Excellence In Action

Tiny House Project Receives Award

The Webster County Conservation Board Tiny House Project is the recipient of the 2021 Iowa State Association of Counties "Excellence in Action" Award. The project includes placement of three tiny houses at the Gypsum City OHV Park Campground.

The Conservation Board partnered with Iowa Central Community College and the Fort Dodge Correctional Facility to construct the houses through the federal Second Chance Pell Grant Program. The program is used to offer college-level carpentry classes and other trades to inmates at the Fort Dodge Correctional Facility.

The tiny house project was described as a "win-win-win" for the county, community college, correctional facility and inmates. Besides the principle participants, the taxpayers of Webster County and the visitors from across the state and beyond are also winners as this innovative project has created a new revenue stream that can be used for re-investment in the park and provides a cost-effective lodging option for those enjoying lowa's largest Off-Highway Vehicle Park.

Gypsum City receives grant to improve accessibility

The Webster County Conservation Board and Webster County Improvement Corporation recently received a \$20,000 grant to improve access to the restroom and shelter at the Gypsum City Off-Highway Vehicle Park. The grant was part of the annual State ATV Grant Program. The program is funded by the state OHV registration program and invests the rider's dollars back into the state's seven OHV Parks.

The grant allowed the department to pave an existing rock trail that connects the parking area to the restroom and shelter. Concrete unloading areas and an accessible campsite were also added to the park to improve accessibility for people with mobility issues.



WCCB & Iowa Central Offer Corporate Retreats



WCCB and Iowa Central Community College recently teamed up to offer corporate retreats for area businesses. The group held their first retreat in July with Cascades Moulded Pulp from Clarion. The retreats are designed to connect the region's businesses with recreational and team-building opportunities.

Despite the drought conditions, the group spent part of their day kayaking on the Des Moines River Water Trail. WCCB Staff provided a guided trip on the river, demonstrated water testing and explained our role in the watershed and the importance of clean water.

ICCC Staff provided a catered lunch and offered a variety of team-building activities.

- Gowrie Trail Plan


Trail planning and facility designs are currently underway for the projects. Each project will be highlighted in future newsletters as more detailed plans become available.



TRAIL WORK AT KENNEDY PARK

Construction has begun to remove the existing east trail bridge, near the silt pond at the park entrance. It may take several weeks to get the site prepared and the new bridge installed. The trail around the lake will be closed in this area. The new bridge is scheduled to be installed September 13th—17th.

In addition to the bridge replacement, the county is paving a 10-foot, loop trail around Badger Lake. Depending on the contractor's schedule, the grading could begin this fall and project completion scheduled for next spring/summer.
