- Submit complaints that directly apply to any subcontractor of Community Development Block Grant funds to that agency in writing. The subcontractor will use best efforts to resolve said complaints in accordance with their agency grievance procedure. A record of the complaints and action taken will be forwarded to the Walla Walla County Department of Community Health.
- 2. If said complaint cannot be resolved to your satisfaction at the agency level, it will be submitted to the Director of the Department of Community Health, P.O. Box 1753, Walla Walla WA 99362, Phone: (509) 524-2650, TDD: (800) 833-6384 or 7-1-1, for resolution. A record of the complaints and action taken will be maintained. A decision by the designated official will be rendered within 15 working days.
- 3. If the complaint cannot be resolved to your satisfaction by the designated official, it will be sent to and heard by the Walla Walla Board of County Commissioners and discussed at an open, public meeting of the elected body. A written decision will be made within 30 working days. The decision of the governing body is final.
- 4. A record of action taken on each complaint will be maintained as part of the records or minutes at each level of the grievance process.
