ORDINANCE NO. 10

Ordinance Governing Miscellaneous Acts Prohibited Within the Village of Newberry

THE VILLAGE OF NEWBERRY ORDAINS:

Section 10:1 Unlawful Acts; Miscellaneous:

It shall be unlawful to do any of the following acts:

- a) To ride a bicycle on any sidewalk within the Village Limits, unless the location or age of rider could make it dangerous to ride in the street. This problem will be addressed on an individual basis.
- b) To allow horses, mules, cattle, sheep, swine or other beasts or geese or other domestic fowl, to run or be permitted to run at large within the said Village.
- c) To erect, construct, suspend or string any radio aerial or antenna across or over any street or alley within the said Village, or aerials or antenna shall not be connected or attached to poles used for distribution or electrical energy.
- d) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, co-partnership, association or corporation knowingly or wanting to operate or cause to be operated, any machine, device, apparatus or any kind whatsoever, reasonably preventable radio interference of radio reception within the Village of Newberry, provided however that x-ray pictures, examination or treatments may be made at any time if the apparatus or machines used are properly equipped to avoid all unnecessary or reasonably preventable radio reception and are not negligibly operated.
(Violation of above Ordinance deemed a public nuisance. Water and Light Board to have reasonable cause of violation right to discontinue distribution of electrical energy for such nuisance maintained.)
- e) It shall be unlawful for the owner of any female dog or for any person who harbors a female dog to go beyond the limits of the premises of such person while said female dog is in heat, unless such female dog is held in leash.

Section 10:2 Penalty:

Any person who shall violate any provision of the Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not in excess of \$100.00 and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment not in excess of 90 days or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.

Section 10:3 Publication and Effective Date:




