# The Scoop...

#### **Leaf Pickup Instruction:**

Leaf pick up is scheduled to begin October 15, weather permitting and run thru November. Please remember the following when utilizing our leaf pickup service:

- Place your leaves at the edge of the street.
- Do not place directly in the street or covering any storm drains/catch basin.
- Place leaves in a long narrow pile that extends across the width of your lot.
- Do not place any material other than leaves in the pile. This includes grass, walnuts, chestnuts, branches and any other type of yard material that may damage the leaf vacuum.
- M-71 residents must call to schedule a pickup.

Leaves may still be taken to the compost lot located on W. Main St. or placed in bags and picked up by the garbage service every other Wednesday. Your patience and understanding during the season is appreciated. Thank you!

#### Sidewalk Tips

Did you know that if the public sidewalk needs to be replaced you are responsible for half the cost? There are a number of inexpensive and easy things you can do to keep sidewalks safe and clean:

Address problems as soon as possible to minimize area and amount of repair required.

Sweep sidewalks to keep them free of leaves, snow, ice, or debris. Be sure to properly dispose of debris. Do not sweep them into the gutter or street.

Trim tree branches, shrubs, and other vegetation so they do not obstruct the sidewalk.

Watch for early signs of leaking water lines, tree roots, and other damages.



Do not park cars or other heavy equipment on your sidewalk. Report hazardous sidewalks by calling 989-288-2300.

#### **Snow and Ice Removal**

Per the Village sidewalk ordinance, if there is a sidewalk on your lot or premises, you must clear the snow or ice from the sidewalk 24 hours after the cessation of any winter weather event. Sidewalks fronting on Main Street zoned B1 between Duane and Church Streets should be cleared of snow or ice by 10 a.m. and be maintained until 5 p.m. Please do not push snow into the roadway.

#### **Parking**

Parking in designated parking spots helps keep our streets clear during snow and ice events to allow the snow plow to clear the streets. Please be sure you are not parking on the roadway. Per our ordinance: No person shall park or leave standing any motor vehicle upon any major street in the Village from December 1 through the following March 31 between the hours of 3:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.

#### **Daylight Savings Time**

Sunday, November 4th daylight savings time ends. Remember to turn your clocks back 1 hour.

#### **Redevelopment Ready Community**

On September 19, 2018 at 7 p.m. in the Village Hall there was a joint meeting between the Village Council, DDA and the Planning Commission.

The primary purpose of the meeting was for the Village Council, Planning Commission and DDA to discuss the Village's status in the Redevelopment Ready Communities (RRC) program and plot a course for moving forward to certification. RRC is a free technical assistance program offered by the Michigan Economic Development Corporation which supports locally-driven development by strengthen the community's vision and putting predicable development processes in place.

Christopher Germain (the Village's RRC planner) and Ellen Glass (Clerk) reviewed the Village's custom action plan and answered any questions. Items the Village will need to complete include an updated master plan, zoning ordinance changes and an economic development strategy. At the meeting Christopher assisted the group in identifying priority redevelopment sites, a key step in achieving one of the best practices.

The Village will move forward to complete other RRC-related projects to ultimately reach certification in the coming years.
