TREASURER'S REPORT:

MPD REPORT:

Dr. Lewis Neace reported –

- Attended the State MPD meeting on Monday. Washington State has the highest survival rate, from cardiac arrest, in the country.
- The state wants to raise trauma levels for hospitals. They would like to see a level one trauma hospital on this side of the state as well.
- The chair of the MPD Committee for the state has stepped down. He has been replaced by Dr. Jim Nania.
- Dr. Marvin Wayne has developed a pilot program for BLS providers to utilize nitrous. This may prove helpful in more rural areas. I am considering it but haven't made a final decision yet.
- Medic One is starting a trial of using whole blood in the field. They on-duty medic supervisor will deliver the whole blood to the scene. We may investigate using freeze dried plasma once it is approved by the FDA.
- We received approval from the state on all protocols. Although they did not approve the use of zip cuffs on patients, for restraint.
- There is a new unfunded mandate that requires all agencies to enter data into WEMISIS.

EMS DIRECTOR:

Heather Lee reported –

- She's identified needs for the training grant, including what would actually be needed to fully fund training versus the amount we receive from the training grant. For 2019-2020 we will continue with the OTEP portion of the training grant but will be requesting to utilize the remaining dollars for EMT course scholarships. We will bring this back up in August to determine how many scholarships and the amount of each.
- Heather put together a flyer to thank Baker Boyer Bank for their generous donation to support EMS in Walla Walla County.

REGIONAL:

Heather Lee reported –

- They are currently working on patient care protocols. They are trying to make them uniform throughout the state.

- Walla Walla Community College hosted this year's Fire Academy graduation. 24 students graduated, 10 of those were in the Fire Science program at WWCC.
- We have 12 EMT applicants for Fall quarter. She is going to start advertising to see if we can boost those numbers.
- We have 24 students for Fire Science. The advisory board has made a change to allow students with fire science background to start the program on even numbered years.
- We are continuing to look for scholarship opportunities for EMT students.
