When do I text- to- 911?

Remember, it is always best to call if you can. Text-to-911 is to be used when you cannot make a voice call. Some examples may be: Hearing impaired, can't/unable to speak, domestic violence situation, or a witness to a crime in progress. Text-to-911 is not as fast as making a 911 call. If it is safe to call, please do so. But if it is not, Text-to-911 gives another opportunity for our community.



Master Plan Update

State Statue requires communities to update their Master Land Use Plan every five years. The Planning Commission is beginning the process of updating Vernon's Master Land Use Plan. Residents are encouraged to attend the Planning Commission meetings to provide input on what they would like to see included in the Master Plan.

Text-to-911 Facts:

- * Text-to-911 is the ability to send a text message to reach 911 from your mobile phone.
- * Text-to-911 is as simple as entering 911 in the "To" field of a text message.
- * Do not text and drive. Pull over to a safe area first.
- *Text-to-911 should only be used in situations where you are unable to call or it is unsafe to make a voice call.
- * Do not Text-to-911 to "test" your phone. Text-to-911 is for emergencies only.
- *Same as with 911 voice calls, be prepared to answer questions and keep messages short and simple.
- * Not all cell phone providers offer Text-to-911. Check with your mobile service provider to find out if you are eligible.

The Scoop...

Yard waste will be collected on an every other week basis from April until November each year on the regular trash collection day. All yard waste must be placed in biodegradable kraft paper bags or placed in 30 gallon cans, clearly marked as yard waste (Stickers are available in the Village Hall). Plastic bags will not be accepted. Branches and twigs smaller that 2" in diameter must be placed in bundles no larger than 2' x 4' long or 50 pounds per bag or bundle. No tree trunks, stumps, construction or demolition debris will be accepted.

IPMC 302.8 Motor vehicles.

Except as provided for in other regulations, no inoperative or unlicensed motor vehicle shall be parked, kept or stored on any premises, and no vehicle shall at any time be in a state of major disassembly, disrepair, or in process of being stripped or dismantled. Painting of vehicles is prohibited unless

conducted inside an approved spray booth.

Exception: A vehicle of any type is permitted to undergo major overhaul, including body work, provided that such work is performed inside a structure or

similarly enclosed area designed and approved for such purposes.
