To the extent permitted by law, Franklin County shall protect, hold harmless, and indemnify Walla Walla County, WESCOM, the City of Walla Walla and their officers and employees from any and all claims, suits, costs, damages of any nature, or causes of action including the cost of defense and attorney fees, by reason of the acts or omissions, whether negligent, willful, or reckless, of its own officers, employees, agency or any other person arising out of or in connection with any acts or activities authorized by this agreement, and will pay all judgments, if any, rendered. This obligation shall not include such claims, costs, damages, or other expenses which may be caused by the sole negligence of Walla Walla County, WESCOM, the City of Walla Walla or their authorized agents or employees.

These items will be available for possession by no later than April 30, 2023. In the event Franklin County does not remove items by May 31, 2023, they will be stored at a County or WESCOM Facility for no longer than 120 days.

Intent – Gain BOCC Approval to Recruit for Replacement for MSAG/GIS Tech

Topic – Succession Planning

Summary – The MSAG (Master Street Address Guide)/GIS Tech position is singularly one of the most important positions in the County. This position was created almost 20 years ago and is 100% responsible for all E911 addresses in the County and all cities in the County as well. Because there has only been one MSAG/GIS Tech in the history of this position there is 20 years of “Institutional Knowledge” that needs to be passed on to the new employee. This position interfaces with all Fire Departments, Community Development, the Assessor’s Office, Public Works, City of Walla Walla GIS and E911.

This position provides all addresses for every citizen within Walla Walla County and then provides those addresses as a GIS Map layer to E911 so that when someone calls E911 they get the appropriate help to the appropriate location.

Cost

- \$40,000 for both positions in 2023 (estimated two months).
 - \$20,000 in legacy costs and \$20,000 for overlap time (estimated)
 - Increase of \$40,000

Intent – Opioid Settlement

Topic – New fund, lead for opioid funds, and Regional Opioid Abatement Council

Summary

In November of 2018, Walla Walla County brought suit against numerous opioid manufacturers, distributors and retailers. Litigation has been ongoing since that date, with very complicated settlements being proposed and entered into by the State of Washington and other litigating jurisdictions, including Walla Walla County. In August 2022, a settlement with AmerisourceBergen Corp., Cardinal Health, Inc. and McKesson Corporation (distributors) was reached and signed by the Walla Walla County Commissioners. As a result of that settlement, which will be paid out over 16 years, Walla Walla County has received funds for Opioid Settlement Abatement.

As a condition of these settlements and through the One Washington Memorandum of Understanding with the State of Washington and other counties and cities, expenditures of funds are reported to and overseen by a regional opioid abatement council (OAC). The region that Walla Walla County is a part of encompasses the same area as the Greater Columbia Behavioral Health, LLC (GCBH), which is an entity formed by an inter-local agreement between Asotin, Benton, Columbia, Franklin, Garfield, Kittitas, Walla Walla, Whitman, and Yakima Counties to provide. The GCBH has proposed acting as the OAC, which will require agreement by the participating counties and cities.

The One Washington Memorandum of Understanding (Clause C (4) (g)) requires that County take the following actions in order to use the funds:

- i. Develop a methodology for obtaining proposals for use of Opioid Funds.
- ii. Ensuring there is opportunity for community-based input on priorities for Opioid Fund programs and services.
- iii. Receiving and reviewing proposals for use of Opioid Funds for Approved Purposes.
- iv. Approving or denying proposals for use of Opioid Funds for Approved Purposes.

- v. Receiving funds from the settlement for approved proposals and distributing the Opioid funds to the recipient.
- vi. Reporting to the OAC and making publicly available all decisions on Opioid Fund allocation applications, distributions and expenditures.

On December 20, 2022 the County received the first two years of payments under the distributor settlement, totaling \$88,818.04.

The County will be entering into another settlement agreement in the coming weeks, which will result in additional funds that will be subject to the One Washington MOU.

Currently there are two items that the Board of County Commissioners need to provide direction on.

1. Approval to prepare a resolution for a new fund as these funds need to be deposited and expended from a new fund for auditing purposes. At this point, the County is simply creating a new fund for the funds to be retained in and to ensure they are utilized in accordance with the settlement agreement and One Washington MOU.
2. Approval of Commissioner Mayberry being appointed to the Regional Opioid Abatement Council through the Greater Columbia Behavioral Health ASO (GCBH) for which she is already represents Walla Walla County.

Additionally, the Board should begin planning to determine how to utilize the funds as required by the One Washington Memorandum (items i-vi above). This is not a decision that needs to be made now, but it is a topic that will need to be placed on the Board's agenda.

This RFP will combine Coordinated Housing Funds (2163) and Consolidated Homeless Grant (CHG) funds to ensure a more efficient and well-rounded process.
