# $The\ Lodge$ at Camp WaNoKi

The Lodge is available for rent on a reservation basis for graduation parties, family reunions, weddings, and seasonal parties. Reservations can be made in advance up to 2 years before the date of use. The lodge is equipped with a refrigerator, sink and microwave. It has air conditioning, heat, bathrooms and chairs and tables for 100 guests.

### Find Your Escape at Camp WaNoKi

Last fall the Conservation Staff finished construction on a camping cabin at the newly acquired Camp WaNoKi. The cabin is named the "Riverview" cabin for its picturesque view of the Des Moines River Valley.

The cabin is roughly 14'x24' and sleeps up to 6 people. Solar panels charge batteries to provide "green" electricity for your stay. The electricity can last a long time depending on sunlight availability and what type of devices get plugged in. We recommend only plugging in low power draw devices.

The cabin is heated by a wood stove (firewood is



provided) and has no running water. There is an outhouse located close to the cabin along with a fire ring and two outdoor chairs.

In the near future the Conservation Department has plans to build a second cabin nearby. If your looking to "get away" for a weekend this is a great opportunity to get back to nature and recharge your batteries.

### Hike-In Campsites

For the adventurous spirit looking for that primitive getaway, Camp WaNoKi has two back-country campsites.

The Oak Hill campsite located near the north end of the park is set in a majestic white oak setting. To access this site there is a 1/8 mile hike through the woodlands from the front parking lot.

The Hickory Hill campsite is located near the south end of the park. This site is located near breath-taking views overlooking the Des Moines River. From the front parking lot hik-

ers must hike  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile to this campsite. Both sites provide an open shelter and fire pit with grill and can be rented on-line at <a href="https://www.mycountyparks.com">www.mycountyparks.com</a>.


