The CERT trained individual will be better prepared to respond and cope with the aftermath of a disaster. CERT training will benefit any citizen who participates in the course.



Day and the Town Yard Sale. All this requires volunteers of course, and we simply can't do it without you! We have recently hired additional staffing and will soon be expanding our Town Hall to help support more community involvement and activities.

Ever since the Town earned its "Sustainable Community" designation, grants have been awarded to the Town for a façade improvement program, a pedestrian and bicycle accessibility study, a Main & Water Streets ADA sidewalk retrofit project, and engineering and design services for downtown streetscape improvements that include: crosswalks, signage improvements, parking & parking meter upgrades, benches, bike-racks, planters, etc. An important, yet embarrassing side-note: We are most likely the only municipality in Prince George's County without a flag! Did you know that a key part to revitalization is Town Branding?— We know there are budding artists in Town . . . C'mon, here's your chance!

We are also currently repopulating our mandatory **Sustainable Communities Workgroup**, which is made up of area stockholders such as: residents, businesses, property owners and state and county agencies concerned with parks, planning, zoning, roads and other infrastructure essentials.



ON THE AGENDA

A tour monthly Town Meeting on February 9, 2016 at the Town Hall, the Board will review a proposal for replacement of the garage doors at the Public Works Facility, and, will also put up for consideration a bid offering for surplus Town property. The Board will also deliver an update on the Town Hall Addition & Renovation project.

The Town needs more Town residents and businesses in the Town's Sustainable Communities program. Specifically, the Town needs more residents and businesses to be on our **Sustainable Communities Workgroup** (SCW) which is made up of a cross-section of stakeholders from the community (state, county and local officials + residents, business and property owners). As the Town has just been awarded its second Façade



destrian accessibility issues connected with sidewalks, trails, bike lanes, buses, etc.

There has been an increase in interest from our businesses in the FIP project, and we encourage interested businesses to get on board soon. We have been very lucky to have talented staff from the Planning Department Division of the M-NCPPC helping us with administering the projects so far, but the Town will soon need someone who can oversee the management of these various projects to successful fruition. The SCW will resume monthly meetings as soon as possible. The meetings will be advertised and open to the public.
