

Sign up for a class or join us for an organized float to experience Webster County like never before...Have Fun...Stay Safe...& Help US keep YOUR water trails CLEAN!!


KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

Safety tips, paddler behavior, and more!

- ALWAYS wear a properly fitted life jacket while on the water
- Paddle with a group, not by yourself. Leave a "float plan" for your trip with a friend or relative
- Know where the dams are!
- Obey local rules and regulations. Use only public lands and access points.
- Be considerate to others while on the water. Give anglers a wide berth.
- LEAVE NO TRACE—carry in, carry out your trash. Always leave it cleaner than you found!

Webster County has <u>60 miles</u> of designated water trails on the Des Moines River and Lizard Creek.

Lending a Hand...the Conservation Corps of Iowa

The Gypsum City OHV Park has a few extra hands during the first week of June thanks to a five-member crew with the Conservation Corps of Iowa (CCI). The park's 60-miles of trails require constant trimming and grooming to create a safe and enjoyable riding experience for visitors.

CCI is a non-profit group that provides hands-on environmental stewardship and service-learning opportunities for young adults while accomplishing conservation and natural resource work. The program's goals are to help young people from diverse backgrounds become more connected to the environment, engaged in conservation, involved in the community and prepared for future employment.

Conservation Corps programs devote 20 percent of program time to technical-skills training, career-building skills such as resume writing and interviewing, and educational activities focused on environmental science and technology. Using scientific inquiry and experiential learning, the Conservation Corps helps young people learn more about the world around them and think critically about the impact of their personal choices on the environment.
