Regarding: Investment Grade Audit Proposal | Walla Walla County Jail

Walla Walla County has been working with McKinstry for the past ten years on making improvements to the energy performance and infrastructure of its buildings and facilities through performance-based energy savings contracts. In 2005 McKinstry completed the first comprehensive audit of all the County facilities with a primary focus on the County Courthouse and County Jail building. Included in our original audit findings and the Energy Services Proposal were key upgrades that were identified for the Jail. Since 2005 some of these proposed upgrades were addressed however others have become high priority based on the age and condition of certain systems and equipment.

To date McKinstry has completed the following energy efficiency upgrades at the Jail; replaced the obsolete T-12 lighting with energy efficient T-8 lighting and installed a new energy efficient hot water boiler as part of the last Commerce Grant project. The County also has installed a new Direct Digital Control (DDC) system to replace the failing pneumatic control system. On November 13, 2015 McKinstry completed our most recent assessment and review of current conditions at the County Jail and identified opportunities to reduce energy consumption, operational costs, replace equipment that is near the end of its useful life, and provide a new solar domestic hot water system as a more efficient and sustainable solution.

The intent of this Investment Grade Audit is to align with the County's short and long range Capital Facilities Improvement plan as was discussed originally with the County in 2005. McKinstry will develop a phased project approach for systematically completing upgrades to the Jail; focus will be on addressing the ventilation system (Air Handling Units) by providing more efficient equipment through a performance based design.

After completion of this Investment Grade Audit and presenting the County with the Energy Services Proposal (ESP); it will be at the County's discretion regarding the timing for moving forward with the first phase of work. This IGA provides the budgeting and planning to assist the County with systematically upgrading the three primary air handling units (AHUs) on a scheduled basis.

This proposal provides the guidelines under which McKinstry will complete the following tasks:

Conduct an Investment Grade Audit (IGA) at the targeted facilities:
 County Jail / 300 West Alder (Built 1983)



2. [Upon Walla Walla County's Approval] In the event the County decides to pursue grant funding McKinstry will support Walla Walla County with developing and submitting a grant application to the Department of Commerce Energy Efficiency and Solar Grants Round 1 in March 2016 and Round 2 (if necessary).

3. Develop a comprehensive Energy Services Proposal (ESP) for selected initiatives, including a project phasing plan to allow the County to budget, plan and implement projects;

✓ Phase 1 [2016] Replace the County prioritized AH-3 and provide a new solar domestic how water system; includes eliminating the old and leaking domestic water storage tank. This project will be developed to guaranteed costs and savings and will be qualified for submission for grant funding under the current Dept. of Commerce grant program.

Phase 2 [2017] Replace AH-2 and ensure that the energy recovery portion of the system is functional and that the system is recommissioned; developed to ROM level.

- ✓ Phase 3 [2018] Replace AH-1, make necessary control modifications and recommission, developed to ROM level.
- ✓ Existing equipment capacities shall be assumed adequate and direct replacements will be pursued.
- 4. Develop a proposal for ongoing Measurement and Verification (M&V).

The target facilities to be studied are as follows:

County Jail – 28,680 SF

FOCUS AND OUTCOME OF STUDY | McKinstry proposes under this Investment Grade Audit to focus on developing potential energy conservation and facility improvement measures that will save the County energy and operational cost as well as replace inefficient HVAC at the County Jail. Primary attention will be given to:

- Upgrading the three primary Air Handling Units (AHUs) serving the County Jail, all of which have reached their useful life
- Provide a new Solar Domestic Hot Water system as a renewable energy solution that will lower energy and operational costs

McKinstry is prepared to conduct this Investment Grade Audit over the next 60 days in anticipation of developing a Guaranteed Maximum Construction Cost by late February, in time for the Department of Commerce Round 1 grant deadline (March 3, 2016 at 5:00 p.m.); but recognizes the County may elect not to pursue grants in either Round 1 or Round 2. McKinstry will assist the County in securing any grants and rebates which may be available, including Department of Commerce grants and Pacific Power & Light and Cascade Natural Gas utility incentives. McKinstry will evaluate potential strategies for leveraging available capital and/or financing (if applicable) for the project.

Scope of work |McKinstry will complete the following actions leading to implementation of performance-based initiatives:

Investment Grade Audit (IGA): The study will identify and analyze performance-based contracting measures along with their associated savings, costs, and potential for utility rebates and/or grants.

- The preliminary list of opportunities to be investigated can be found in Section 4.1 "Preliminary Phase 1 FIM list Attachment A".
- Provide a rough order of magnitude and pre-final review with the owner to determine improvement measures contained in the final project proposal.
- Develop GMAX (Guaranteed Maximum Construction Costs) project budget and guaranteed energy savings.
- Deliver an Energy Services Proposal for implementation of selected initiatives with associated energy cost savings, project costs, and payback information. The deliverables associated with the energy service proposal can be found in Attachment B "Investment Grade Audit Deliverables".



The breakdown of hours by trade for the Investment Grade Audit can be found in Attachment C – "Investment Grade Audit Matrix".

REQUESTED INFORMATION | For effective execution of this proposal, we request Walla Walla County to provide access to the following:

- Historical utility bills for the last 36 months;
- As-built mechanical, electrical, architectural, and structural plans;
- Operational records related to the cost of maintaining specific equipment, as well as copies of existing service agreements;
- Access to individuals that have relevant information pertaining to the day-to-day operation of energy using systems at this site.
- Capital budgets
- Previous energy studies or facility master plans

TIMELINE AND MILESTONES | McKinstry will initiate this scope of work immediately upon the execution of an agreement with the County. Formal progress review meetings will be conducted regularly throughout the study phase. During these review meetings, McKinstry will recommend measures based on preliminary analysis, while Walla Walla County will provide final direction regarding recommended measures. The goal of these review meetings is to focus engineering efforts, budgeting, and savings assessment on those measures that possess a high probability for implementation. During this time, McKinstry will provide a detailed measurement and verification plan for the energy savings.

McKinstry will target completion of the initial Investment Grade Audit by March 3rd [Note: If Walla Walla County is not pursuing a grant in the Dept. of Commerce Round 1, this schedule will be extended to May] Key milestones are listed below:

COST EFFECTIVENESS CRITERIA | It is Walla Walla County's intent to have McKinstry implement approved projects that meet the following criteria:

- Aggregate simple payback for measures with strategic importance or infrastructure renewal shall be equal to or less than the useful life of the equipment/system. Payback calculations shall utilize project costs less any applicable utility incentives or grants. Overall annual savings utilized in the payback calculations will only include guaranteed utility cost avoidance and hard-cost operational savings approved by the County.
- The County may infuse capital from planned capital project budgets or cash reserves to assist with implementation of Facility Improvement Measures. The County may utilize financing as an alternative funding mechanism at its discretion.
- McKinstry will work with the following entities to assist with securing energy efficiency grant funding or low interest loans for applicable initiatives:
 - Department of Commerce Energy Efficiency and Solar Grants
 - Pacific Power & Lighting (PP&L) and Cascade Natural Gas
 - State Local Program, QECBs, and other municipal financing programs

FEE BILLING | All fees assessed under this Investment Grade Audit Proposal will be rolled into the final project



cost. McKinstry is focused on Walla Walla County directed projects at the County Jail and will recommend projects that meet the above criteria and align with the long range capital facilities plan for the Jail. Walla Walla County shall reimburse McKinstry for its time and expenses, not to exceed \$17,945 (\$14,761 of the total cost of the IGA is being covered through Epact In-Kind services). All associated information, including deliverables, will become the property of Walla Walla County upon final receipt of payment.

Attachment B

The final Energy Services Proposal (ESP) will include all required information as outlined under the State Energy Services Agreement. At least the following elements will be included:

- A description of the facility and a description of those buildings and systems which shall receive McKinstry Equipment and McKinstry Services;
- 2. The cost effective Facility Improvement Measures (FIMs) to be installed or caused to be installed by McKinstry and a description of the FIMs analyzed but disqualified under the cost effectiveness criteria;
- 3. A description of the services that McKinstry will perform or cause to be performed on or in the facility, including but not limited to engineering, construction management, the operations and maintenance procedures for use on McKinstry Equipment, training for facility personnel, warranty service provided, and equipment maintenance provided;
- 4. The Maximum Allowable Project Cost, itemized in detail, which may be amended to represent actual costs;
- 5. Recommendations for replacement of existing equipment, along with recommendations for improvements to existing equipment and operating conditions;
- 6. The standards of comfort and service appropriate for the facility;
- 7. The baseline energy consumption for the facility, including the data, methodology and variables used to compute the baseline, and the baseline calendar period which shall not be less than twelve (24) months;
- 8. The estimated energy savings and energy cost savings that are expected to result from the installation of McKinstry Equipment and from McKinstry Service, and an explanation of the method used to make the estimate;
- 9. The method by which Energy Savings and Energy Cost Savings will be calculated during the term of the Energy Services Agreement;
- 10. A description of how McKinstry will finance its acquisition of McKinstry equipment and when title to McKinstry Equipment will pass to the Owner;
- 11. A description of how the Energy Cost Savings will be guaranteed by McKinstry;
- 12. A description of how McKinstry proposes to be compensated;
- 13. The term of the Energy Services Agreement;
- 14. The Termination Value for each year during the term of the Energy Services Agreement;
- 15. The schedule for project completion;
- 16. The nature and extent of the work and equipment that McKinstry anticipates it will receive from other firms under subcontract.
