





Concerning Formation and Funding of A Walla Walla Metropolitan Park District

The Walla Walla City Council adopted Walla Walla City Resolution 2025-076 (Sept. 24, 2025) concerning formation and funding of a metropolitan park district.

The proposition would create the Walla Walla Metropolitan Park District to provide ongoing funding to acquire, construct, control, improve, renovate, expand, operate, manage, maintain, and provide programming for parks, trails, and recreational facilities; set the district boundaries as the city's corporate limits; designate the Walla Walla City Council as park board with all powers set forth in chapter 35.61 RCW; and set the property tax levy rate at \$.75 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation.
