A Sustainable Communities work group was established to include a cross-section of stakeholders made up of residents, business and property owners, plus, Municipal, State and County government and planning personnel.

The workgroup works to beautify, re-use and rehabilitate the Town's older and historical structures; beautify the downtown area's streetscape and develop a variety of community projects through the awarding of available grants, loans and tax credits.



Mosquito Spraying— Monday Nights

The Town of Upper Marlboro is famous for many things, one of which (unfortunately) is its terrific amount of mosquitoes. As in years past, the Town has contracted with the State for mosquito control. The primary goal of this program is to prevent the occurrence of mosquitoborne disease in humans, pets and livestock. Apart from their being an annoyance, the Asian Tiger mosquitoes are known carriers of the West Nile and Zika Viruses.



and a principal carrier of dog heartworm. Wear extra protection and repellants.

Testing of our area, and possible spraying, will commence on June 4th, and run through September 18, 2018. Typically, the testing & spraying occurs around dusk on Monday evenings, but, due to variable weather conditions, we cannot guarantee that this service will be performed in any given week.

How Can I Help Control Mosquitos?

The most effective way to drastically reduce the mosquito population is to eliminate those places where they breed. Routinely inspect the outside of your home and yard for places where rain water can collect, such as: gutters, bottles, cans & lids, planters, toys, tarps, old tires and so on. Pet bowls and bird baths should be changed often.

What If I Don't Want Mosquito Spraying?

If you decide that you do not want this service, you must sign a form and there will be no spraying within 300 feet of your residence. The forms are available at Town Hall, or you can download it from the State's website at: http://mda.maryland.gov/ plants-pests/pages/mosquito_control.aspx

Town of Upper Marlboro Code Enforcement:

High Grass/Weeds: It's that time of year again! And the Upper Marlboro Code Enforcement will be issuing courtesy notifications to resident's who's grass/weeds exceed 12 inches in height.

Commercial Property Upkeep:

Town Code Enforcement has been issuing notices to commercial properties who have trash/litter accumulating on their property and their dumpsters. We would like to remind all commercial property & business owners to regularly check their properties for trash/litter to avoid being cited.

Residential Construction Within

Town: Town Code Enforcement is monitoring the status of several County permits to construct singlefamily dwellings, two along Rt. 725 and one on Rectory Lane. The Town has already been in contact with land owners and contractors to ensure they understand to keep their construction sites clean and orderly. There are no set construction commencement dates for these sites.
