What's New... By Matt Cosgrove

As summer heats up and paddlers head to the water to cool off they will notice new safety signage at key access points along Webster County's Water Trails.

The project was spearheaded by Jon Schreck with the Fort Dodge Fire Department. Jon approached the Conservation and Fort Dodge Parks & Recreation Departments following recent rescue efforts and a drowning on the Des Moines River.

The new signage compliments the standard water trail signage that is required by the Iowa Department of Natural Resources for waterways that are designated by the state as official water trails. The designation means that there is a local sponsor or sponsors that have created and maintained access areas, parking, signage and maps.

The new signage highlights the importance of safety on our water trails. It focuses on the "know before you go" aspects of paddling. Understanding the water levels, distance from put-in to take-out, skills necessary for the area you plan to paddle, appropriate equipment and the stewardship of our waters are all key factors in having a fun and safe day on the water.

Exciting New Renovation Happening At Kennedy Park!

The butterfly garden at Kennedy Park is about to be renovated! Established in 1990, by Bonnie Miller, the garden was planted with a variety of flowers and shrubs to attract butterflies and pollinators. Since 1990 the garden has consisted of several mixed garden areas and four planters built with butterfly boxes. After 29 years of countless weddings and family pictures and honoring the original purpose of the area, it's time for an update.

The renovation will continue to focus on the butterfly/pollinator theme and will include a registered butterfly waystation. The plan is to remove the over grown shrubs, dying crabapple trees, and deteriorating butterfly garden boxes to be replaced with approximately a 5,000 square foot pollinator garden and include a patio with pergola



or gazebo with a seating area. The garden will be registered as a butterfly waystation and an interpretive sign will be posted detailing the important roles pollinators play in the natural environment. We hope this renovation will enhance the park visitor experience and provide valuable habitat for our pollinator friends!

Kennedy Park Playscape Addition

A new and exciting addition is planned for this summer at Kennedy Park's Natural Playscape! Thanks to a generous donation from the employees at Citizens Community Credit Union the Webster County Conservation Department is able to purchase a 12' diameter Native American Tipi.

A Tipi is a cone-shaped, wood-framed structure that was traditionally covered with buffalo hide. Once fabric became more available canvas was used because of its lighter weight and availability.

Like our modern tents, tipis were designed to set-up and break-down quickly. The simple design allowed tribes to move from place to place during different seasons or following the movements of buffalo.

In the summer, tipi covers can be raised at the bottom to allow cool air to flow through and keep the inside cool. In the winter, additional coverings can be added on the inside with grass insulation to keep the tipi warm. Fires were often placed in the center of the tipi where the hole in the top would release the smoke.

We hope you enjoy this new addition to the playscape that will inspire young minds with a connection to the past!

These playdates are free but we would like participants to register to make sure we have enough supplies. The playscape playdates are scheduled for July 18th at 12 pm and August 15th 10:30 am for participants 5 and younger and siblings.

Conservation Corps Camp

Again this year we will be offering a Conservation Corps Camp for middle school age children at Camp WaNoKi located east of Coalville. The dates for the camp are **July 16, 17, and 18 from 9 am - 3 pm.** This camp is for kids just finishing 5th, 6th, 7th, and 8th grades.



The paddleboards can be rented for use at Kennedy Park for **\$15 for 2 hours.** Each rental includes the paddleboard, paddle, ankle strap, and PFD. Rentals are available Memorial Day through Labor Day each year between the hours of 10 am and 4 pm Monday through Friday at the Webster County Conservation Office.

Renters must have taken a stand up paddleboarding class or Kayaking 101 class. They may also take the FREE online certification lesson by going to <u>boaterexam.com/</u>paddling and providing proof of completion. Those who want hands on instruction can do so by signing up for SUP Classes offered July 16th and August 13th at 5:30 pm. Please call 515-576-4258 to register as there are only enough boards for 4 participants in each class.
