IN THE MATTER OF A LEASE ADDENDUM BETWEEN WALLA WALLA COUNTY AND THE LILLIE RICE CENTER

RESOLUTION NO.

WHEREAS, in 1972 Walla Walla County was deeded property, recorded at Volume 348 pages 537-548, commonly known as 2616 Isaacs, Walla Walla, Washington by the United States Government, and as a condition of that deed, the County was to utilize the premises for certain educational purposes for disabled individuals for a period of thirty years; and

WHEREAS, in 1976, the County entered into a lease agreement with Lillie Rice Center for the premises, with the condition that the property be utilized for vocational and educational services for disabled, with the term of said lease to be "permanent and infinite;" and

WHEREAS, the County Prosecuting Attorney's Office has reviewed the previous lease, and found that the "permanent and infinite" lease condition did not comply with state law, RCW 36.34.180; and

WHEREAS, the Lillie Rice Center has requested that Walla Walla County approve construction of a 70 foot x 50 foot x 16 foot steel building for its purposes in educating and employing individuals with developmental disabilities; and

WHEREAS, RCW 36.34.180 provides that property used for "for manufacturing or industrial purposes or sites, or for military purposes, or for temporary or emergency housing, or for any requirement incidental to manufacturing, commercial, agricultural, housing, military, or governmental purposes, the board of county commissioners may lease it for such purposes for any period not to exceed thirty-five years;" and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that the Lillie Rice property has been used both for manufacturing and commercial purposes, as well as important vocational and educational needs of the community; now therefore

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by this Board of County Commissioners of Walla Walla County, Washington that an addendum to the 1976 lease between Walla Walla County and the Lillie Rice Center shall be entered into this date between Walla Walla County and the Lillie Rice Center, Inc., and that the chair of the Board shall sign said addendum in the name of the Board.

WHEREAS, Walla Walla County Resolution 08 153 provided for the salary of the prosecuting attorney to be set pursuant to Substitute Senate Bill (SSB) 6297 (Chapter 309, Laws of 2008), as adopted by the Washington State Legislature in 2008, amending RCW 36.17.020 and changing the amount of the State's contribution to the elected prosecuting attorney salaries and establishing that contribution to be equal to fifty percent of the salary set for a superior court judge; and

WHEREAS, under SSB 6297 (Chapter 309, Laws of 2008) the State of Washington increased the amount of the State's contribution to the salary of the elected county prosecuting attorney to one-half the annual amount of a Superior Court Judge's salary, and requires the County to continue to contribute to the salary of the elected prosecuting attorney at least the amount contributed in 2008; and

WHEREAS, the Walla Walla County Board of County Commissioners sets the salary of the Walla Walla County Prosecuting Attorney by resolution and establishes the amount the county shall contribute to the prosecuting attorney's salary; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 2.08.092 the salary set for superior court judges is established by the Washington Citizens' Commission on Salaries for Elected Officials, and is being increased by said Commission for the period September 1, 2015 through August 31, 2016 from \$156,363 to \$162,618, making the State's share of the prosecuting attorney's salary \$81,309; and

WHEREAS, Walla Walla County Resolution 14 109 established the county's share of the prosecuting attorney's salary to be set at \$53,694 for 2015; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by this Board of County Commissioners that, effective September 1, 2015 and through August 31, 2016, the Prosecuting Attorney's salary shall be \$135,003.

Intent – Approve proceeding with RFQ for nuisance abatement work at 2344 Old Milton Highway

Topic – Code Compliance, abatement of overgrown vegetation

Summary

Property at 2344 Old Milton Highwayhas been involved in an owner dispute that involves the Department of Justice (DOJ) and the IRS for at least 3 years. In 2014, Curtis Likes, Code Enforcement (CE) Officer, requested the County use its abatement funds to abate several violations related to CE Case #C14-0189 including overgrown vegetation, securing the structure and removing junk, litter and debris. The County abatement fund was used and the property was cleaned up. Case was closed on October 14, 2014. On July 20, 2015 we received another complaint about the overgrown vegetation; CE Case #C15-0069. According to an email from Jessie Nolte, a Mr. Zamora, who is the record owner of the property, gave written permission to go on to that property last year and perform abatement. Also, according to an email I received from Russell Edelstein, the DOJ "does not oppose any further remedial steps." I photographed the property on August 6, 2015. The only current issue is the overgrown vegetation on the property. The structures are still secure and need no further attention.
