin, which can become feed stock for a variety of products such as new bags, pallets, containers, crates, and pipe.

You don't have to be a researcher or a historian to join in on the fun!


