RESOLUTION NO. 22 102

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW Chapter 29A.76.010, it is the responsibility of each county to periodically redistrict its governmental unit, based on population information from the most recent federal decennial census; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners historically conducted the redistricting processing during the months of January through April; and

WHEREAS, the Walla Walla County Auditor's Office received a notification on August 26, 2021 that the census data was available from the Washington State Redistricting Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Auditor's Office had vacancies in staff in its election department; and

WHEREAS, the County inadvertently missed the 2021 revision to RCW Chapter 29A.76.010 (S.S.B. 5013), which changed the deadline to complete the County Commissioner redistricting from eight months after receipt of the Census data to a new deadline of December 31, 2021;

WHEREAS, County Auditor Karen Martin provided an update and workshop to the Board of County Commissioners on the redistricting subject on March 14, 2022, which was held during open, public sessions of the Board; and

WHEREAS, during the March 14, 2022 open public meeting, the Board of County Commissioners asked community members in attendance to participate in a Redistricting Committee to bring forth up to four (4) redistricting proposals. The six members of the committee would include representatives of the Republican and Democratic parties, one independent, a County Commissioner, the County Auditor and the County Elections Supervisor; and

WHEREAS, an independent was at the meeting on March 14, 2022 and volunteered to participate. The Republican party and Democratic party submitted names of individuals to participate in the redistricting committee via email on March 15, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners finalized the list of members (Kari Isaacson, Wendi Kregger, Marjorie Sanborn, Todd Kimball, Karen Martin, and David Valiant) of the redistricting committee, during the open public meeting of March 21, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the redistricting committee met on March 24, 2022, and March 29, 2022, and prepared three (3) proposed draft plans, developed in accordance with RCW 29A.76.010, for the Board of County Commissioners and public to review; and

WHEREAS, April 5, 2022, the Board of County Commissioners held an open house and workshop to review the three proposed draft plans and received public comment on those proposed draft plans; and

WHEREAS, the three proposals were posted on the County website; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners accepted written comments on the proposed draft plans until 5 p.m. April 6; and

WHEREAS, April 11, 2022, the Board of County Commissioners reviewed the three proposed draft plans during an open public meeting, with one comment received during the public comment portion of the meeting; and

WHEREAS, On April 11, 2022, Commissioner Tompkins discussed information he received from the County Elections department regarding protected classes. The following is the data provided during the meeting:

- The Current Population of Hispanic or Latino voters in District 1 is 23.66%, District 2 is 18.57% and District 3 25.65%.
- Under Proposal A, the population of Hispanic or Latino voters in District 1 would be 23.79%, District 2 would be 18.39% and District 3 would be 25.92%.
- Under Proposal B, the population of Hispanic or Latino voters in District 1 would be 20.45%, District 2 would be 26.57% and District 3 would be 21.08%.
- Under Proposal C, the population of Hispanic or Latino voters in District 1 would be 27.09%, District 2 would be 20.25% and District 3 would be 20.76%

WHEREAS, Proposal B is the closest to the an even split of population and the most condensed out of all the options. The target population for equal distribution for each district is 20,861. The following is the population breakdown of the existing districts and proposed districts:

- The current Population voters in District 1 is 20,748, District 2 is 20,244 and District 3 is 21,592
- Under Proposal A, the population of voters in District 1 would be 20,932, District 2 would be 20,850 and District 3 would be 20,802.
- Under Proposal B, the population of voters in District 1 would be 20,850, District 2 would be 20,866 and District 3 would be 20,868.
- Under Proposal C, the population of voters in District 1 would be 20,834, District 2 would be 20,832 and District 3 would be 20,918.

WHEREAS, after discussion, the Board of County Commissioners by motion approved to move forward with approving a resolution to set the date of public hearing for April 25, 2022 to receive public input on the proposed draft plan B; and

WHEREAS, on April 25, 2022, the Board of County Commissioners held a properly advertised public hearing to receive public input on the proposed redistricting plan; and

WHEREAS, the Board concludes, after reviewing the options and receiving public input, redistricting as identified in Proposal B is preferred; based on the following findings:

1. Proposal B has the closest division of population numbers, with only a difference of 18 citizens between District 1 (the smallest) and District 3 (the largest). This meets the requirements of RCW 29A.76.010(4)(a), which states that districts "shall be as nearly equal in population as possible."

2. Proposal B divides the County into areas that are geographically as compact as possible, under RCW 29A.76.010(4)(b). Because most of the County's population is in the Walla Walla and College Place area, there is not any way to divide the County into equal land portions. Any effort to make one District compact will result in the other two Districts being extremely spread out, with unusual boundaries, detrimentally impacting their compactness. However, Proposal B keeps District 1 compact, with a contiguous area that does not detrimentally impact the other two district's compactness.

3. Proposal B allows for the districts to be a “geographically contiguous area,” under RCW 29A.76.010(4)(c). Rather than having one district in the middle of a portion of the City of Walla Walla, such as occurs in Proposal C, the Districts’ boundaries are shaped evenly. Proposal B also eliminates a portion of District 1 that extended to the northwest in Proposal A. Walla Walla County Commissioners represent a variety of interests which are urban and rural. Proposal B allows for Commissioner Candidates to reside in urban or rural settings.

4. Proposal B does not, and is not intended to, favor or disfavor any racial group or political party, in compliance with RCW 29A.76.010(4)(d). Each of the proposals had similar numbers with regard to the portion of Hispanic or Latino voters in each District. Proposal C’s District 1 would be 27.09 percent Hispanic or Latino, while Proposal B’s District 2 would be 26.57 percent Hispanic or Latino.

5. Proposal B is in alignment with unincorporated islands and school district boundaries, thus meeting the requirements of RCW 29A.76.0.104(e), which states: “To the extent feasible and if not inconsistent with the basic enabling legislation for the municipal corporation, county, or district, the district boundaries shall coincide with existing recognized natural boundaries and shall, to the extent possible, preserve existing communities of related and mutual interest.” Given that more than a third of the population of the County lives in the City of Walla Walla, it is not feasible to fully contain the entire city in a District. As noted earlier, County Commissioners represent both urban and rural interests, which in Walla Walla County are related and not exclusive to one another. For example, the County Commissioners serve as the County Board of Health, oversee the County Corrections Department, and provide other services to both urban and rural residents. County Commissioners have historically been elected from both urban and rural areas of the County to serve in these districts. Commissioners also address issues such as land use, which can pit urban interests against other interests. The current alignment ensures that Commissioners take a “whole county” approach to resolving issues, and that Commissioners are attentive to both rural and urban needs.

WHEREAS, all proposals considered, the preferred Proposal B, includes the following:

- Moving Birch Precinct from Commissioner District 2 to Commissioner District 1. – no legal revision
- Moving Clark Precinct from Commissioner District 2 to Commissioner District 1. – no legal revision

- Dividing Jefferson Precinct between Commissioner Districts 1 & 3, northern area merging to Henderson Precinct, southern area remaining Jefferson Precinct. – legal descriptions attached
- Moving Pine Precinct from Commissioner District 1 to Commissioner District 2. – no legal revision
- Moving Sharpstein Precinct from Commissioner District 2 to Commissioner District 1. – no legal revision
- Moving Wainwright Precinct from Commissioner District 3 to Commissioner District 1. – no legal revision
- Moving Berney Precinct from Commissioner District 1 to Commissioner District 2. – no legal revision
- Moving area of Braden Precinct to Derry Precinct in Commissioner District 3. – legal description attached
- Moving Derry Precinct from Commissioner District 1 to Commissioner District 3. – legal description attached

- Moving Eureka 5 Precinct from Commissioner District 3 to Commissioner District 2, renaming to Eureka Precinct. – legal description attached
- Moving Garrison Precinct from Commissioner District 2 to Commissioner District 3. Merging area in Walla Walla School District to Gose Precinct in Commissioner District 2. – legal descriptions attached
- Merging Frenchtown 4 Precinct and Frenchtown 5 Precinct, renaming to Frenchtown Precinct. – legal description attached
- Merging Touchet 4 Precinct and Touchet 5 Precinct, renaming to Touchet Precinct. – legal description attached
- Merging Eureka 4 Precinct to Touchet Precinct, striking Eureka 4 as a precinct. – no legal description needed
- Moving small areas from Marcus Precinct to Baumeister and Cottonwood Precincts. – legal descriptions attached

Now therefore,

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by this Board of Walla Walla County Commissioners that the Walla Walla County Commissioner Districts are hereby redistricted as outlined above in Proposal B and attached hereto, which is by this reference made a part hereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certain technical changes, as prepared by Walla Walla County Geographic Information Systems staff to update and correct legal descriptions of county precincts and attached, shall also be approved.
