








Mission Statement

- Awarded \$940,228 COVID Trail Grant for the Fort Dodge To Badger Trail Connection.
- River's Edge Discovery Center officially named and plans completed.
- Supervisors award \$1,196,915 contract to PCI to construct the Badger Lake Loop Trail.
