# Elm Street's Repaving & New Sidewalk Project Completed!

This project that started showing up on Town Meeting agendas in the Spring of 2015 has finally come to fruition! As we go to publication with this issue of the *Landings*, the final coat of asphalt is starting to cool, with striping and speed-bump installation to be completed on Monday. The road is expected to reopen this coming Tuesday (August 8, 2017).

The Town is thrilled that this important link to achieving a "Walkable Community" will help greatly with pedestrian and vehicular safety alike. Resident and area citizen's complaints about the absence of a proper curb on this segment of Elm Street had been recorded by the Clerk at Town Meetings as far back as September 2008. The curb problem, along with recurring potholes, sightline issues, vehicular near-misses, and overall non-compliance with ADA Standards, had pegged this road as the "next-in-line" for rehabilitation. President Storey contacted the County's Department of Public Works & Transportation in the Spring of 2016 and was able to coordinate the rehab of the lower section of Elm Street that extends past the Post Office to its intersection with Governor Oden Bowie Drive, at the same time (and at no extra cost to the Town).

Our thanks to Project Engineer/Ben Robertson and Construction Mgr./Steve Koczerzuk for their fine work.

### **MOSQUITO SPRAYING**

esting and spraying of our area commenced on June 5th, and will run through September 19, 2017. Typically, the spraying occurs around dusk on Monday evenings, but, due to variable weather conditions, we cannot guarantee that this service will be performed in any given week.

### **How Can I Help Control Mosquitos?**

Routinely inspect the outside of your home and yard for places where rain water can collect, such as: gutters, bottles, cans & lids, planters, toys, tarps, old tires and so on. Pet bowls and bird baths should be changed often.



### What If I Don't Want the Spraying?

If you decide that you do not want this service, you must sign a form and there will be no spraying within 300 feet of your residence. The forms are available at Town Hall, or you can download it from the State's website at: http:// mda.maryland.gov/plants-pests/pages/mosquito control.aspx


