**Topic** – Award – Website Design Project

#### **Summary**

Walla Walla County is in need of a redesign for the official website. On April 27, 2017 Technology Services released an RFP for a website design and hosting. The RFP closed on May 19, 2017 with 8 design proposals, 7 of which were responsive.

We held demonstrations of the seven website designers including various content management editors. The committee members evaluating the products were from Commissioners' Office, Human Resources, Emergency Management, Community Health/Environmental Health and Technology Services.

The evaluation committee not only viewed all the demos but had the opportunity to work in vendor supplied test accounts called "sand boxes" to get a feel for the products.

A second round of demonstrations was held to answer questions and narrow the field.

The evaluation committee recommended contracting with vendor Revize LLC, and with the assistance of Jesse Nolte, deputy Prosecuting Attorney, we have negotiated what we deem a fair agreement between Walla Walla County and Revize LLC, 1890 Crooks Rd. Suite 340, Troy, MI, 48084

Intent – Inform the Board of County Commissioners of the intent to create a Bilingual Incentive Program for the Department of Community Health

Topic - Bilingual Incentive Program

#### Summary

Currently the Department of Community Health (DCH) has four staff on payroll who are bilingual. It is our intent to create a formal Bilingual Incentive Program to provide translation and interpretation services to community members utilizing DCH services.

The program will mirror the Bilingual Incentive Program of the Courthouse Union Local 1191-WC (Courthouse), outlined in Article XVI of the Courthouse Policies Handbook in the following areas:

- DCH will administer the program and bilingual employees will be approved to participate in the program based upon the Director's determination of need for translation and/or interpretation services, requiring approval from the Board of County Commissioners.
- Employees approved under the program will receive additional days of paid time off annually on January 1<sup>st</sup>. Approved employees will schedule and use paid time off in the calendar year in which it is received, like the floating holiday benefit. Time off shall only be taken in a minimum of one-day increments.

The program will differ from the Courthouse program in the following way:

- DCH will employ one Certified Medical Interpreter who, upon credentialing and approval, will receive three (3) additional days of paid time off annually. Medical interpretation requires in-depth training and an extensive knowledge of medical terminology, in both English and Spanish, deserving compensation beyond that of translation.
- Approved DCH employees who are approved to provide non-medical interpretation and translation will receive two (2) additional days of paid time off annually.

Intent – Ask BOCC for approval to fulfil a contract with Children's Home Society of Washington for nursing services, to be provided by a new half-time Community Health Nurse under the Department of Community Health

Topic – Nursing Contract

#### **Summary**

Children's Home Society (CHS) of Washington provides Early Head Start and Head Start Programs to low income families throughout WA State. Through their work, they contract for nursing services to ensure the healthcare needs are being met for the families and young children they serve.

In the past, for Walla Walla, this contract was performed by Walla Walla General Hospital. However, with the General's closure in July, this has left the nurse without an organization to work under. CHS approached the Department of Community Health (DCH) in July to see if the scope of work for the nurse would complement nursing services we provide, which they do complement one another.

DCH is aligned well to take on such a contract and service, especially with the upcoming reorganization and onboarding of a Clinical Services Program Manager, who will oversee nursing staff.

#### Cost

#### **Recommended Motion**

I move approval of the consent agenda.

#### **Request**

Approval of the final plat map for the Amavi Cellars Final Plat Alterations (application SUB17-008).

#### **Background**

The proposal would amend the Amavi Cellars Subdivision (PLT 2012-08409) to establish an additional public utility easement, easements for sewer lines, drainfields, and replacement drainfields, and amend the boundaries of Parcel 1 and Parcel 3 without changing the lot areas.

The Final Plat of the Amavi Cellars Subdivison, which contains three lots was recorded in 2012. This was a cluster subdivision with two cluster lots and one resource parcel created under *Walla Walla County Code (WWCC) Chapter 17.31 - Cluster Developments on Resource Lands*.

Parcels 1 and 2 are about 2 acres each. The boundary of Parcel 2 would not be affected by the plat alteration. The boundaries between Parcels 1 and 3 would be modified on the west and south side of Parcel 1 but the lot areas would remain the same. No additional lots would be created. Parcels 1 and 2 contain winery buildings for Flying Trout and Amavi Cellars.

Typically, this type of boundary adjustment would be processed administratively, via a boundary line adjustment (BLA) application. However, the changes that impact easements and the septic systems cannot be approved via a BLA. The process to review alterations to a final plat is very similar to the process to review preliminary and final plat applications. See WWCC 16.36.060.



Approval by the Board can be via the motion recommended above, as the subdivision ordinance does not require approval of a resolution.



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

An Open Record Public Hearing before Leland B. Kerr, Pro Tem Hearing Examiner for Walla Walla County, Washington, was held on the 14<sup>th</sup> day August, 2017, on the application of Norm McKibben for an amendment to the Amavi Cellars Subdivision (PLT 2012-08409) to establish additional public utility easements, easements for sewer line, drainfields, and replacement of drainfields, and to amend the boundaries of Parcel 1 and Parcel 3 of such subdivision.

The public hearing was opened at approximately 9:30 a.m., and all witnesses intending to testify at the public hearing were placed under oath. The Hearing Examiner explained the application of the Appearance of Fairness Doctrine, conflict of interest, and the procedural requirements for a quasi-judicial hearing. An opportunity was provided, and no objections were made to the Hearing Examiner hearing this matter, nor were there any objections to the procedural compliance of notice and conduct of the hearing.

The application was introduced by Lauren Prentice, Principal Planner of the Walla Walla Community Development Department. This application was to amend the final plat of Amavi Cellars Subdivision, a cluster subdivision with two cluster lots and one resource parcel, which would modify the boundaries between Parcel 1 and Parcel 3 without a change in lot areas to, in part, accommodate additional easements and relocation of the drainfields.

- 5 Final Plat of Amavi Cellars Subdivision (AFN 2012-08409) recorded September 25, 2012.
- 6. Notice of Application and Public Hearing and publishing, posting and mailing affidavit.
- 7. Email from LeRoy Waggoner, County Surveyor, dated August 8, 2017.

- 8. Email from Kevin Tureman, County Environmental Health Manager, dated August 8, 2017.
- 9. Letter from Paul Gonseth, WSDOT, dated August 8, 2017.

Greg E. Flowers of PBS Engineering and Environmental, Inc., the Project Manager, spoke in favor of the application. No one else spoke in favor of the application, nor did anyone speak in opposition to the application.

Following receipt of the testimony and Exhibits, the record was determined complete and the public hearing was closed.

Upon consideration of the testimony and the Exhibits admitted in the open record hearing, the Hearing Examiner makes the following:

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Final Plat Alteration Application was received from Norm McKibben as an owner on behalf of Sequel LLC, and Raymond E. Goff Trust, Parcel 1A, LLC, to amend the 2012 Amavi Cellars Subdivision to establish additional public utility easements, easements for sewer lines, drainfields, and replacement of drainfields, and amend the boundaries of Parcel 1 and Parcel 3 without changing the lot areas. This subdivision consists of approximately 37 acres subdivided as a cluster development and located on the west side of Peppers Bridge Road, between Old Milton Highway and J.B. George Road, generally known as 3684 Peppers Bridge Road, located in Walla Walla, County. Wineries are located on Parcel 1 and Parcel 2 with the third under construction on Parcel 3.
- 2. A Notice of Application and Public Hearing was published in the Walla Walla Union Bulletin on July 31, 2017, and in the Tri-City Herald on August 1, 2017. The notices were also mailed to property owners within 500 feet of the site on August 2, 2017, and posted on site on Peppers Bridge Road on July 31, 2017. The notice was, likewise, appropriately published on the Walla Walla County Community Development Department website on August 3, 2017. The Walla Walla County Community Development Department Director as the SEPA Responsible Official, upon review, determined that the proposed plat alteration was consistent with the overall project character as approved for the original plat and resulting in the Determination of Non-Significance issued on February 24, 2012.
- 3. The Amavi Cellars Subdivision was approved by Findings, Conclusions and Decision with the Walla Walla County Hearing Examiner on April 6, 2012. No significant change, either in the conditions or the changes proposed by this amendment, constitute a significant change in circumstances, and such Findings, Conclusions and Decision are incorporated herein by this reference.

- 4. The modifications to this subdivision, as proposed by this amendment, creates a new 10-foot public utility easement adjacent to Rollings Hills Lane (private roadway), with additional sewer line easements and the relocation of the drainfield and a southerly extension of the boundary of Parcel 1 to accommodate a drainfield with corresponding reduction of Parcel 3; with easterly change in its west boundary line resulting in further modification to Parcel 3, which borders Parcel 1. There is no change within the lot areas of Parcel 1 and Parcel 3, and Parcel 2 is unaffected by the modification.
- 5. The proposed amendment, if developed as proposed in the Application and the representations made at the hearing, are consistent with and comply with the approval criteria established by WWCC 16.36.060 based on evidence that:
  - A. The plat amendment is consistent with the approval criteria required by WWCC 16.36.050 and the application meets the original approval criteria in that:
    - (1) The amended plat would comply with all other original applicable codes, including WWCC 17.31 regarding cluster development standards.
    - (2) The plat confirms with all conditions of the preliminary approval as evidenced by the finalization and recording of the 2012 final plat.
    - (3) There are adequate provisions for roads, alleys, drainage facilities, potable water supplies, sanitary wastes, transit stops, parks and recreation, playgrounds, schools and school grounds, sidewalks and safe walking conditions for students who only walk to and from school as applicable, and other general purposes as may be required to protect the public health, safety and general welfare in that the proposed alteration: (i) makes no changes to transportation access; (ii) creates no additional lots; (iii) makes no changes in utilities other than the relocation of the drainfield and utility enhancement by the additional easements which have been approved by the County Environmental Health Department.
  - B. The plat meets all standards established by State law and Title WWCC 16 based on the Walla Walla County Community Development Department staff review and the County Surveyor's approval of the proposed survey map incorporating the changes.
  - C. The plat will bear the certificates and statement of the approval as required by State law which will be a condition upon verification prior to recording.
  - D. A title report current within thirty (30) days will be furnished by the applicant confirming that the title to the property to be subdivided is vested in the names of the owners whose signatures appear upon the plat certificate prior to recording.

E. No improvements are needed for the proposed alteration and, therefore, there are no required approvals or the posting of bond to insure compliance; nor is there a need for maintenance, operation or defect guarantees as provided in WWCC 16.97.

From the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Hearing Examiner makes the following:

#### **CONCLUSION**

- 1. The Hearing Examiner has jurisdiction to determine the final plat amendment.
- 2. The applicant has demonstrated compliance with the final plat alteration criteria of WWCC 16.36.060.
- 3. The proposed amendment will only slightly modify the existing final plat improving the effective and beneficial use of the premises, thereby, serving the public use and interests.

#### **DECISION**

**THEREFORE**, the application for the proposed plat amendment is approved subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Future development of these properties shall comply with the August 8, 2017, letter from the Washington State Department of Transportation.
- 2. One (1) Mylar copy shall be provided to the County for signature.
- 3. The applicant shall comply with the recording procedures set forth in WWCC 16.36.055 and WWCC 16.36.070.

#### **Voluntary Stewardship Program – VSP:**

- The document has been submitted to the State Conservation Commission for their review. Local Conservation District Manager, Renee Hadley, will be presenting the plan in-person in Olympia on Sept. 29<sup>th</sup>.
- Contracts for the next biennium's allocation of funding for the County have been signed. \$220,000 is available, so I'm splitting that amount over two years' budgets on both the revenue and expenditure sides. That money will be used for implementation of the plan, plus any further work/edits needed as a result of the State's review.

#### 2017 Amendment Cycle:

#### • CPA17-001/REZ17-001 -Cavalli

Site-specific application by Roberta Cavalli to change the *land use designation* from Agriculture Residential to Rural Residential 5, and *rezone* an 18.27-acre parcel at the intersection of Wallula Avenue and McKinney Road from AR-10 to RR-5 (10-acre minimum lot size to five-acre min. lot size).

#### • ZCA17-002 - Brent Knowles

Application by Brent Knowles to amend WWCC Chapter 17.31, Development Standards – Cluster Developments on Resource Lands. The amendments would increase the allowed average lot size for residential lots in a cluster subdivision; increase the maximum allowed lot size of cluster lots; allow the creation of 20-acre lots in the AR-10 zone; and revise the code as it pertains to density transfers.

#### • CPA17-002/REZ17-002 - JR Simplot Company

Site-specific applications to add a 160-acre property (Parcel A) to the Attalia Industrial UGA, change the land use and zoning designations from PA/PA-40 to Industrial/IA-M, and remove the Unique Lands designation. This property is located north of the existing UGA boundary and Dodd Road. Secondly, the applications would remove a 160-acre property (Parcel B) on Dodd Road from the Attalia UGA and change the land use and zoning from Industrial/IA-M to PA/PA-40. (APN 310822110002, 310826410004)

**Update:** Second workshop with the Planning Commission on these amendments was held on Sept.  $6^{th}$ . Next, a public hearing on all three amendments will likely be held at the Planning Commissions' next regular meeting on October  $4^{th}$  at 7:00 p.m. A Public Informational Meeting will be held just prior to the hearing, starting at 6:00 p.m.

#### **2018 County Comprehensive Plan Update:**

RFQ/P has been issued to secure professional land use planning services from qualified firms. Deadline for responses is Sept. 18<sup>th</sup>, 4:00 p.m. I've received a number of inquiries, so I expect we will have a good response. I'll set up a review committee and interview process.

The State has just notified us that the 20-year population forecasts that we are to use in our comprehensive plan update will not be available, now, until December. We had expected them about last April.

#### Revenue & Permit Stats, 2017:

**Update:** I will provide the third quarter stats to you for my October update (after Sept. 30<sup>th</sup>).

#### Blue Mountain Region Trails – Ridges, Towns, and Rivers Plan:

**Update:** I've been working with the County Public Works Director, Randy Glaeser, and his consultant, Joy Bader, to identify which type of enhancement (bike route, sidewalk/multi-use path, striped lanes, etc.) should be assigned to routes identified as possible bike and/or pedestrian facilities. Met with the BMRT Steering Committee last Tuesday to discuss.

#### Personnel:

- Happy to announce that Mr. Don Sims has joined our team as our new Associate
  Planner. Don comes to us from Great Falls, Montana, where he worked for Cascade
  County Planning Department for four years. He has been assigned the review of his
  first (here) short plat application.
- Continuing to advertise for a Building Inspector, entry-level position. Completing the budget amendment for 2017 (fall). May change direction and try to work with the State's Department of Labor & Industries to develop a trainee position for us. Completing that job description at this time.
- Continuing to work with HR Dept. Director Shelly Peters on providing the results of the county-wide salary study to my department staff, fielding questions, and informing staff of any changes to their salaries and/or steps.

#### Other items:

- Completed the RFQ/P process and interviews for Hearing Examiner, prepared a request for approval of agreement for top candidate.
- Have been receiving numerous inquiries about zoning by real estate agents and prospective purchasers ("What can I do with my property if I buy it?")

Intent – Ask BOCC to vote to become a 'mid-adopter' to move our region forward toward Fully Integrated Managed Care.

Topic - Fully Integrated Managed Care

#### Summary

The Health Care Authority (HCA), through the vision for a healthier Washington, continues working to improve access and care for Washingtonians. A key effort is integrated purchasing of physical and behavioral health services for Apple Health (Medicaid) clients. In 2014, the Legislature mandated that this integrated purchasing model take full effect by January of 2020.

Building on this past legislation, active legislation (HB 1388) is pending, which includes negotiated language with the counties that provides regions a choice for a more active role with regards to this important work. Moving forward on this now is critical to provide county authorities enough time to make a decision about whether or not to: (1) form an inter-local leadership team to decide on the terms of integrating care ahead of the 2020 mandate, which we call becoming a mid-adopter; and (2) make the necessary county and regional commitment to become a mid-adopter by this September so there is enough time in advance of 2019 start date.

The implementation pathway for full integration requires regions to opt for a date by which they will achieve full integration. At this time, there are two dates (2019 or 2020) to choose for full implementation. This communication outlines key pieces of information to consider:

- 1. Timeline for implementation and local decisions needed for mid-adopter: a. 2019: Choosing this year will place a region in the category of mid adopter. With this option, there are two approaches that a region can choose:
  - i. Integrated managed care plans assume all funding and functions for Medicaid covered behavioral health services by January of 2019; or
  - ii. Integrated managed care plans assume all funding for Medicaid covered behavioral health services by January 2019, with certain functions subcontracted for one year to the regional Behavioral Health Organization (BHO)/counties as agreed to by the county interlocal leadership structure specified in the pending legislation.
- b. 2020: Integrated managed care plans assume all funding and functions for Medicaid covered behavioral health services by January of 2020.

Moving forward with Fully Integrated Managed Care before 2020 will allow Greater Columbia region to have an input in the RFP questions sent out to Managed Care Organizations (MCOs). In addition, the incentive dollars will help transition providers to contracting with MCOs, rather than the BHO. This transition is critical to ensure no lapse in service provision to our community members.

#### **Conclusion/Recommendation**

Vote to become a mid-adopter with 2019 as a transition year, as outlined in 1.ii above.
