**Topic** – Renewing Sophos Anti-Virus software license – Seeking approval to execute the agreement for financing.

#### **Summary**

Three years ago we entered into an agreement with Trebron to finance the Sophos Anti-Virus software. The intent was to lessen the impact on a single year budget by making yearly payments. Sophos does not finance. Sophos uses Trebron Co. Inc. to finance.

The total cost is the same whether we finance or not.

Paying the lump sum \$25,190 this year may have an effect on how fast we approach any overall budget increase limits the Board of Commissioners may impose.

Agreement was reviewed by Jesse Nolte.

#### Cost

3 years ago we contracted for \$8,252 per year. This offering is \$8,396.67 or estimated \$145 more per year.

#### **Funding**

Tech Services current budget will pay for this year's cost (\$8,396.67) and will use the same budget figures for the following 2 years.

#### **Alternatives Considered**

We have looked at other anti-virus solutions. Sophos, for the money, is good and has done a good job for us and requires less of our time to manage.

## WSU Extension Office – Walla Walla County June 2014 Update

#### **WSU Extension Updates**

<u>4-H Coordinator Position</u> - Melanie Owens started May 1 and has been working many 4-H events.

<u>Food \$ense Coordinator Supervisor Position</u> – We have completed interviews and hope to make an offer soon.

<u>Extension Assistant Position</u> – Mary Eagon will retire early September. I would like permission to hire in August in order to have some cross training and to not be trying to hire during fair. I would stay within my current budget.

#### **Events**

Youth -

4-H Demonstrations: 4-h youth gave presentations in April and May at the Extension Office. These are a part of fair but are held in April/May because of the large participation.

Summer Youth Programs: Quilt Camp (Walla Walla & Dayton), Challenger Horse Camp, and Dog Obedience have been provided for area youth.

Fair: Moving quickly towards fair with Fashion Review, Food & Clothing Judging, Dog Agility, Cat Show, Colt Training and other events prior to fair.

Teen Leadership: Walla Walla County 4-H teens participated in the WSU Teen Conference in Pullman. Teen Rally is coming up later in the summer.

### Family/Community -

Our preliminary figure for the Food \$ense money coming from USDA for 2014-2015 will be about \$157,047 and will include Asotin, Columbia, Benton and Franklin Counties. Walla Walla County Extension Food \$ense program been serving our community utilizing County match, Federal dollars, and in-kind match since the start up in 2004. We have reached more than 26,000 youth and their families. The WSU Food \$ense program goal is to impact family nutritional habits at home through nutrition education to kids in the classroom. Franklin County efforts have reached more than 5400 youth.

#### Agriculture Programs

Wayne Thompson is currently working with NRCS on soil quality project and has six cover crop trials (3 in Walla Walla, 1 Asotin, 1 Columbia, 1 Franklin).

Wayne Thompson is helping with the local Cereal Grain Tours on June 25 which included a free meal at the airport. The event started with a Legume Tour at Dwelley Jones' farm (peas, lentils, and chickpeas) and continued on Lower Waitsburg Road showcasing new wheat varieties.

#### Master Gardeners/Master Food Preservers

Master Gardeners have started Office Clinics and Farmers Market Saturdays. Master Gardeners put more than 500 volunteer hours in each year. This year has been especially busy with cool rainy and hot weather issues.

#### 2015 County Budget

Memoranda of Agreement for 2014 (Discussion or Resolution as the Board wishes)

The annual agreement with WSU needs to be agreed upon to put the Professional Services part of the County budget. WSU provides all services including specialists from around the state plus the local staff. MOA for 2015 at \$76,137 to \$78,911 (total \$2,774) so that I can include these figures in my 2015 budget. The figures have increased \$2,774 total from 2014 (WSU has been holding off on the increase for a few years). Changes are County Director \$21,630 to \$22,877, Extension Educator \$18,507 to \$20,034, and 4-H Coordinator \$36,000 to \$36,000 (no change). WSU covers annual benefits and the remaining salary for these positions.

#### 2014 County Budget

On track with 2014 Budget for this year, always looks like we haven't spent 50% by June 30 because we spend more money from fair time through November.

#### **Hort Board – Apple Maggot**

Apple Maggot situation. The second grant was acquired from the Apple Maggot Working Group through WSDA in the amount of \$3,000 needed to be extended until December 31, 2014. They are contracting with homeowners in the "apple maggot hit" areas and will reimburse \$150/tree removed in most cases.
