

ON THE AGENDA

Our regular monthly Town meeting will be held at the Town Hall on Tuesday, June 7th at 7:30 p.m. The main item on the agenda is the adoption of the Town Operating Budget for FY2017 (which is July 1—June 30, 2016.)

We will also be introducing a Traffic Ordinance “rewrite” to address now antiquated language in our old Traffic Ordinance 76-1 that defines parking and no parking zones in the Town. This ambitious compilation of 18 existing Town Ordinances will be more accessible and understandable to the general public and will allow the Board authority to adjust meter rates and traffic fines by Resolution.

As usual, there will be open discussion of general and administrative issues and time is allotted for public comment at the end of the agenda.

Bring your Cat, Dog and Ferret To the Spring 2016 RABIES VACCINATION CLINICS

State Law requires that all cats, dogs and ferrets be vaccinated against rabies by four (4) months of age, and be kept current.

The best thing you can do to protect yourself, your family and community from rabies is to vaccinate your cats, dogs and ferrets against this fatal disease.



- Only cats, dogs and ferrets over three (3) months old will be vaccinated.
- A responsible adult must bring the pet.
- You must bring proof of prior rabies vaccination.
- Secure all animals: Dogs on a leash, cats and ferrets in a carrier box.
- There will be a \$10.00 fee per vaccination. **BRING EXACT CHANGE!**

Citizens 65 years of age and older (proof of age required) may obtain two free pet licenses per year provided their animal(s) is spayed/neutered and is up-to-date on rabies vaccination(s)

Bag Your Bags — New Regulations —

Our recycling service will no longer be accepting plastic bags because they damage recycling equipment. We are urging citizens to utilize the collection bins located at retail stores such as Lowe's, Walmart, Target, Giant & Safeway. Not only can residents recycle their grocery bags, but also, can include additional PE film packages such as: Bread bags; Produce bags; Dry Cleaning bags; Newspaper bags, as well as, Product Overwraps around diapers; Paper Towels; and Bathroom Tissue. High Grass & Litter Regulations

Per Town Ordinance 88-1:

Grasses and weeds may not exceed ten (10) inches at any time.

Litter is prohibited from accumulating on any property within Town. It is the responsibility of the property owner to clean it up.



Residents are asked to keep their properties (both front and backyards) well maintained and in good appearance throughout the year by:

- Regularly mowing the front & backyards of the property to cut high grass and weeds.
- Removing litter, debris, vehicle parts, construction waste, household items, and junked vehicles from the exterior of the property.
- Removing refuse containers from curb within 12 hours of scheduled pick up, and storing them out of sight from the street.

If a property is found to have high grass or litter, the Town will mail a violation notice to the property. Failure to correct the violation may result in fines.
