The Port was awarded a \$400,000 grant to be used to assist in the construction of two (2) of the public infrastructure projects.

- 1. Reimbursement Request #1 \$200,000 grant allocated to the construction of the Railex Road extension to Raindance Road/US12. (Completed September 1, 2013)
- 2. Reimbursement Request #2 \$200,000 grant allocated to the construction of water system improvements to the Port's Dodd Road Industrial Park water system to accommodate the Railex expansions and future economic development opportunities at the Port's Dodd Road Industrial Park and Wallula Gap Business Park. (Anticipated completion June 1, 2014)

SECTION II. IDENTIFICATION OF PUBLIC FACILITY PROJECT AND COSTS

1. Describe the entire public facilities project, including the parts that you are not asking to fund. (The term "public facilities" means bridges, roads, domestic and industrial water facilities, sanitary sewer facilities, earth stabilization, storm sewer facilities, railroads, electrical facilities, natural gas facilities, research, testing, training, and incubation facilities in innovation partnership zones designated under RCW 43.330.270, buildings, structures, telecommunications infrastructure, transportation infrastructure, or commercial infrastructure, and port facilities in the state of Washington.

The public facility project includes the rehabilitation of the HVAC system in the Health Human Services and Planning Building. The current HVAC system is not capable of providing consistent heating or cooling of the building: the hydronic lines leak, the control system had been partially inactivated, and the heat pumps often require resetting due to inadequate fluid flow and heat transfer.

The proposed public facility project will replace the control system for the HVAC system, rehabilitate the hydronic system including: install new higher capacity pumps for hydronic fluid circulation, replace valves and piping to ensure proper fluid flow, re-duct some of the ventilation ducting to improve efficiency, and replace connections to help eliminate the leaks associated with hydronic system connections to the heat pumps. Additional County maintenance funds are being used to replace older heat pumps as they fail.

The Walla Walla Board of County Commissioners purchased and renovated the Health, Human Services and Planning Building at 1520 Kelly Place in the City of Walla Walla to serve as a Community Service Center. The building was purchased and renovated using funds from the County Investment Fund (\$2,000,000), a Department of Commerce Community Development Block Grant (\$1,000,000), and reserve funds for the Walla Walla County Department of Human Services (\$2,000,000). The Community Service Center houses Blue Mountain Action Council, Helpline, Blue Mountain Heart to Heart, Rising Sun Clubhouse, Central Washington Comprehensive Mental Health, and the County Department of Human Services. The renovation included establishing office space (interior walls, etc.) for the five tenants, new toilet facilities, communication infrastructure, and additional HVAC capability (additional heat pumps and a higher capacity cooling tower) because of the division of office space.

2. <u>Summarize efforts taken to date regarding the project in terms of specific steps and studies and dates of action.</u>

Upon completion of the renovation a HVAC survey was done by Total Energy Management on September 2012 which demonstrated that the air flow of the system was not adequate to provide adequate heating or cooling

The Department of Human Services has replaced several failed heat pumps, initiated repairs to place the leaking hydronic system since the occupation of the building in August 2012.

On May 20, 2013 McKinstry performed an in depth analysis of the building HVAC needs are recommended a three-phase program to totally upgrade the HVAC system.

The public facility project includes the rehabilitation of the HVAC system in the Health Human Services and Planning Building. The current HVAC system is not capable of providing consistent heating or cooling of the building: the hydronic lines leak, the control system had been partially inactivated, and the heat pumps often require resetting due to inadequate fluid flow and heat transfer.

The proposed public facility project will replace the control system for the HVAC system, rehabilitate the hydronic system including: install new higher capacity pumps for hydronic fluid circulation, replace valves and piping to ensure proper fluid flow, re-duct some of the ventilation ducting to improve efficiency, and replace connections to help eliminate the leaks associated with hydronic system connections to the heat pumps. Additional County maintenance funds are being used to replace older heat pumps as they fail.

The Walla Walla Board of County Commissioners purchased and renovated the Health, Human Services and Planning Building at 1520 Kelly Place in the City of Walla Walla to serve as a Community Service Center. The building was purchased and renovated using funds from the County Investment Fund (\$2,000,000), a Department of Commerce Community Development Block Grant (\$1,000,000), and reserve funds for the Walla Walla County Department of Human Services (\$2,000,000). The Community Service Center houses Blue Mountain Action Council, Helpline, Blue Mountain Heart to Heart, Rising Sun Clubhouse, Central Washington Comprehensive Mental Health, and the County Department of Human Services. The renovation included establishing office space (interior walls, etc.) for the five tenants, new toilet facilities, communication infrastructure, and additional HVAC capability (additional heat pumps and a higher capacity cooling tower) because of the division of office space.

Upon completion of the renovation a HVAC survey was done by Total Energy Management on September 2012 which demonstrated that the air flow of the system was not adequate to provide adequate heating or cooling

The Department of Human Services has replaced several failed heat pumps, initiated repairs to place the leaking hydronic system since the occupation of the building in August 2012.

On May 20, 2013 McKinstry performed an in depth analysis of the building HVAC needs are recommended a three-phase program to totally upgrade the HVAC system.
