ON THE AGENDA

ur regular monthly Town meeting will be held at the Town Hall on Tuesday, July 12th at 7:30 p.m. The main item on the agenda is the adoption of Ordinance 2016-02: Traffic & Parking, which was introduced at the June Town Meeting and published on the Town website and through social media.

We will also be introducing and voting on two traffic-related resolutions: Resolution 2016-04: Parking Meter Rates, and, Resolution 2016-07: No Parking Zone/ Marlborough Drive".
