ENGINEERING:

- Seven Mile Bridge: WSDOT installed temporary bridge. County crews will complete approach ramps and open to public by 30 October.
- Drumheller Bridge: Working on bridge design.
- Wallula Ave./Gose Street: Working on project geometric design.
- Blue Creek Bridge/Mill Creek FH: Contractor is working on final items including planting trees and guardrail.
- Mill Creek Road MP 1.1 to MP 3.96: Working on right of way acquisition.
- Middle Waitsburg Road MP 6.1 to MP 7.92: Working on right of way acquisition.
- Flood Damage Repair: Contractor is working on Kooskooskie Bridge scour protection.

MAINTENANCE/FLEET MANAGEMENT:

- South crews are finalizing Zimmerman's drainage project up Blue Creek Rd.
- Mud Creek Road project is complete.
- Prepping equipment for winter operations.

ADMINISTRATION:

- Working with staff to complete their Wellness Health Assessment to assist with meeting the County's 40% participation requirement from the Washington Counties Insurance Fund (WCIF).
 - More than 50% of Public Works eligible employees already completed the Assessment.
- Working with Commissioner Kimball to incorporate the fleet from Fairgrounds into ER&R.
- Attended a Webex Open Enrollment Insurance Meeting.
- Attended a Mill Creek Coalition meeting to discuss potential funding for the upcoming design and construction phases of the Mill Creek GI Study.
- Continue to follow our Phase 2 COVID-19 Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) to help us maintain a safe work environment as we navigate these uncertain times.

Building Permits

Approximately 45 building permit applications are currently open: this includes those actively under review as well as those on hold pending re-submittals by the applicant, and those under second review. this is a significant increase.

Miscellaneous Updates and Meetings

- Met with representatives of WSDOT regarding US 12 Touchet River Bridge to discuss the interpretation/application of the County's floodplain standards to the project.
- October 7 Planning Commission met via Cisco Webex to discuss draft amendments to sign code (Regular Meeting – Workshop).
- October 14 Planning Commission met via Cisco Webex to discuss Burbank Residential Density project (Special Meeting – Workshop). Approximately 5 members of the public attended this meeting.
- Senior Planner Jennifer Ballard is participating in virtual Washington/Oregon Planning Conference October 14-16.
- We are working with Technology Services and our software vendor this month to conduct update of TRAKiT system to newer version. Lauri Withers, our System Administrator, is leading testing and coordinating the project for the Department.
- The Technical Review Committee (TRC) recently met with applicants for the following projects:
 - a. PRE20-054 Hummingbird Bridge Replacement
 - b. 2860 Williams Road Proposal by Jane DiDario and Gene Conley to construct a barn, install utilities within Yellowhawk Creek, and conduct associated site work.
 - c. 1311 Magnolia Drive Met with property owner regarding landscaping business. We received multiple complaints about a landscaping business and met with owner on site to discuss options for compliance with home occupation standards.
