The 2009-10 Fiscal Year has been a time of challenge and excitement. In December 2009, the Board of Supervisors requested all county departments to reduce the current budget by ten percent. While the cuts were difficult, the Conservation Board found a way to trim and save. Department Staff has worked hard to paint instead of replace and stretch our limited resources farther than ever before. Recent budget cuts have encouraged us to re-organize staff and evaluate the programs and events that the County can offer.

In addition to the cuts, the State of Iowa has experienced record-breaking snow and rainfalls. The long, snowy winter and persistent rains have taken there toll on area parks,

equipment, and wildlife.

In the midst of our challenges, we find ourselves in exciting times as we continue to develop our Webster County Water Trails Network. We are also making great strides in trail development that will soon connect Fort Dodge to Harlan Rogers and Kennedy Park. Also, the first phase of the Veteran's Memorial Park has been completed by the Noon Sertoma Club

The lowa Association of County Conservation Boards is planning for the future by conducting a long-range plan and establishing a committee to make recommendations to the Board of Directors.

The board and staff would like to thank the partners that have supported County Conservation in Webster County over the past year and we look forward to an exciting and prosperous 2010-11!






