



Department of Community Health Team:

- Healthy Communities Division Manager – with Susann Bassham’s retirement in January, we have begun a search to fill the position. We have over 10 applications at this time and interviews will commence this month.
- Community Health Nurse – this position is still vacant; however, we have narrowed our search and hope to extend an offer by mid-March.

Business Office:

- We received a renewal of the Bikes on the Road Grant and Nancy Walters will start work on that this Spring.
- Funding renewals from:
  - Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Public Services – which we sub-contract with BMAC
  - Consolidated Homeless Grant (CHG) – which we sub-contract with BMAC and Joe’s Place
  - Health Care Authority – Mental Health Promotion and Suicide Prevention
    - Addition funds to our Prevention contract rolled over from FFY 17 (\$5000)
- Con Con Amendments:
  - Original Contract: \$782,824 (January 1,2018 to December 31, 2012)
  - Amendment 6: January 2019, +19, 535 = \$1,516,027

Foundational Public Health Services:

- Communicable Disease –
  - Measles: there are confirmed Measles cases in Clark and King County, we have sent out an alert to providers and a press release to the community on ‘what to do’.
  - Flu: The CDC predicts we will see March as the peak of flu season, thus we encourage everyone to get their vaccination and take preventative measures.
  - Shigella: We saw a small outbreak of Shigella at a daycare center in February. All cases have been treated and the daycare center is back up and running. Thanks to our great CD team! (Kara)

Veterans: At the February meeting we had a presentation from the US Forest Service Veterans Program. To better understand job opportunities for Veterans within the region. The USFS hires veterans for their fire program during the summer.

Other:

- Blue Zones: we received the proposal from Blue Zones that describes the model of program they recommend for the Walla Walla/College Place area and how much that will cost. Funders from Sherwood Trust, Providence Foundation, Providence St. Mary Medical Center, Walla Walla University, and others will convene Monday, March 4<sup>th</sup> at 1pm to discuss moving forward.

- We quickly reviewed last meeting highlights:

  - WHY – to lessen duplication, streamline, and be more efficient and effective.
- Focus today –
  - Do we want an oversight body for Behavioral Health – a body that oversees the system of care? If so, why:
    - DL – Yes
      - Like the COH model
    - TM – yes
      - Need something to coordinate the system, similar to COH, otherwise we are too siloed
    - JWB – Yes
    - NS – Yes
      - A body to align, inform about what one another are doing, and coordinate
      - We are missing the private sector, we know little about them (credentials, case load, who they are seeing)
      - Silos – need to have an overarching goal/vision that we work together towards; define what role everyone plays within the system
      - Shared vision – more efficient
    - CR – Yes
    - BB – Yes
      - Concern the overarching ‘council’ be the same people we attending committees now?
  - Do we need to go through a similar process as the Council on Housing? Yes
    - Start with Gathering Data – is there an overarching theme?
      - What is our baseline?
      - What do we know about our system?
      - What gaps in data do we have?
      - What will we need?
    - Summit/Community Engagement/Consumer Engagement –
      - Bring in a consultant to facilitate meeting/information gathering and work with the BH Planning Committee
      - Want to gather consumer input – listening sessions – could be targeted to where consumers are:
        - Clubhouse
        - C2C
        - Sleep Center/other homeless shelters
      - Stakeholder interviews – what is their perspective?
        - Providers
        - Schools
        - Medical community
        - Nursing homes
        - Policy makers
    - BH Planning Team – need to expand a bit – who else should be part of this group?
      - Need a timeline

#### Residential Update – Nancy:

- Working on accepting one referral – if all goes well. It is a local individual.
- The Union-Bulletin is doing a story on Nancy's 40-year anniversary with Valley Residential Services (WOW!!!). Not sure when it will be published.
- The bad weather has not been too challenging for VRS. Staff has been getting to work and have not had to cancel many client activities.
- DDA has a new billing system (effective January 1). It is a tiered-system and pays individual support cost based on tier and outcomes versus number of hours in a house. Nancy is optimistic that this system will be easier to track and puts the focus back on the clients. She and her counterparts in other Counties have been advocating this change for a long time. (yay!)

#### Community Health Advisory Board Update – Alisha:

- The monthly meeting has been changed to the second Thursday of each month from 3:30 pm. To 5:00 p.m. The new meeting location is at Son Bridge, 1200 SE 12<sup>th</sup> Street, College Place.
- There are some upcoming board openings if anyone is interested.

#### County Update - Cindy:

- We received five applications for the Accessible Communities Advocacy Committee (ACAC). We discussed the possibility of combining the ACAC with the DD Sub-committee to have enough members; with the ACAC being a quarterly meeting focus. The DD sub-committee was open to this. After discussing with Meghan DeBolt and hearing of other interested potential committee members, we will reach out and try to get the other four applicants needed to have a separate ACAC.
- The Governor's Committee on Disability Issues and Employment (GCDE) has selected Walla Walla as a site for their 2019 Community Outreach Project Committee. Connie Taylor-Randall, a local GCDE member, nominated Walla Walla for this Outreach Project.
  - GCDE members came to check out potential venues. While they were here on February 21 & 22, they attended a Transition Expo planning meeting, a VRS Cooking Class, met with Bobbie Sue Arias, Disability Support Services Coordinator at WWCC and visited several potential meeting sites to ensure accessibility.
  - The GCDE will come to Walla Walla in April or May (TBA) and host a Town Hall-style meeting to celebrate the achievements toward improving accessibility and the quality of life for individuals with disabilities. Also discussed will be barriers and concerns. The top three areas where improvement can be made will be noted. A Leadership breakfast will be held the following morning with key leaders in the community will be held. An action plan will be written up following the visit.

#### County Update – Amanda:

- The Family Support Team (FST) meeting in February was cancelled due to the bad weather and the ESD-123 being closed.
- The next scheduled FST meeting will be on Wednesday, March 13 from 2:30 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.
