- Curbside brush & yard waste pick-up. Large branches/brush piles should be placed curbside that morning for pick up. ALL YARD WASTE MUST BE IN BROWN PAPER LAWN & LEAF BAGS. Acceptable items are grass clippings, leaves, twigs, small branches and plant vegetation/waste.

### Sewer Bill Savings

During the month of April, you have the opportunity to save \$104.53. A 15% discount will be applied to your sewer bill if you pay for the entire year. If your monthly payment amount is \$58.07, the yearly discounted amount is \$592.31. This is for a

normal residential equivalent unit. If your monthly payment is higher, the same 15% will be applied. Payment must be made by April 30, 2018.

### Weekly Garbage Service

Each home is allowed one 95-gallon container and one recycle bin. Containers are to be stored on private property at all times except on the regularly scheduled day of pickup, which is Wednesday. All refuse must be placed at the curb by 6:00 a.m. on your collection day. Once the refuse has been picked up please move the container back to your designated cart storage area. In the event of a holiday the pickup will be delayed one day. If you have large items for pickup or if your garbage/recycling has been missed please contact Republic Waste at (888)872-7455.

# Reminders

### **Parking**

Parking in designated parking spots helps keep our streets clear during snow and ice events to allow the snow plow to clear the streets. Please be sure you are not parking on the roadway.

### **Snow and Ice Removal**

Per the Village snow ordinance, if there is a sidewalk on your lot or premises, you must clear the snow or ice from the sidewalk 24 hours after the cessation of any winter weather event. Sidewalks fronting on Main Street zoned B1 between Duane and Church Streets should be cleared of snow or ice by 10 a.m. and be maintained until 5 p.m.

### **Outstanding Debt**

Any outstanding debt to the Village including sewer, lawn mowing, and snow removal as of March 31, 2018 will be transferred to Summer taxes.

  - March is Sheltering, know how to respond safely when instructions are given to evacuate or take shelter.
