Invest in Iowa...Why Webster County Conservation Supports Governor

Reynolds' Plan for a Better Iowa

It has been nearly a decade since 63% of Iowa voters approved a constitutional amendment that created the Natural Resources and Outdoor Recreation Trust Fund. To-date not a single penny has been deposited in the fund, resulting in over \$1 billion dollars that has **NOT** been spent improving Iowa's water, protecting our soils, building trails, improving wildlife habitat and repairing our state parks.

On January 14, 2020, Governor Kim Reynolds introduced the INVEST IN IOWA ACT – inviting legislators, supporters and ALL Iowans to join her by investing in the future of Iowa. The funding mechanism for this initiative would be to raise the state sales tax by a full penny – and therefore, officially funding the Natural Resources and Outdoor Recreation Trust Fund. In addition to finally funding the Trust Fund the proposal also funds Iowa's crumbling mental health system and provides significant tax reform.



Maple Syrup Magic

March 26 6 - 8 pm Camp WaNoKi Webster County Conservation invites you to make **Maple Syrup Magic!** This free event will be held Thursday, March 26, 2020 from 6 – 8 pm at Camp WaNoKi. Camp WaNoKi is located at 2401 WaNoKi Camp Rd, Fort Dodge.

From the earliest of times, Native Americans and pioneers have made maple syrup from the sap of sugar maple trees. Learn how it's made, find some maple trees on site, and taste some real maple sap and syrup. There is no comparison of fresh maple syrup to that which you buy at your local grocery store. Real maple syrup is generally thinner and less sweet. It's completely different than most mass-produced syrups that contain large volumes of high-fructose corn syrup, food coloring and artificial flavors. It is truly a labor of love as it takes 40 gallons of sap to produce a single gallon of syrup.

Enjoy this beautiful time of year and all the woodlands has to offer with a hike in the early spring!


John F. Kennedy Memorial Park—Woodland Restoration

If you have walked the trail around Badger Lake during the last month or so you have probably noticed significant removal of the understory in the woodland areas of the park. This is not the work of a pack of out of control beavers, but the on-going woodland restoration efforts of Adam Moeding, Park Maintenance Technician. Moeding is a 2016 graduate of Iowa State University with a major in Forestry.

The woodland restoration plan is part of a larger effort to improve woodland, wetland and prairie habitats throughout the park. A park master plan was completed in 2011 that helped identify key restoration areas in the park. The woodland restoration, also known as timber stand improvement (TSI) is designed to remove undesirable, invasive species that out-compete our native, desirable vegetation. The primary efforts at Kennedy Park involve the removal of honeysuckle, buckthorn, and autumn olive. These aggressive shrubs are shade-tolerant and can survive and thrive in the forest understories. The result is a loss of lowa's native vegetation and reduced species diversity in our woodlands. lowa's oak trees are especially shade intolerant which require large disturbed openings to allow sunlight to the forest floor for successful oak regeneration.

The work is completed by mechanical means with the department's forestry mower and by good old-fashioned hand labor, cutting, piling and treating stumps. Follow-up treatments also include mowing, chemical application and prescribed burning to control re-growth. Staff identifies desirable trees and marks them with a ribbon so their competing neighbors are removed.

So as you make your way around Badger Lake you may catch a glimpse of Mother Nature's helpers in action. If you would like more information or want to help with our volunteer stewardship program please contact the park office.

ORVILLE O'CONNELL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP


Purpose: In memory of Orville O'Connell and his commitment to wildlife conservation and land stewardship, a scholarship will be awarded annually to a Webster County resident who is pursuing a degree in: Conservation, Natural Resource Management, Wildlife Biology, Animal/Fisheries Ecology or related natural resource field.

Amount: (1) scholarship will be awarded in the amount of \$500.00 annually. Scholarships will be paid directly to the school of the recipient's choice.

Basis of Award: Consideration for the scholarship will be based on a point system. 45-points for need, 30-points for leadership, and 25-for scholastic achievement.

Selection: All applications must be typed and sent to the Friends of Webster County Conservation, c/o Scholarship Committee, 1415 Nelson Avenue, Fort Dodge, IA 50501. Contact the Conservation Office for an application .

Applications must be postmarked no later than March 30, 2020.
